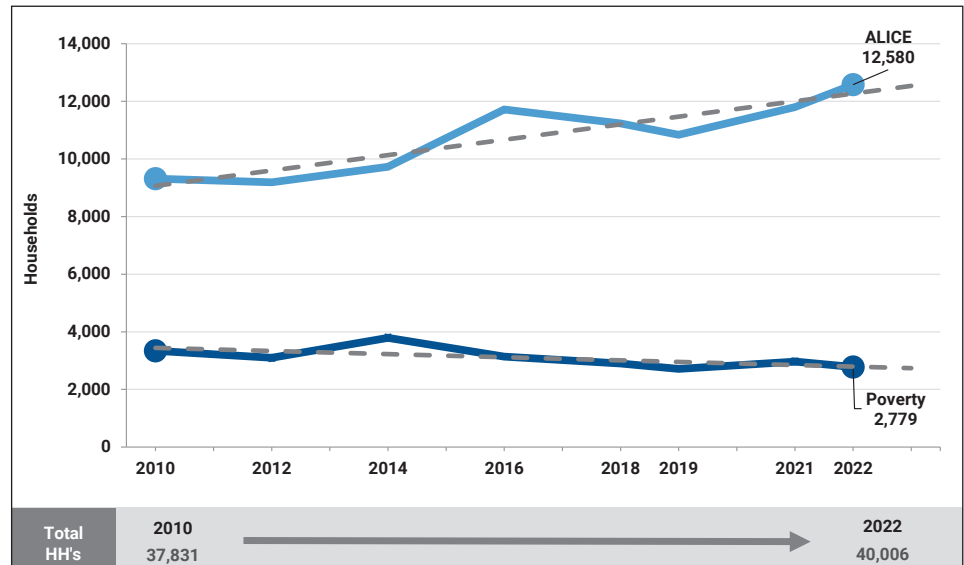

By 2022, 15,359 households (38%) were below the ALICE Threshold in Adams County.

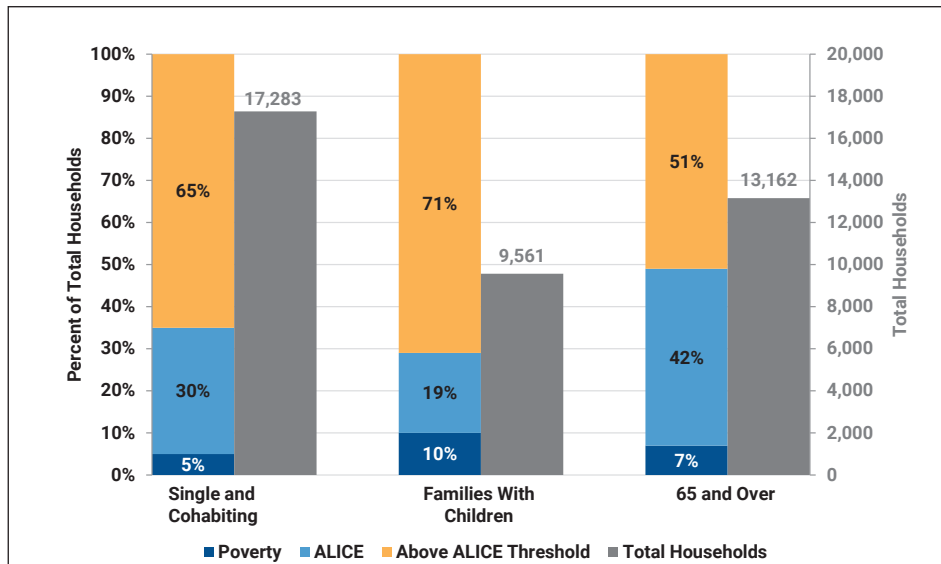

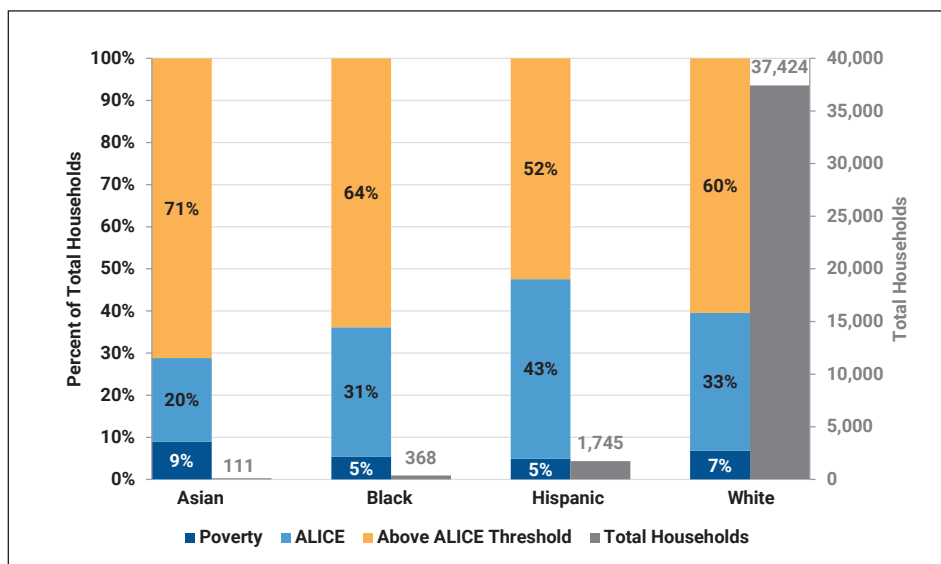

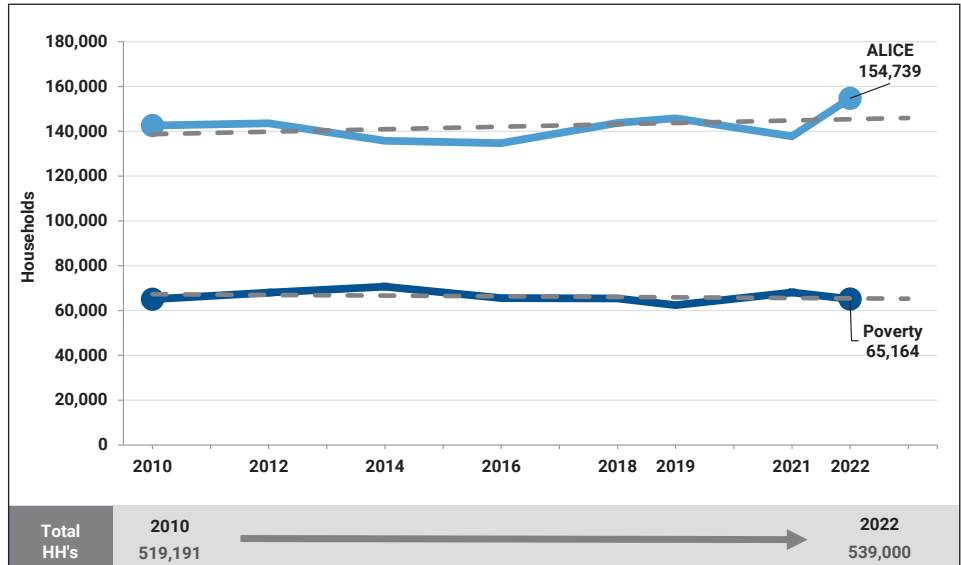

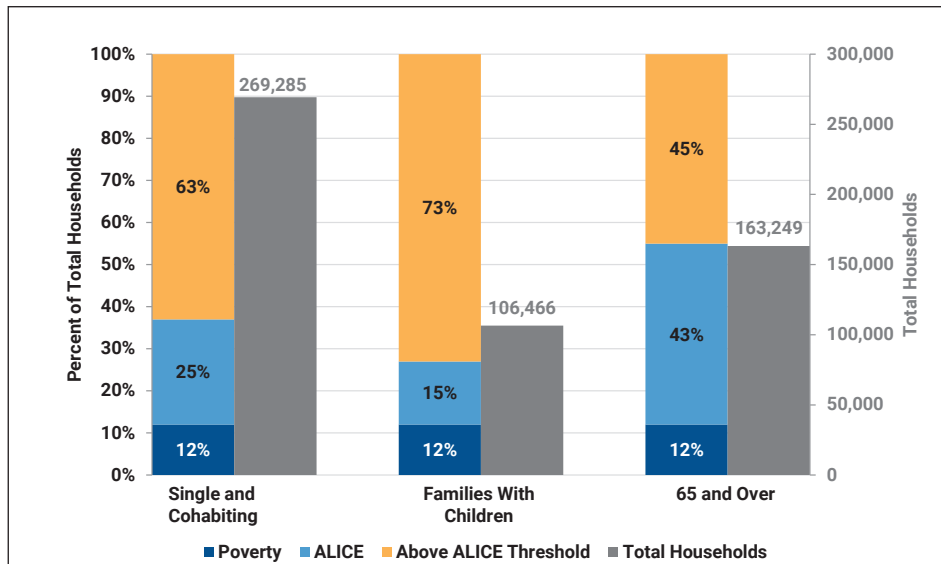

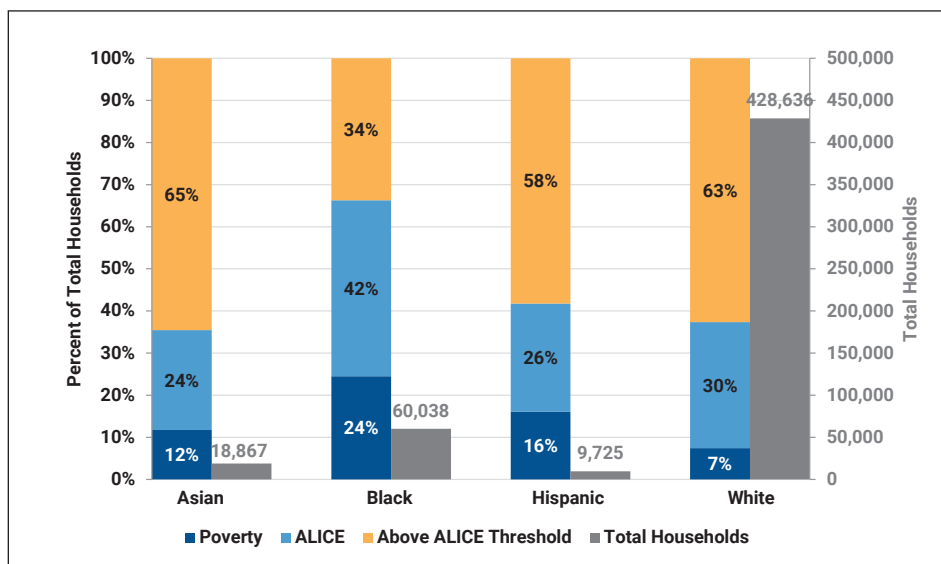
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Allegheny County, 2022

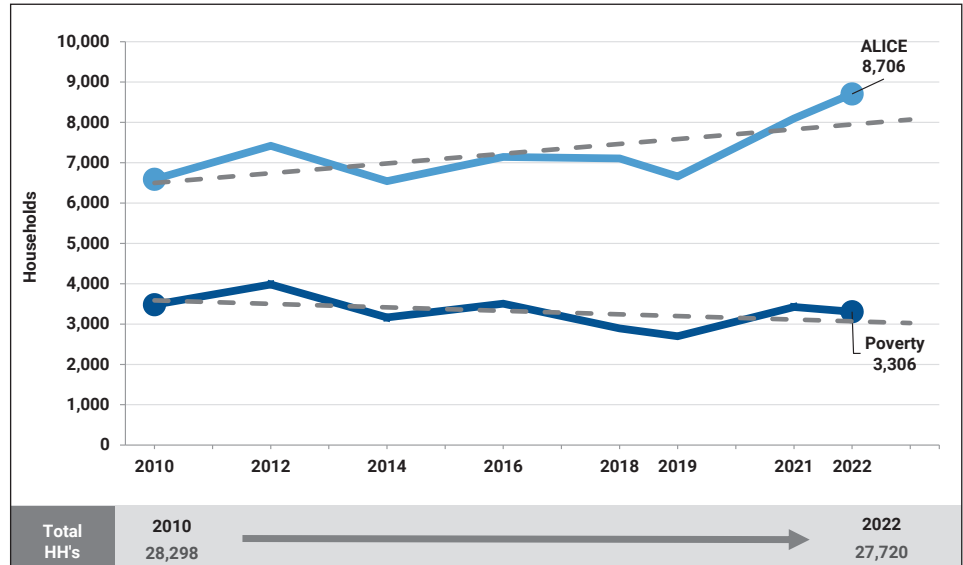

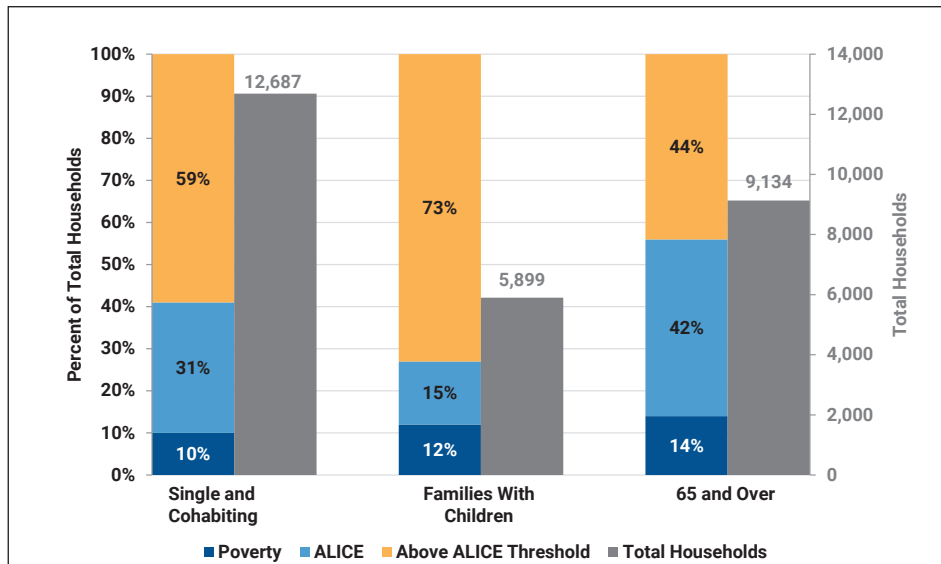

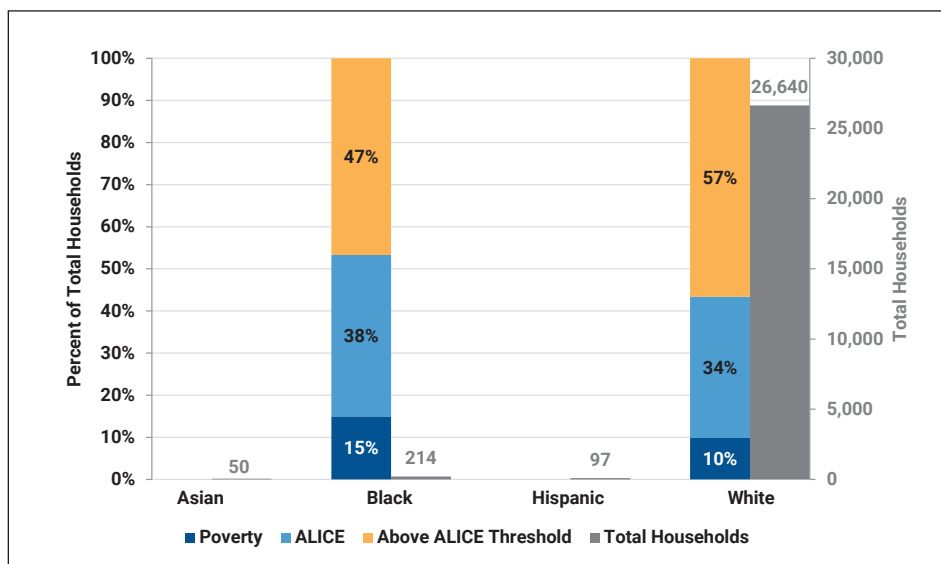
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Armstrong County, 2022

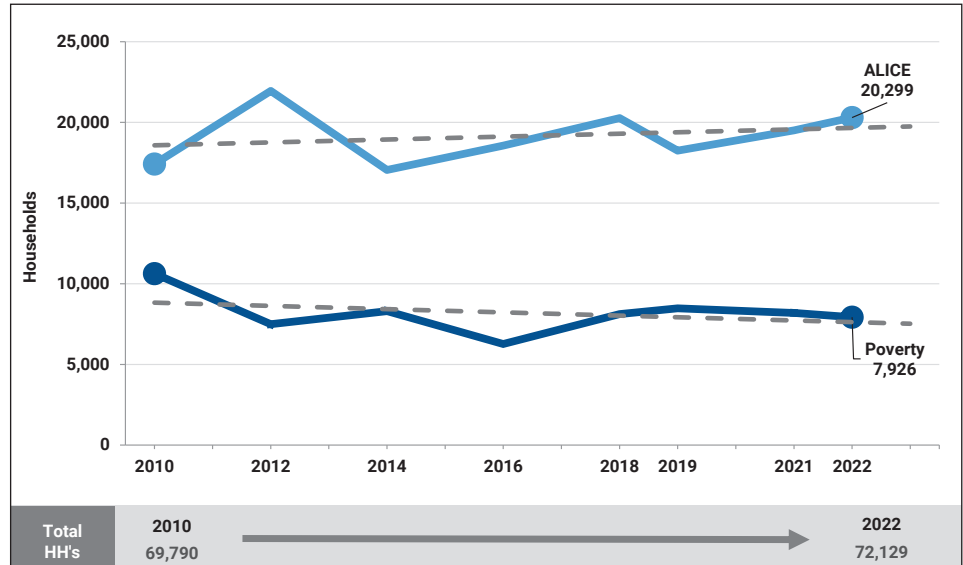

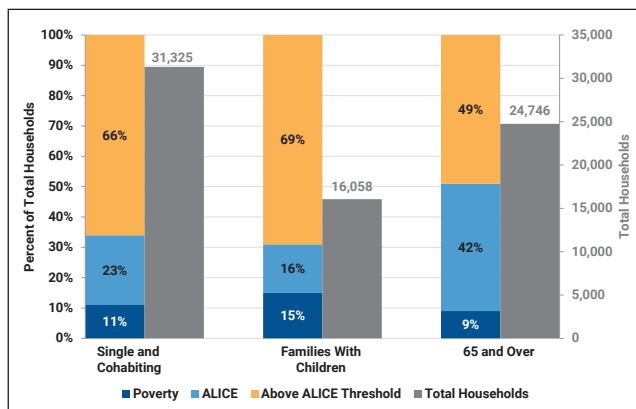

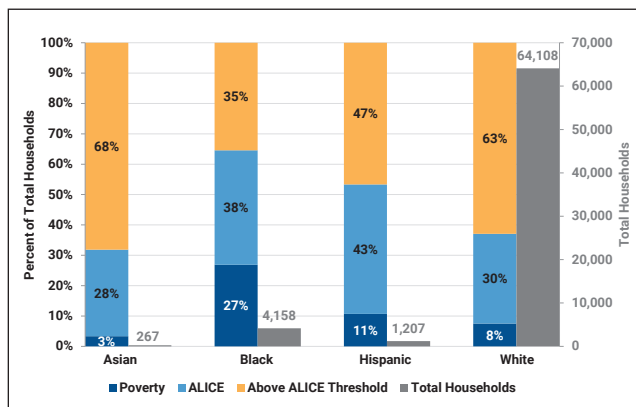

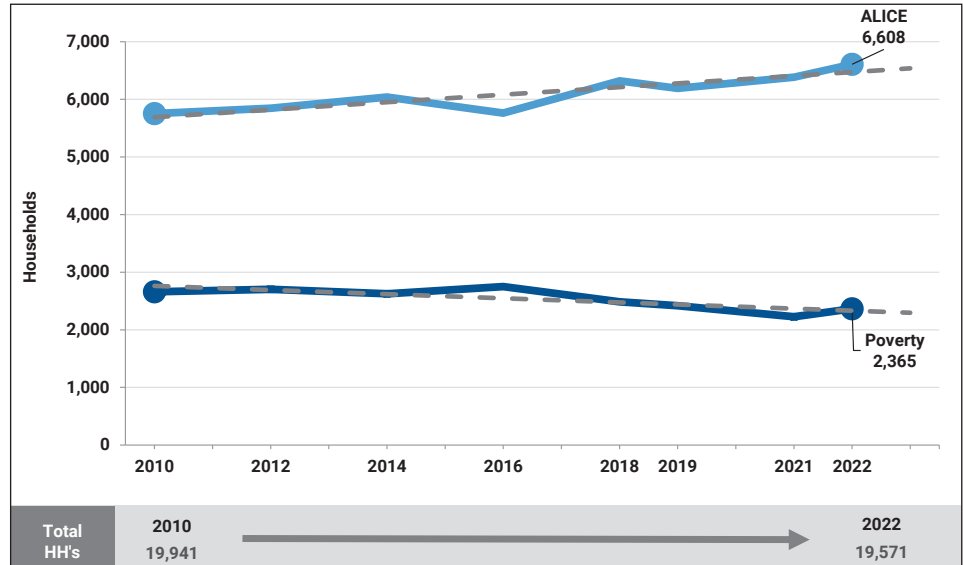

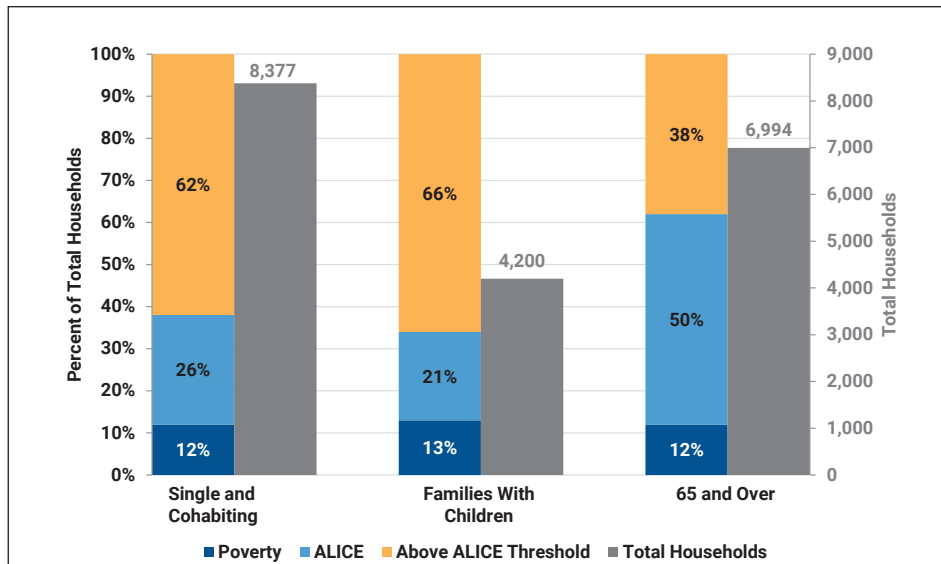

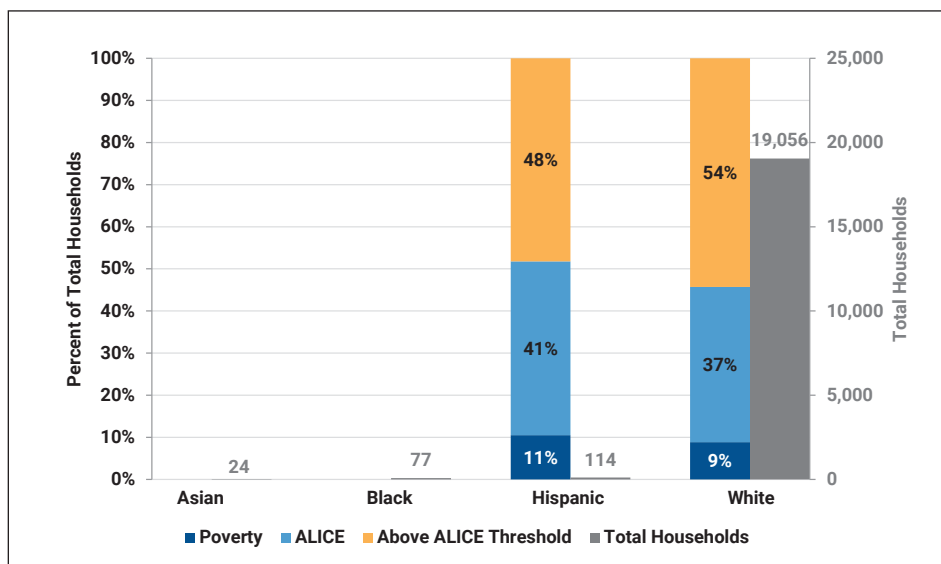
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Bedford County, 2022

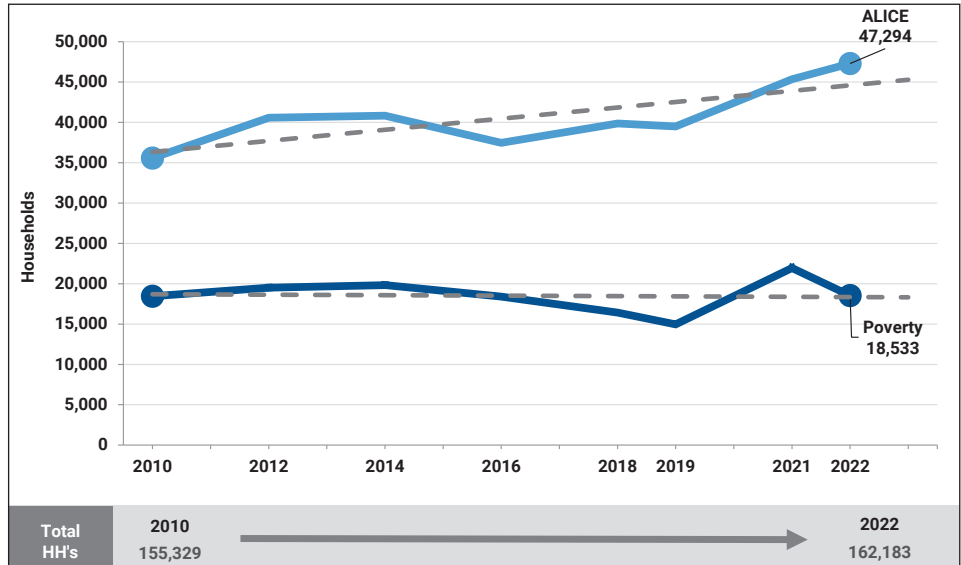

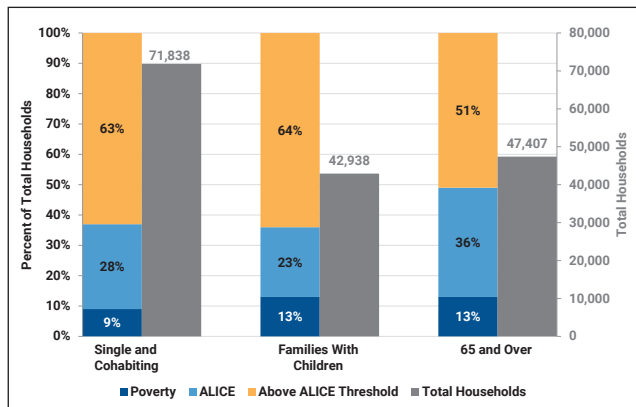

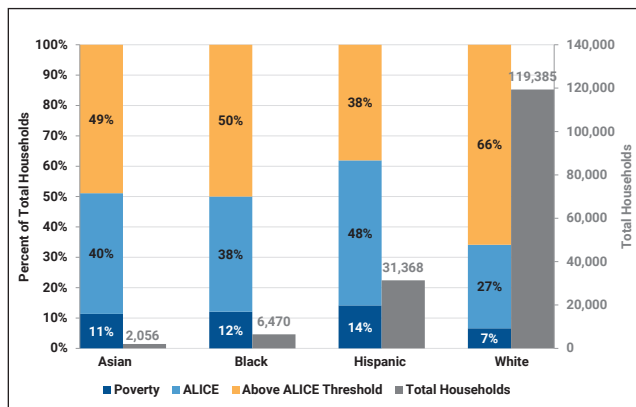

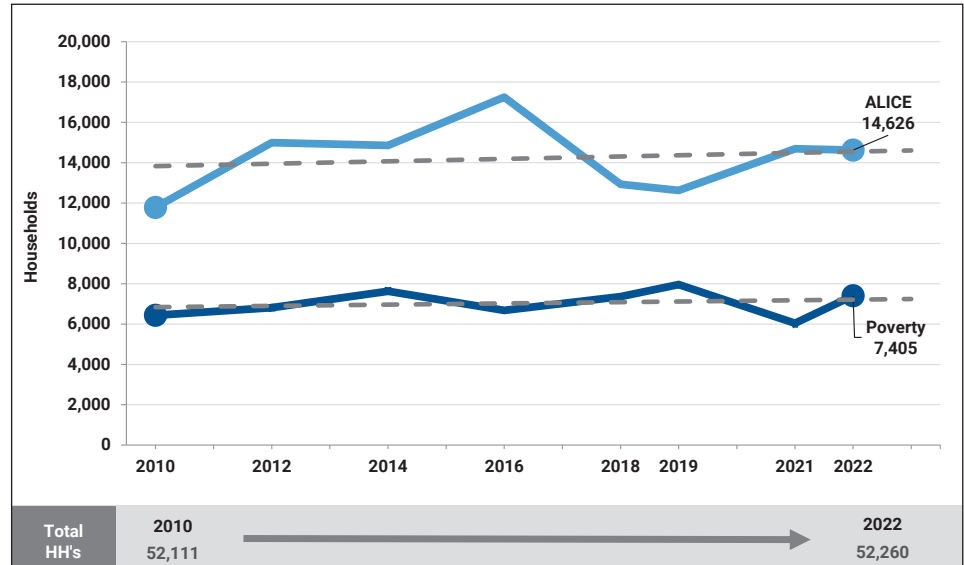

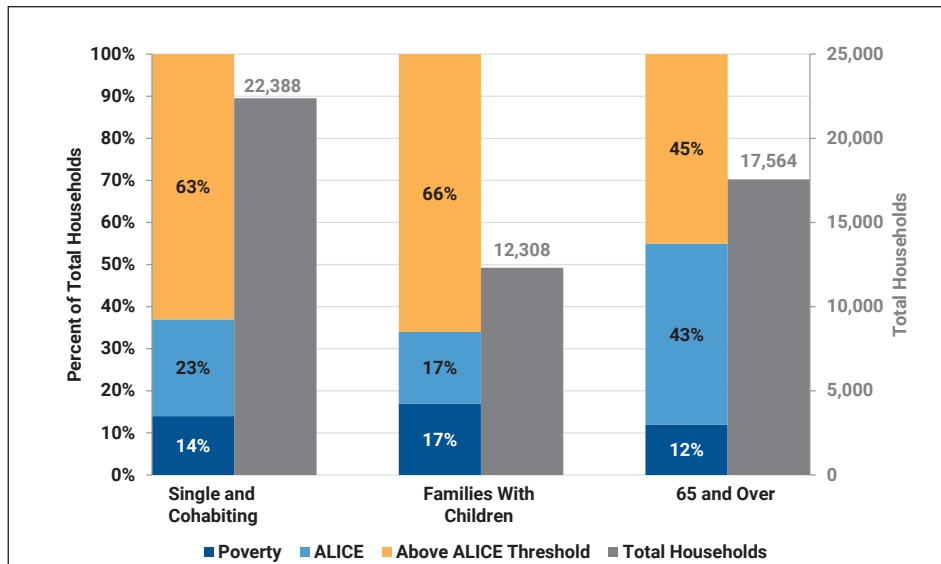

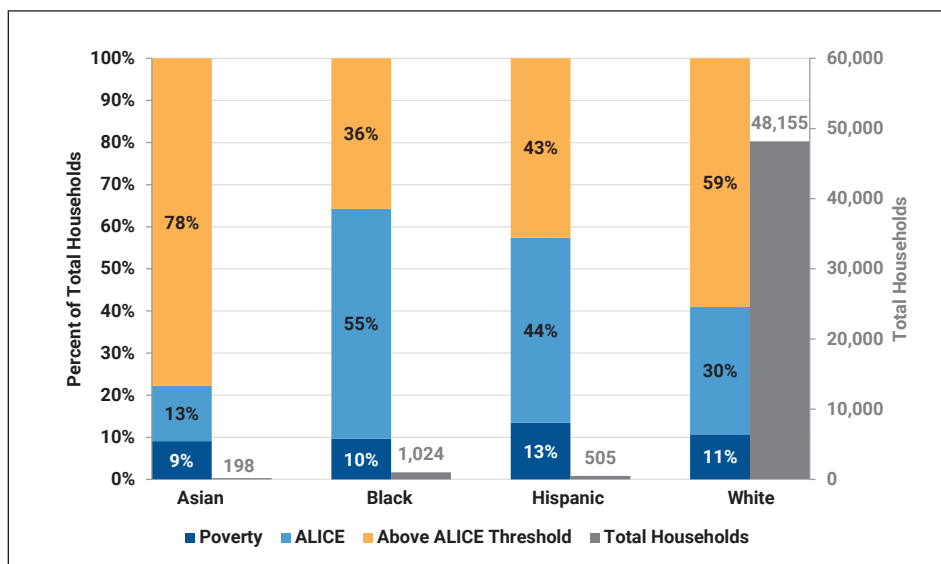
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Blair County, 2022

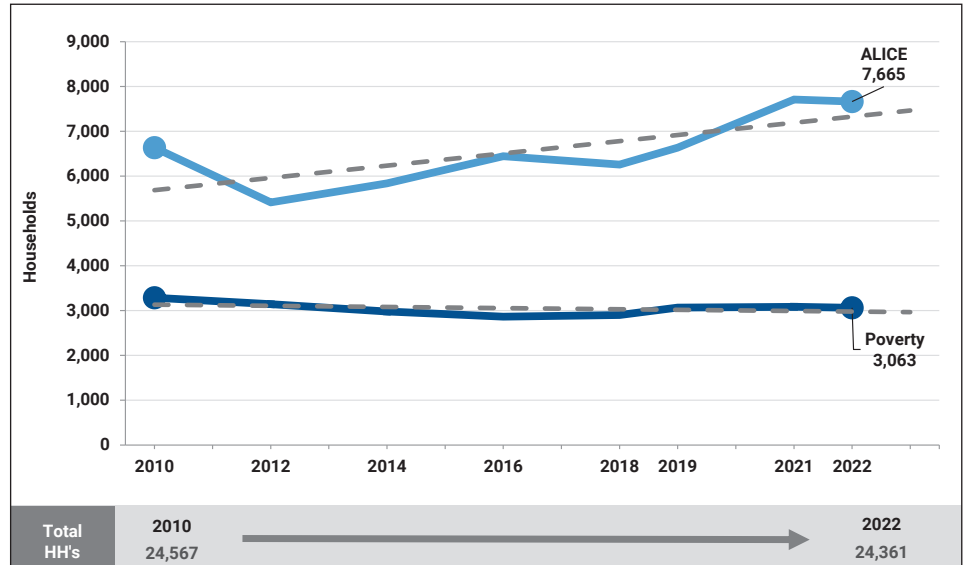

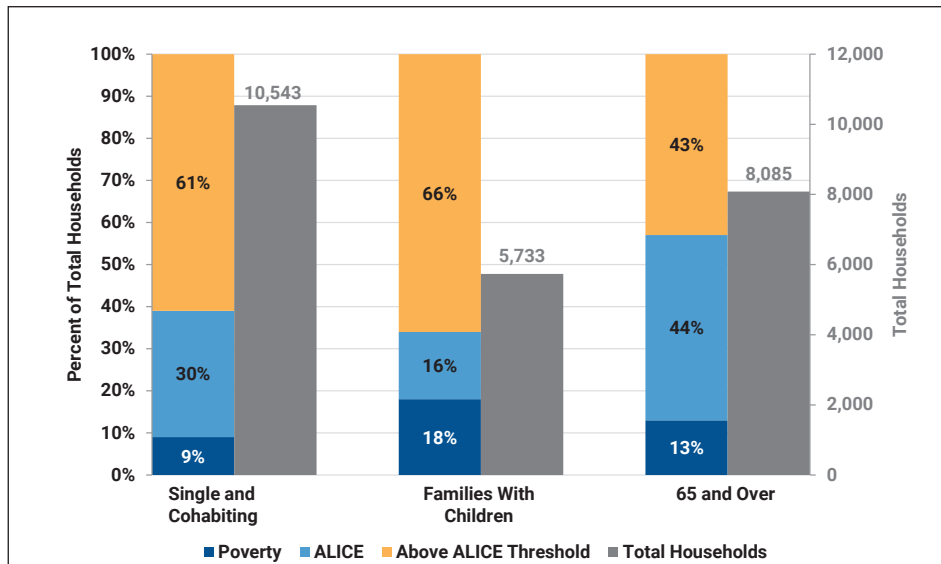

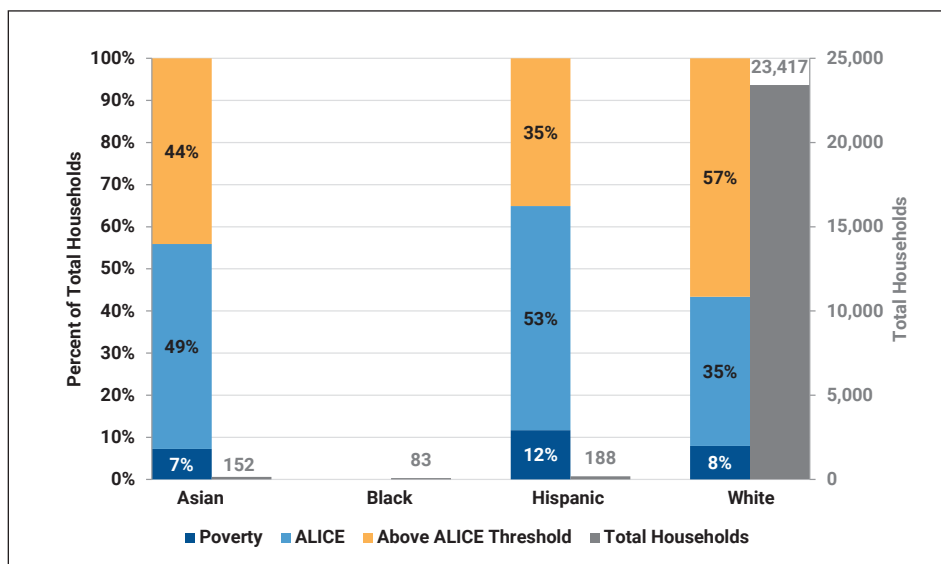

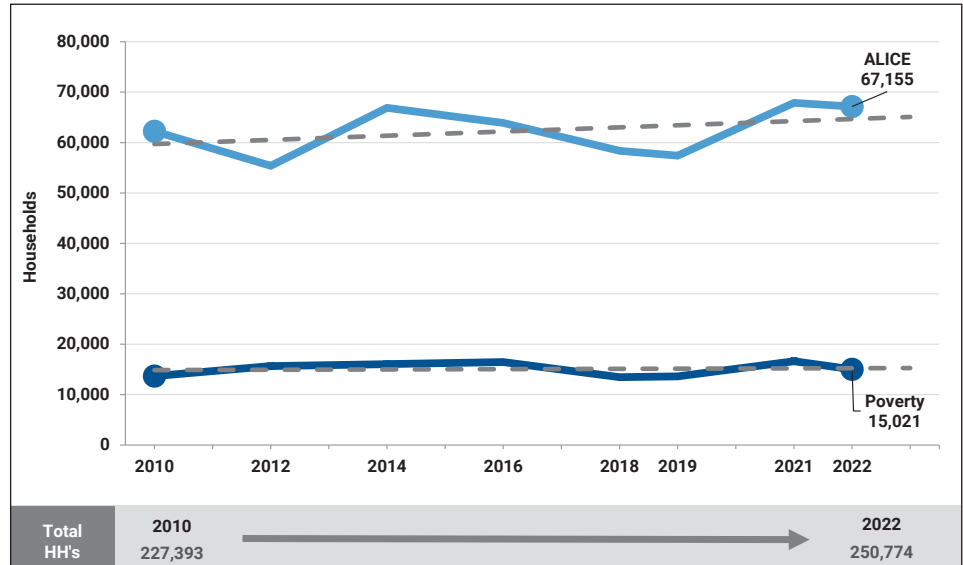

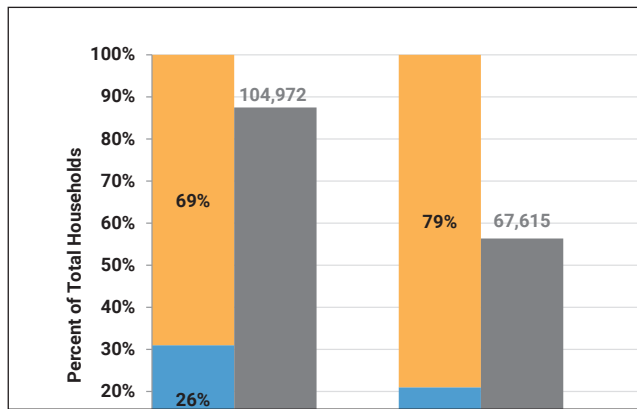

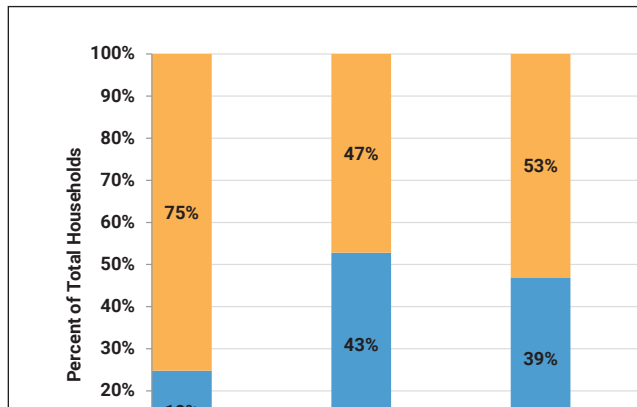

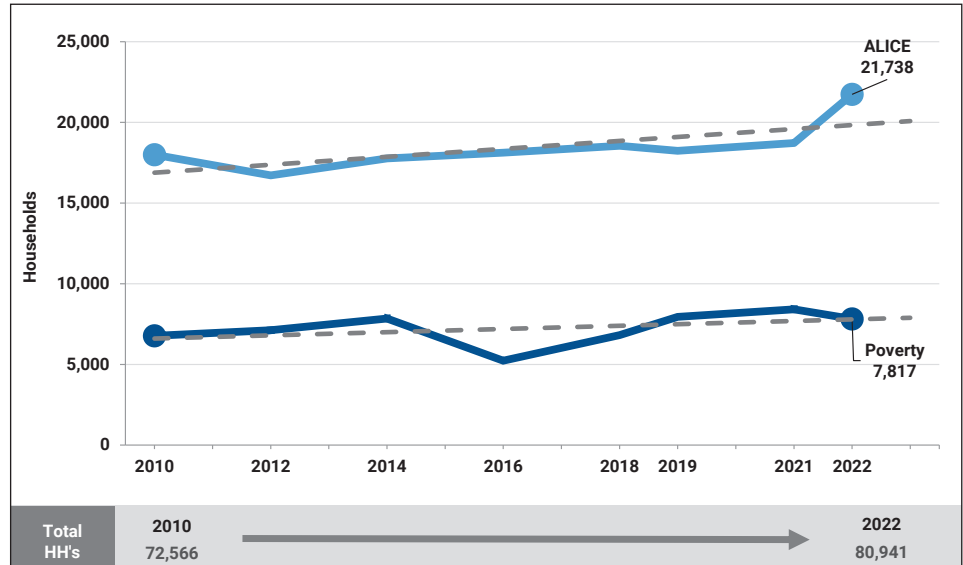

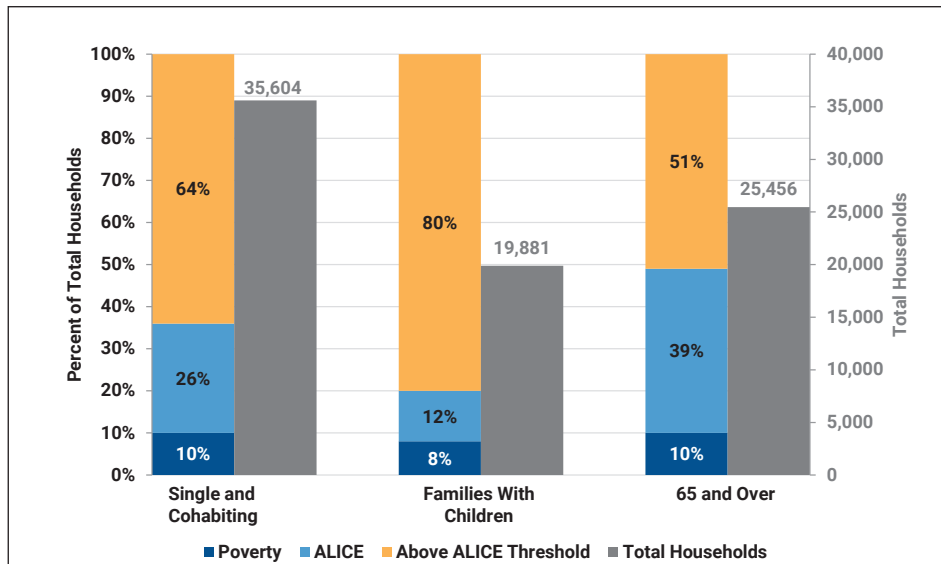

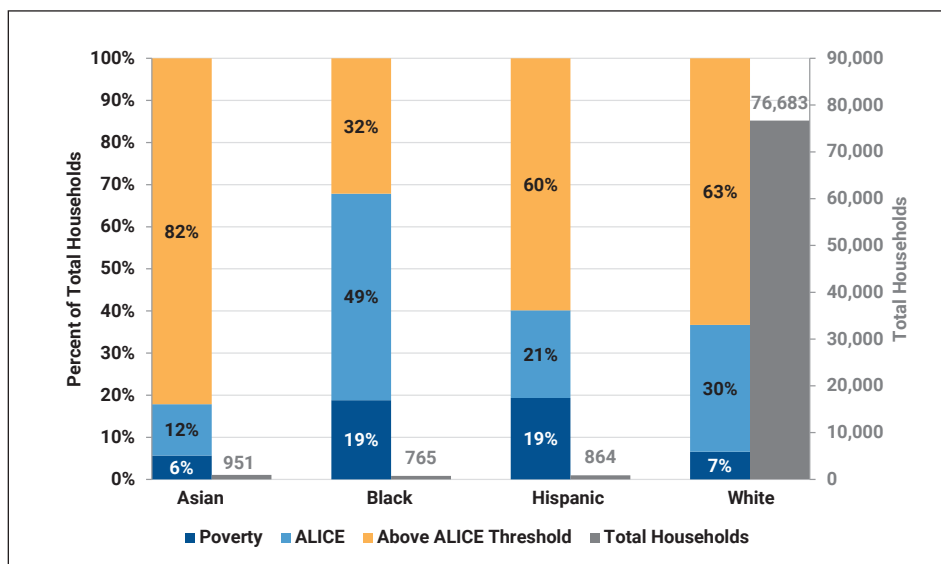

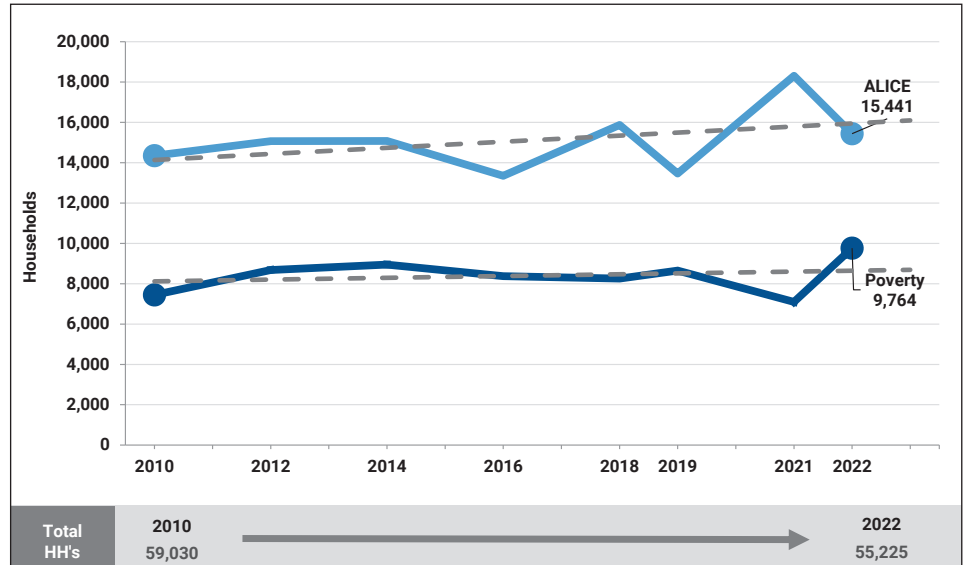

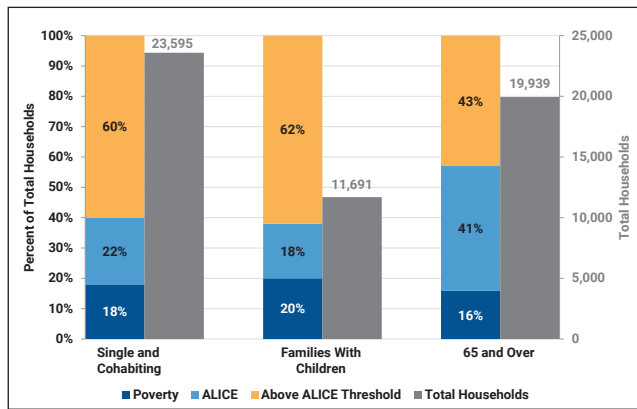

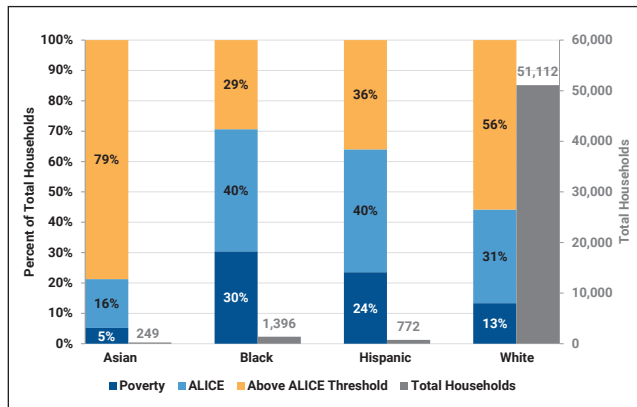

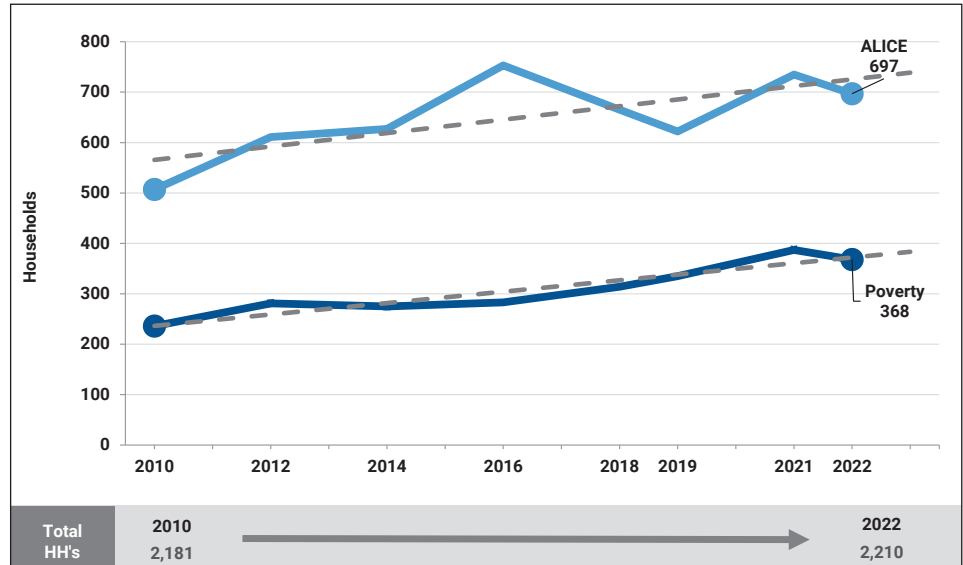

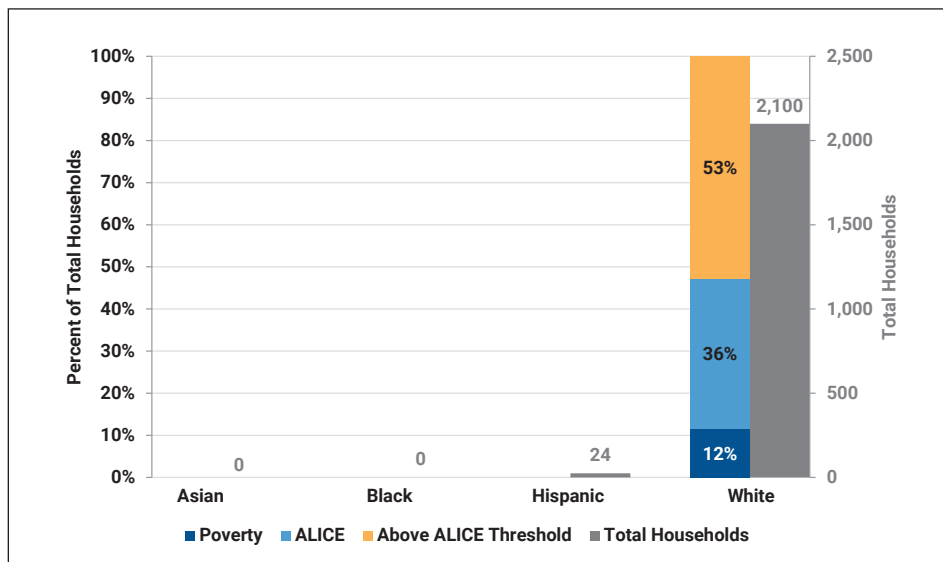

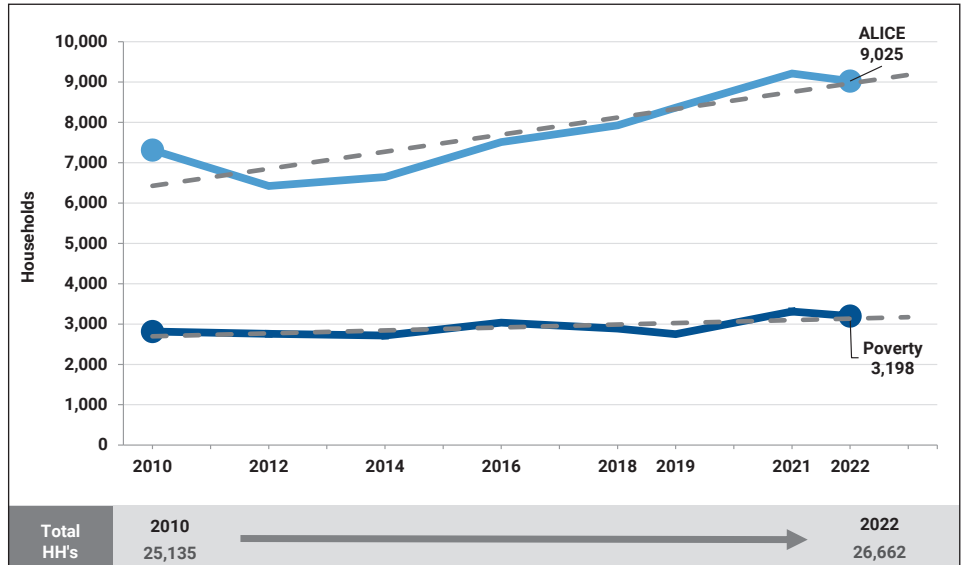

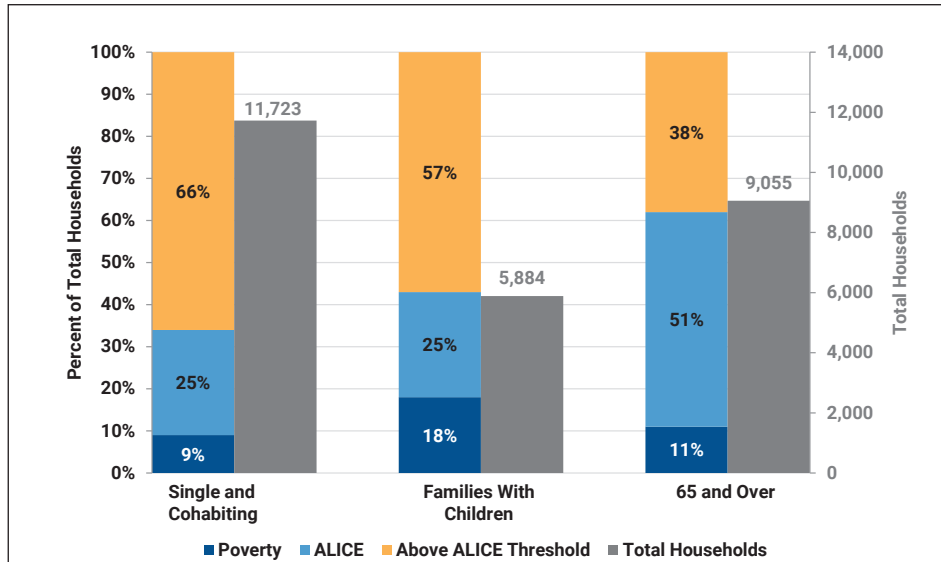

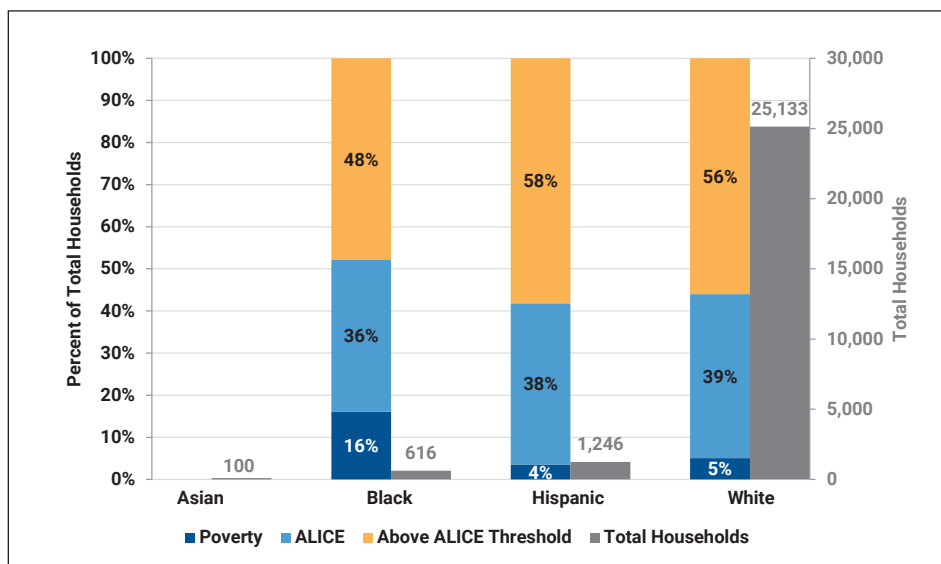

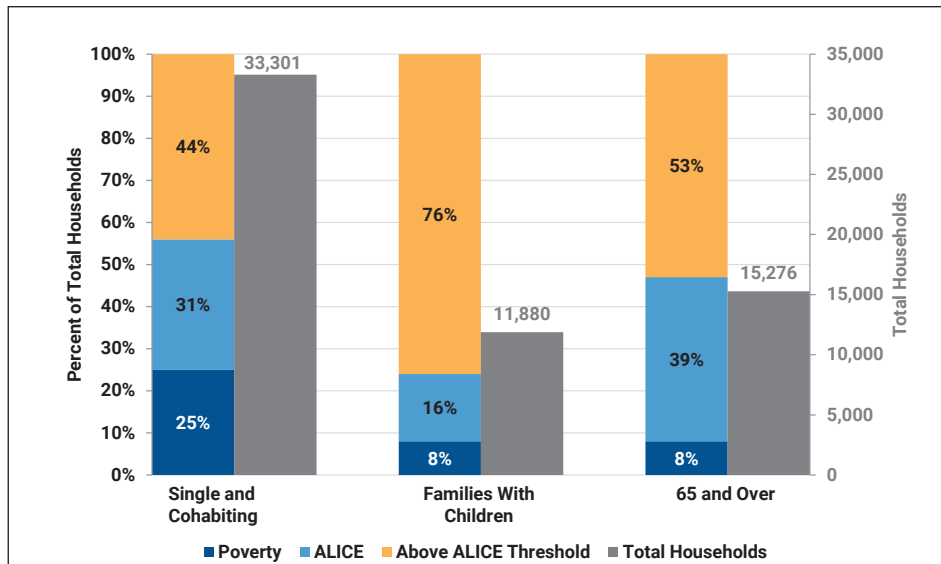

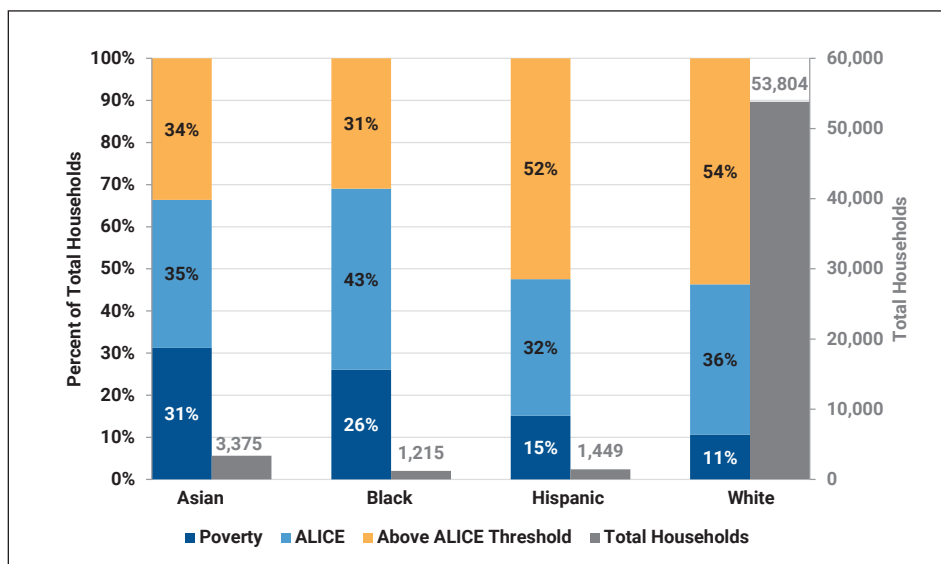

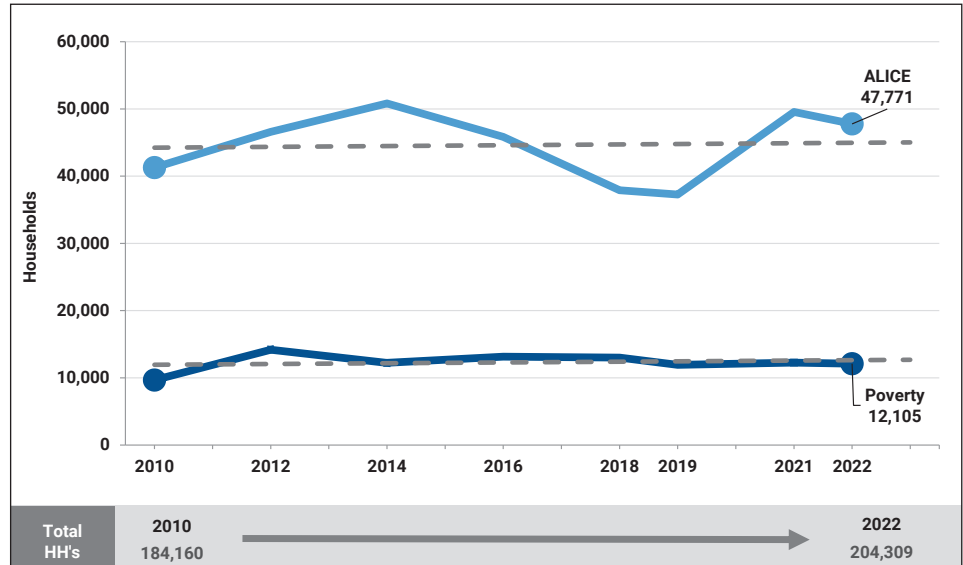

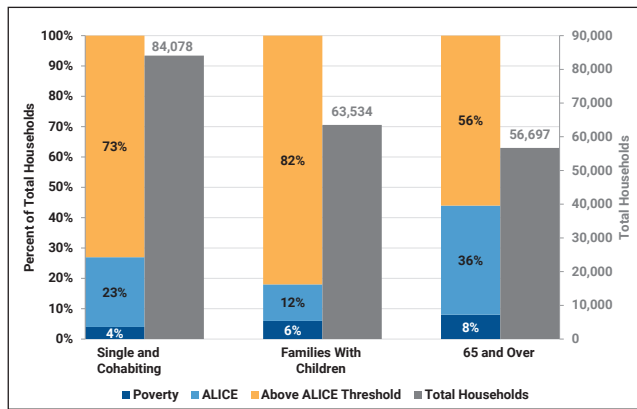

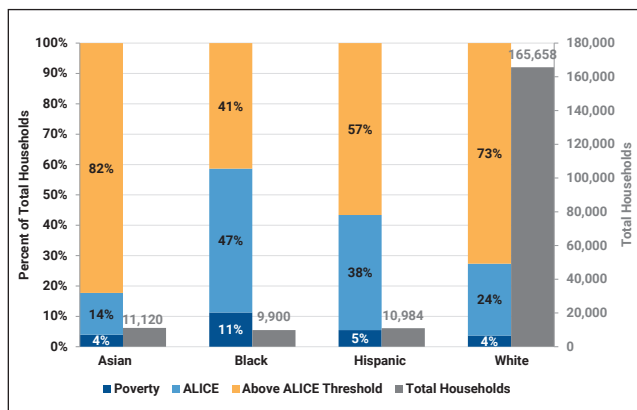

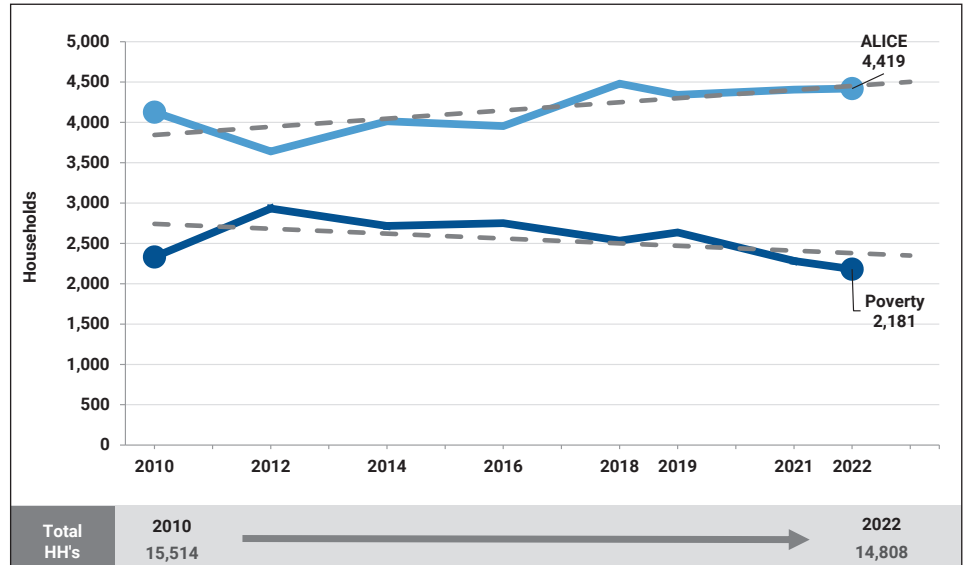

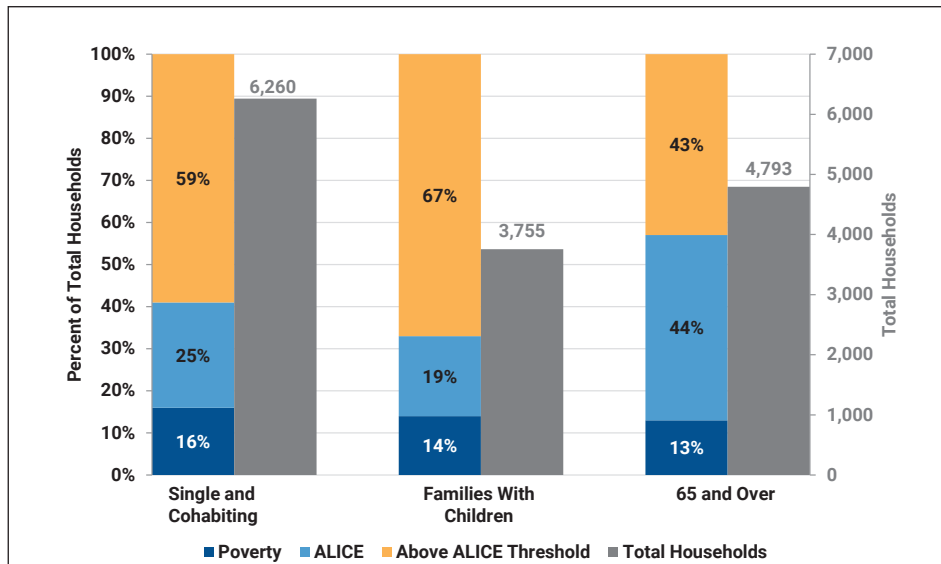

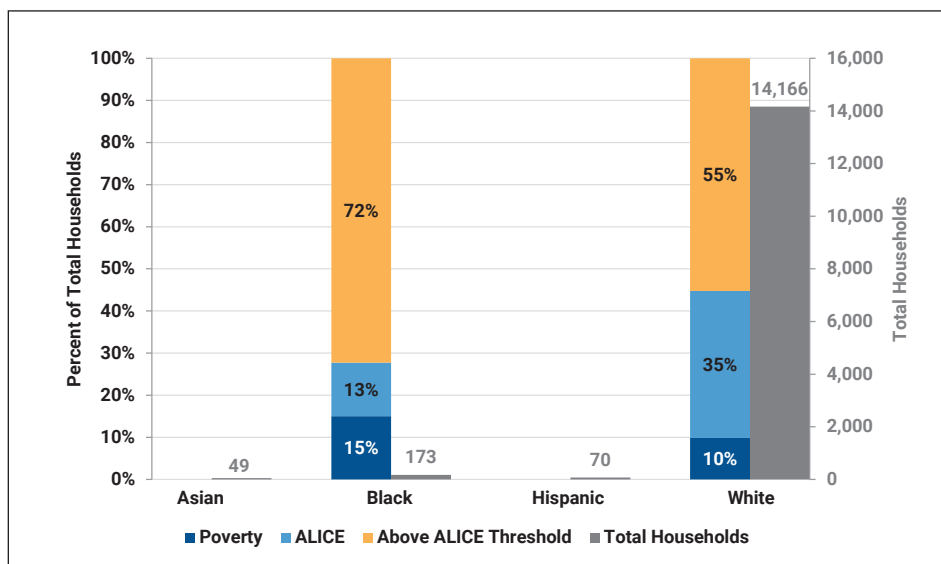

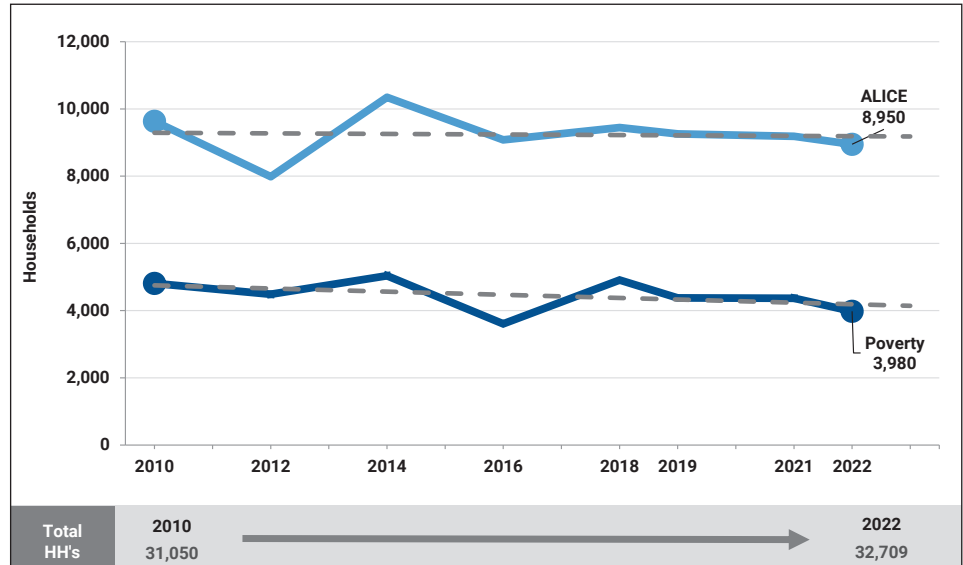

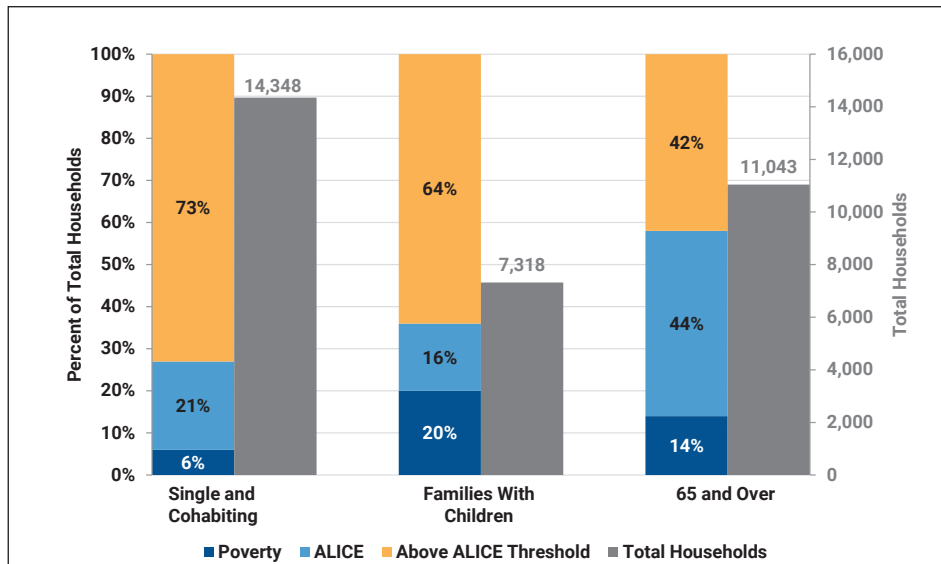

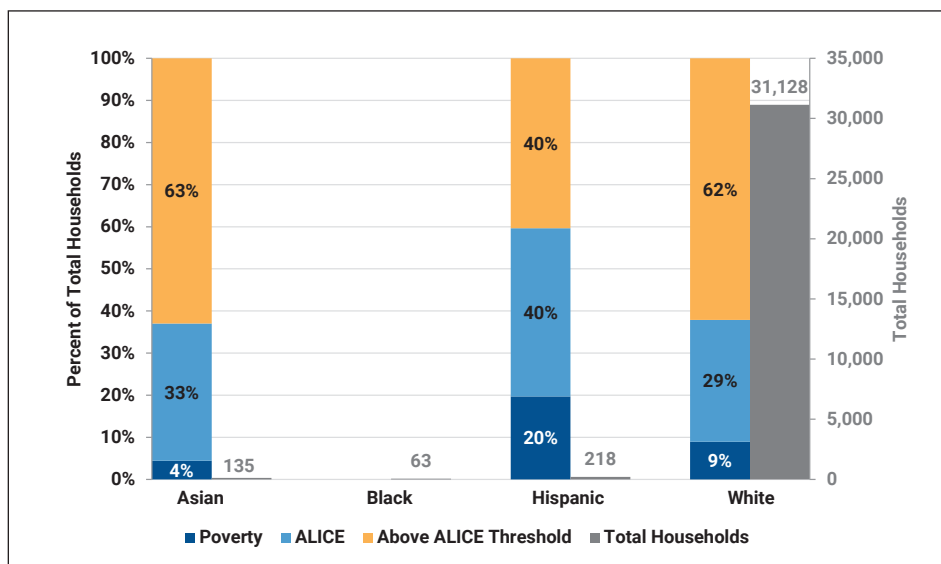

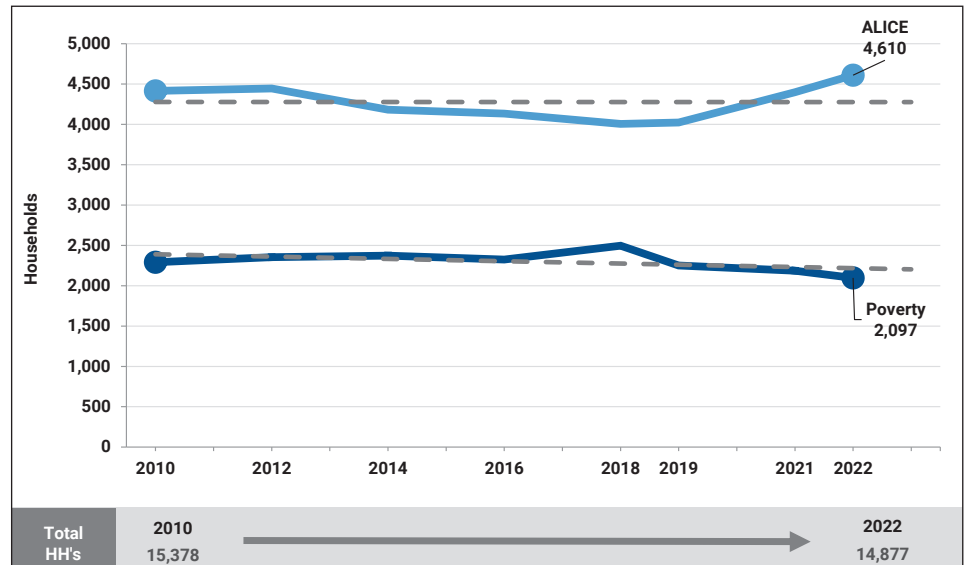

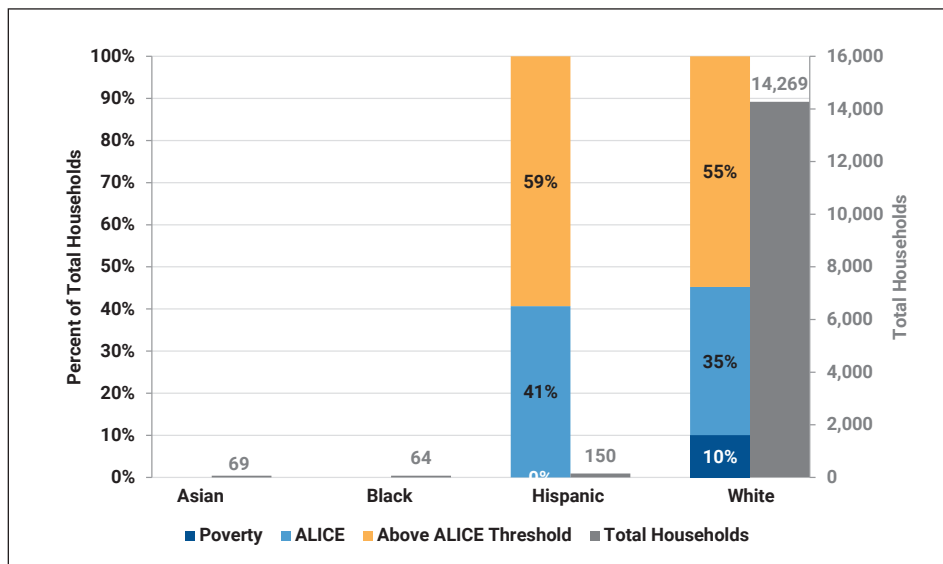

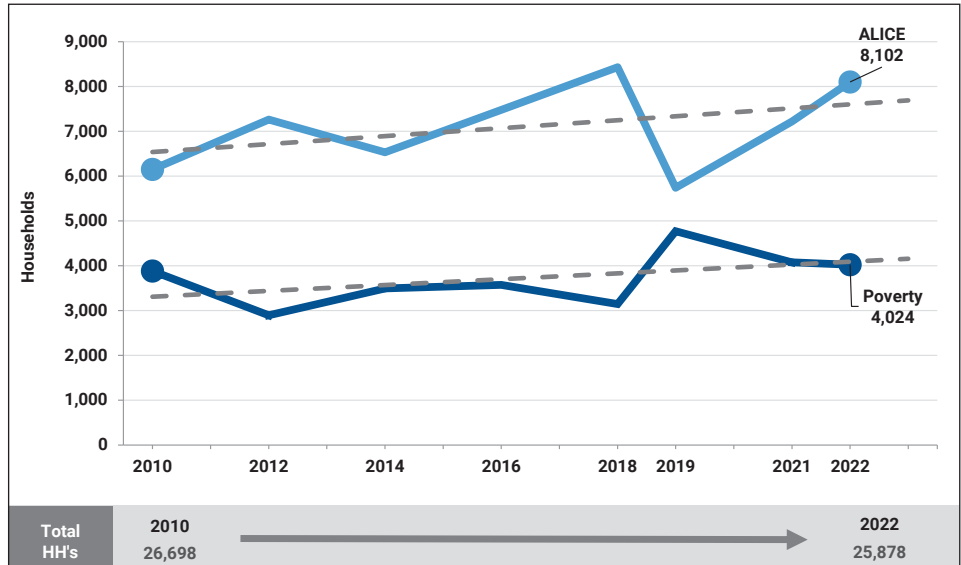

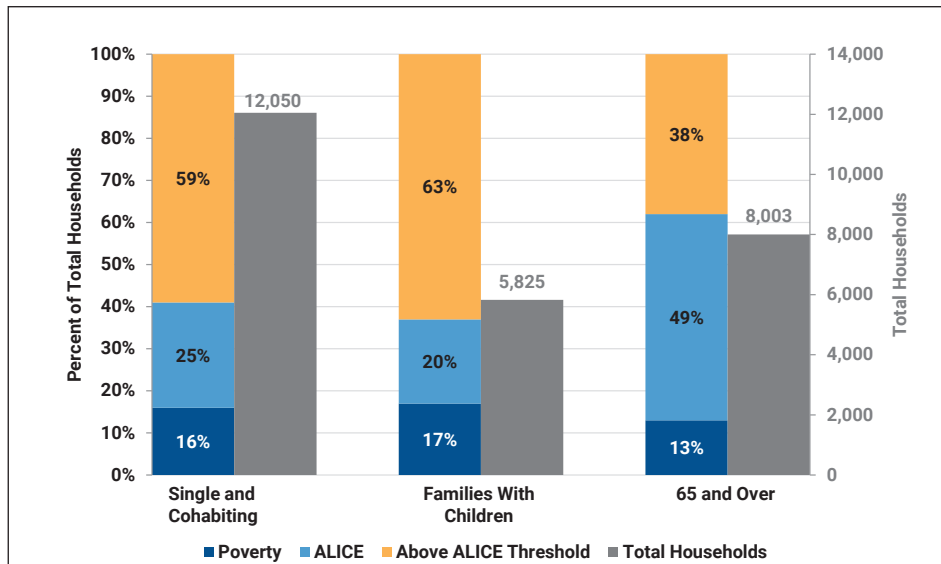

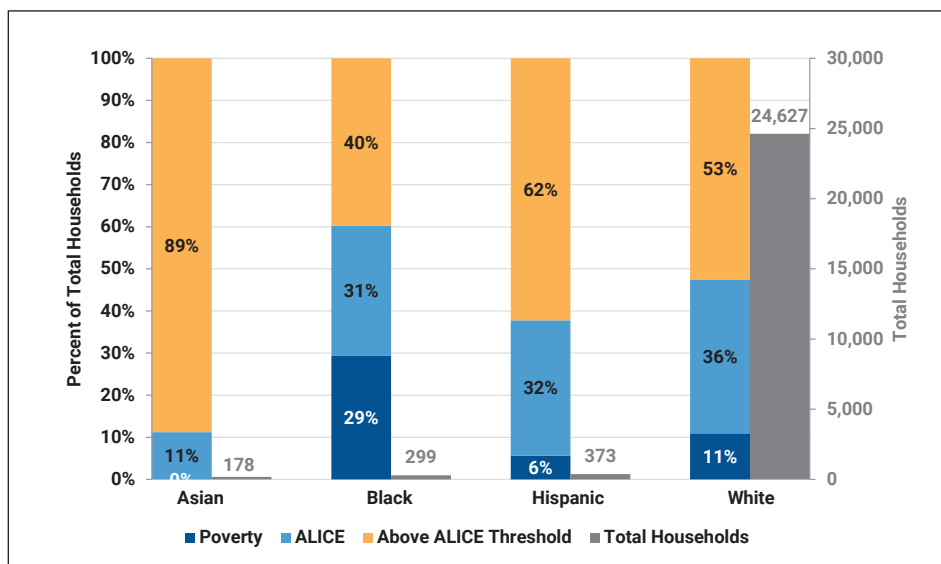

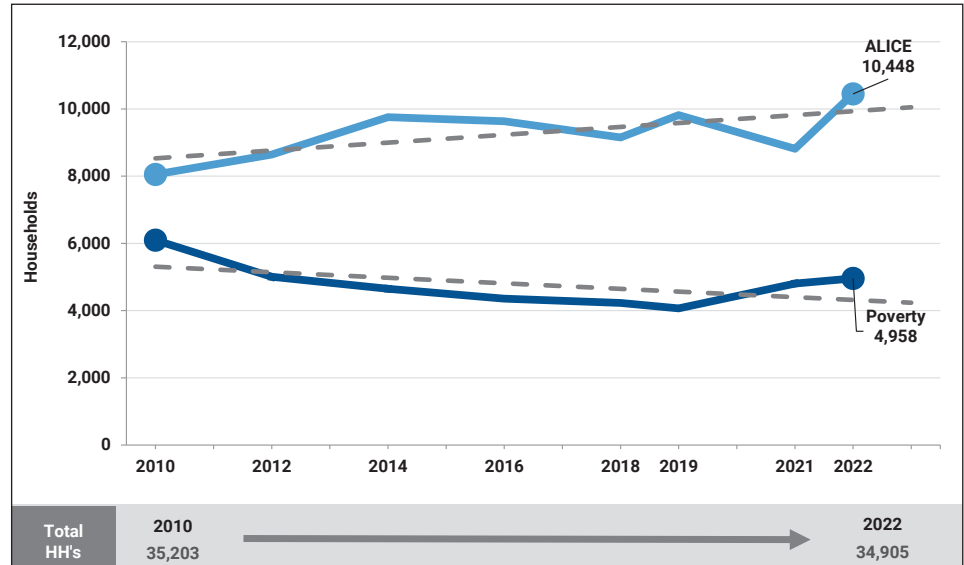

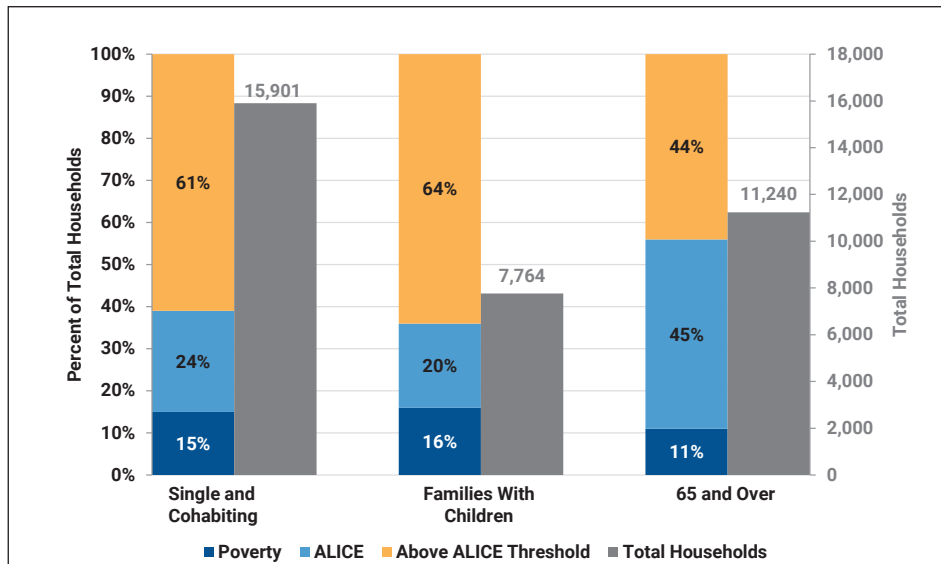

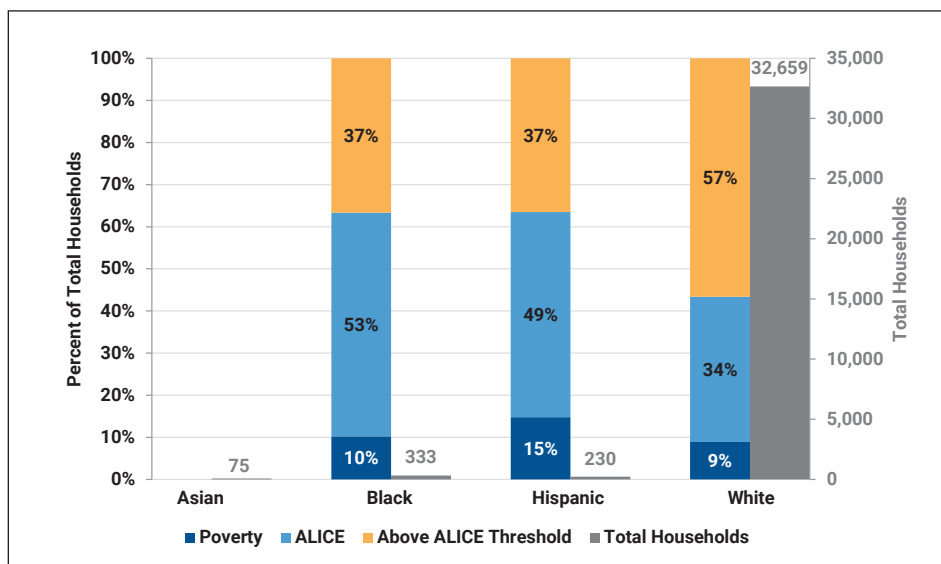

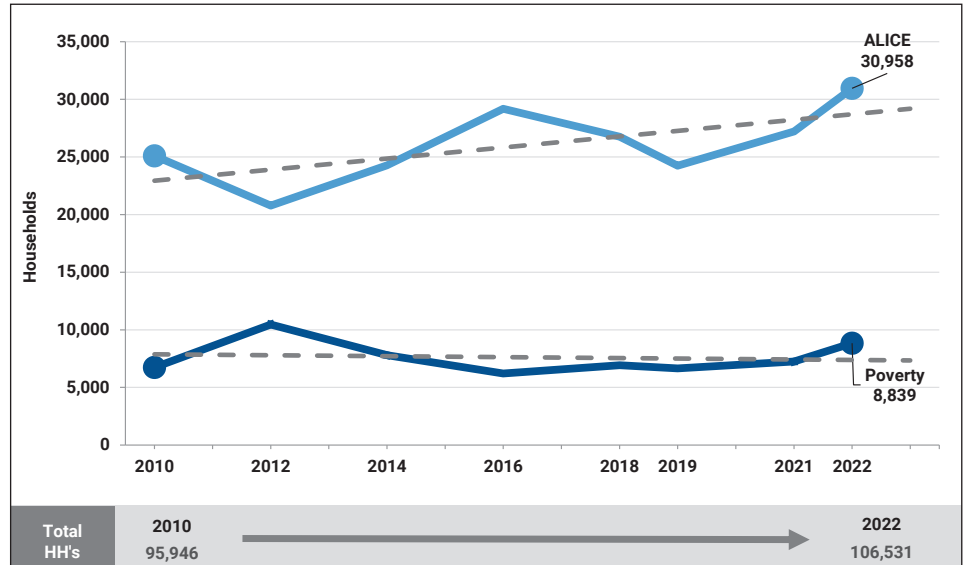

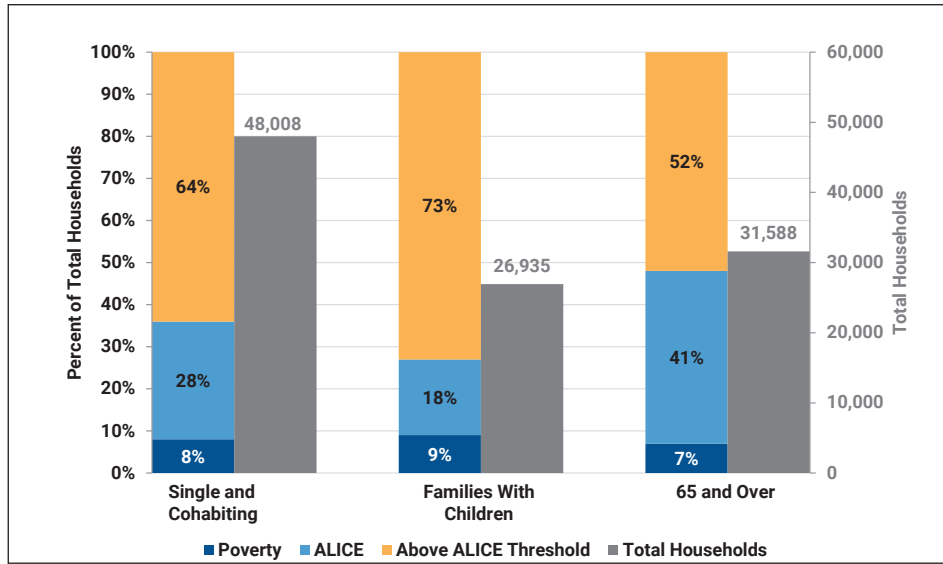

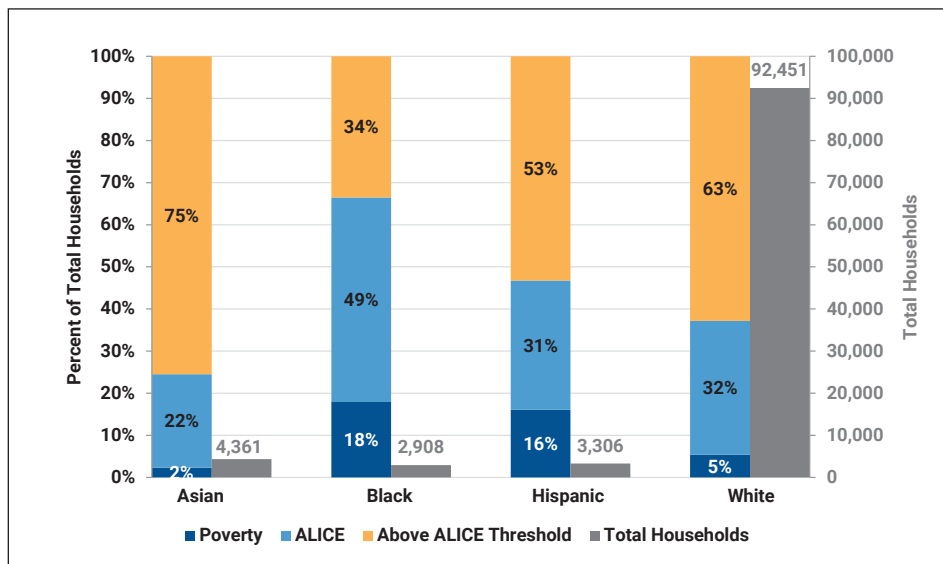

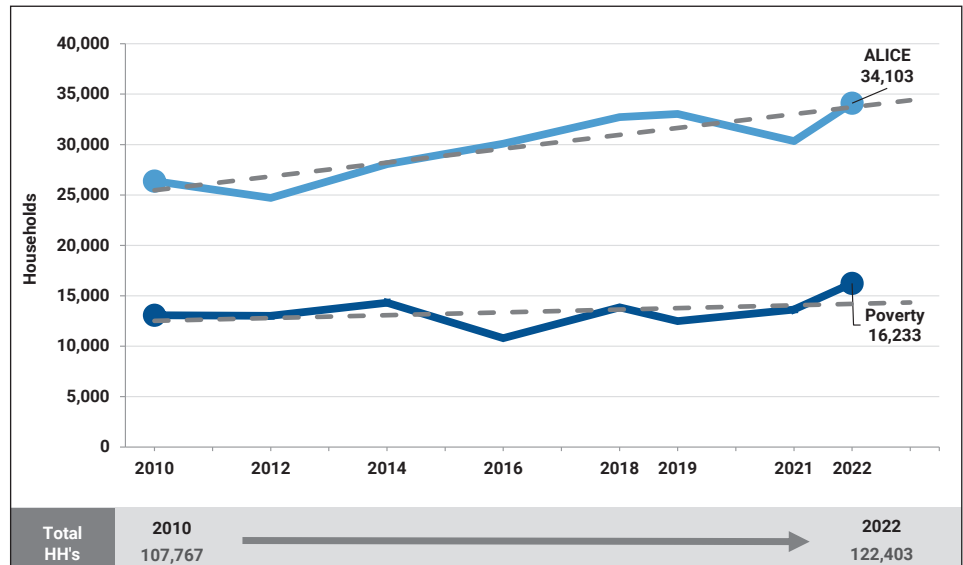

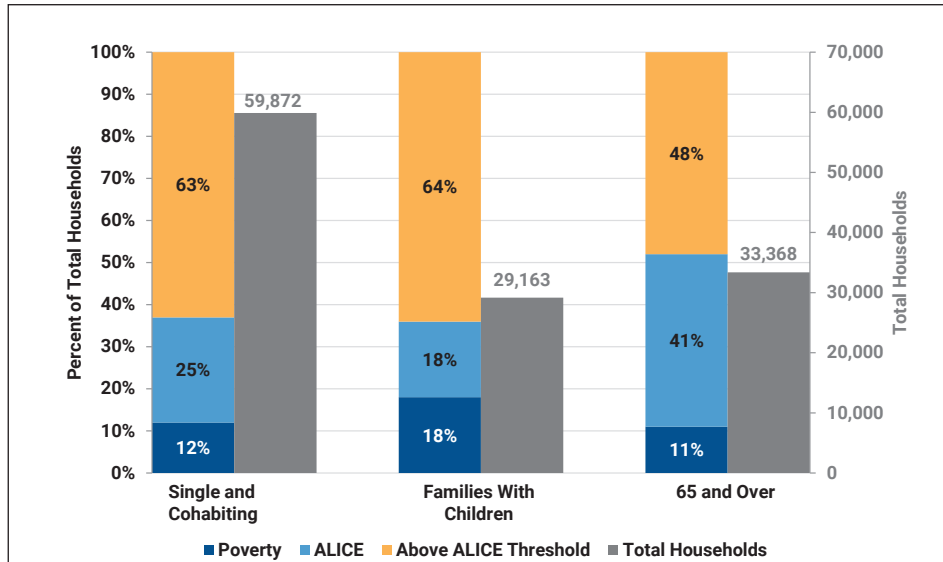

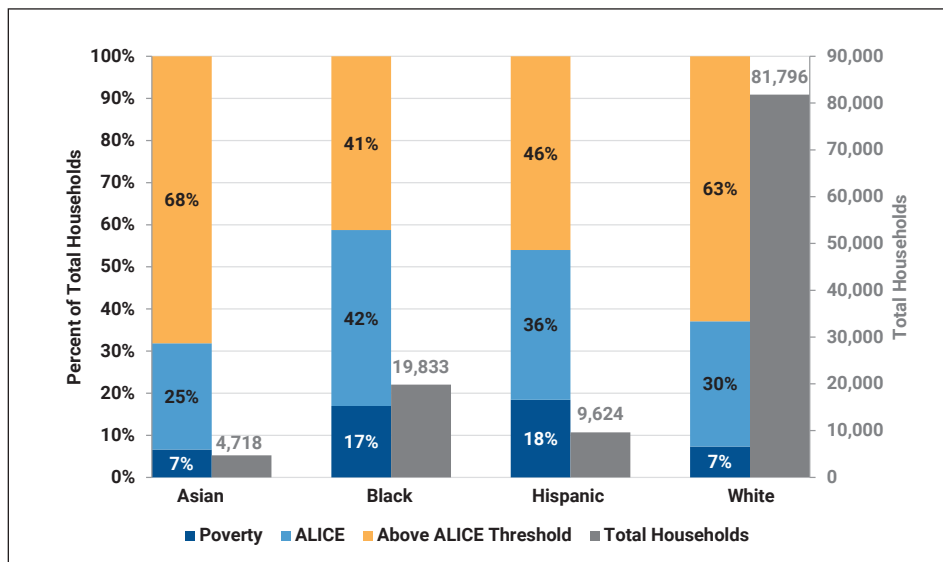

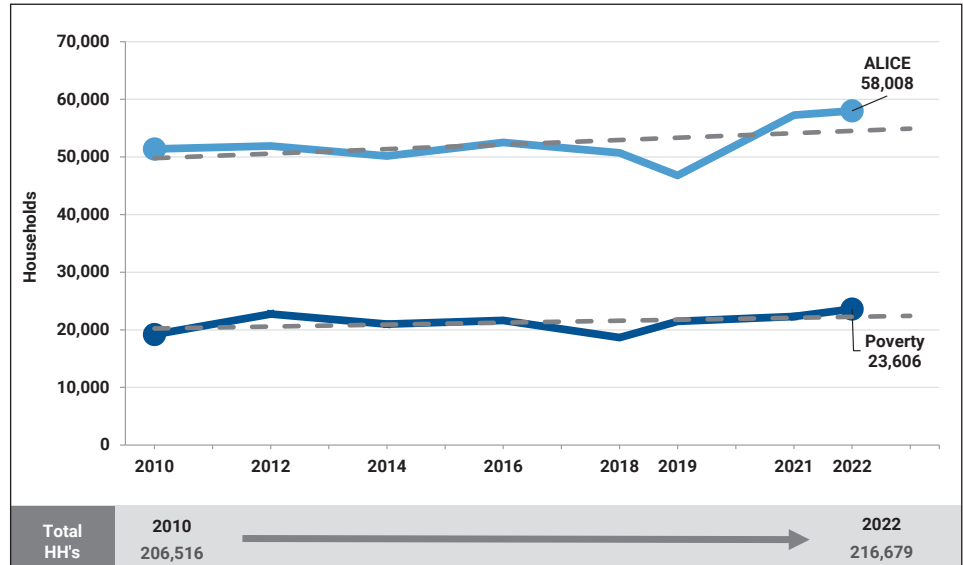

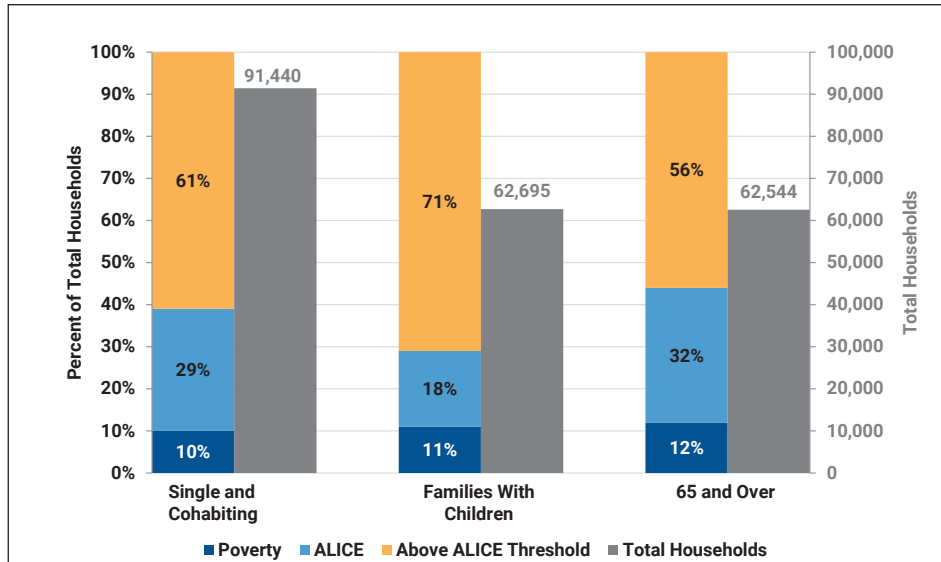

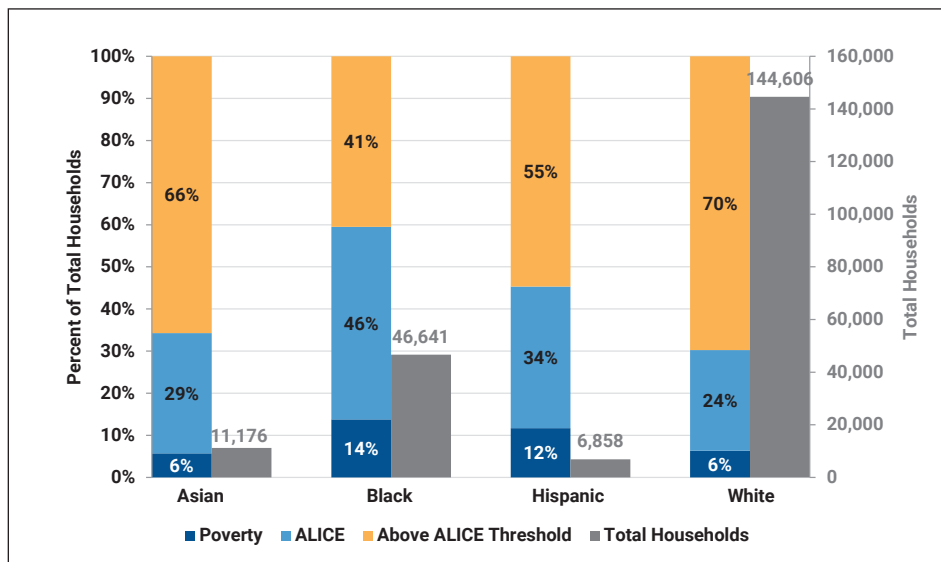

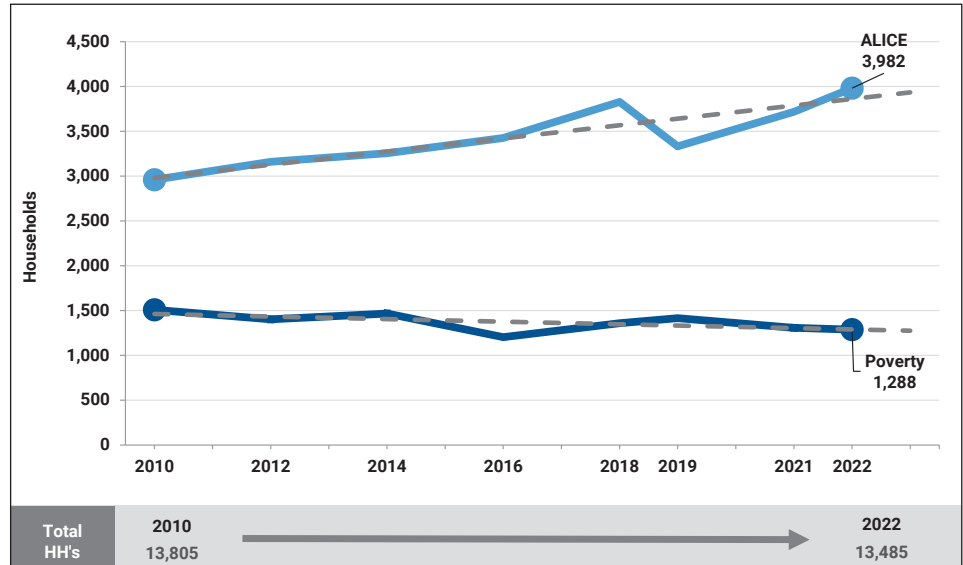

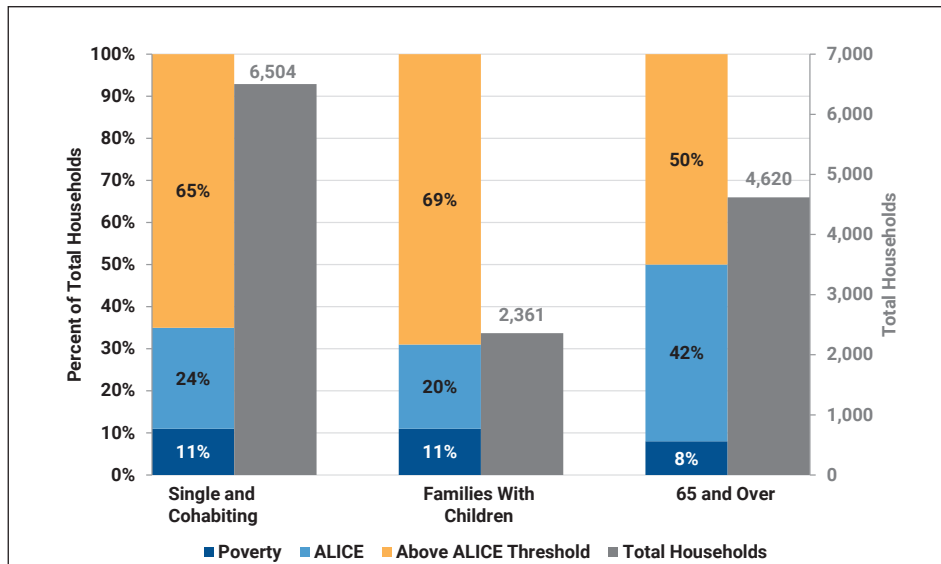

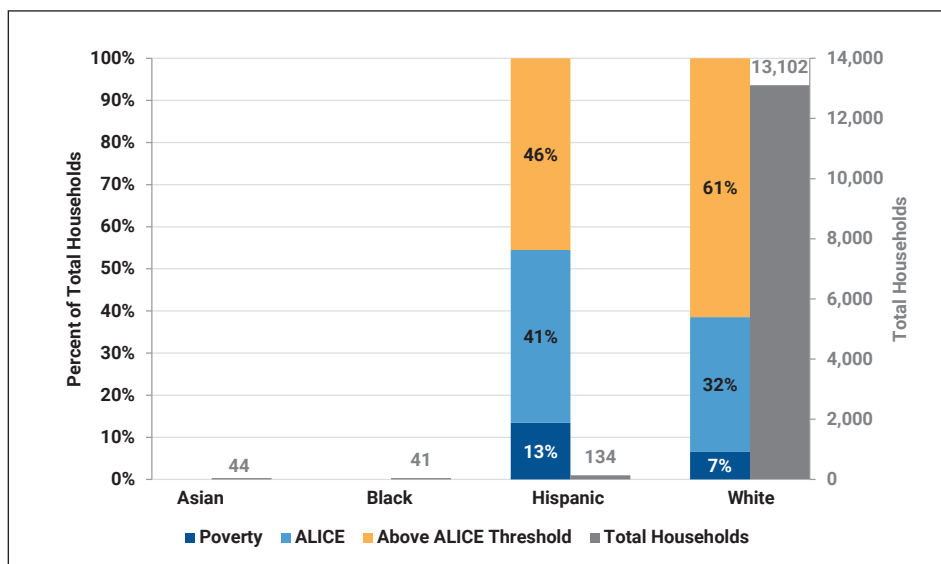
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Elk County, 2022

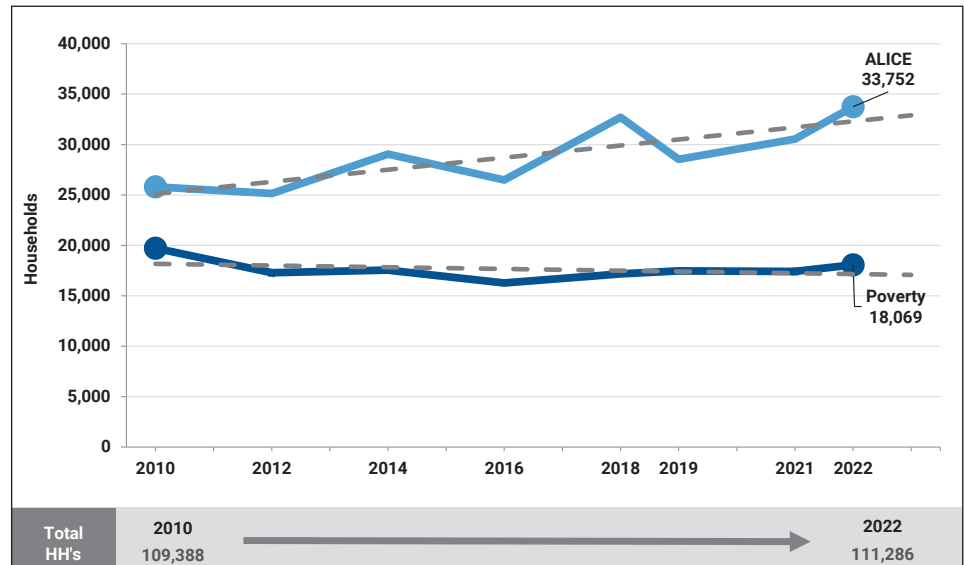

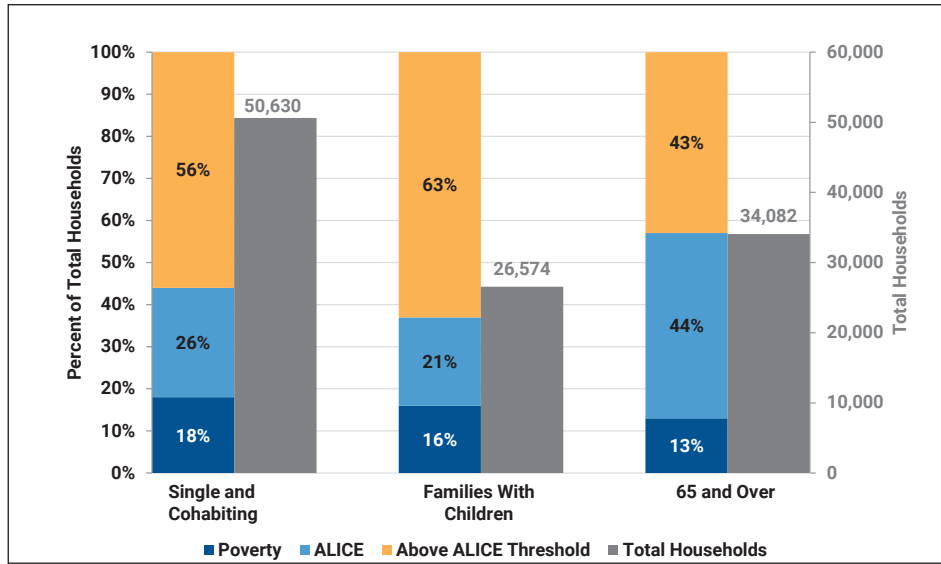

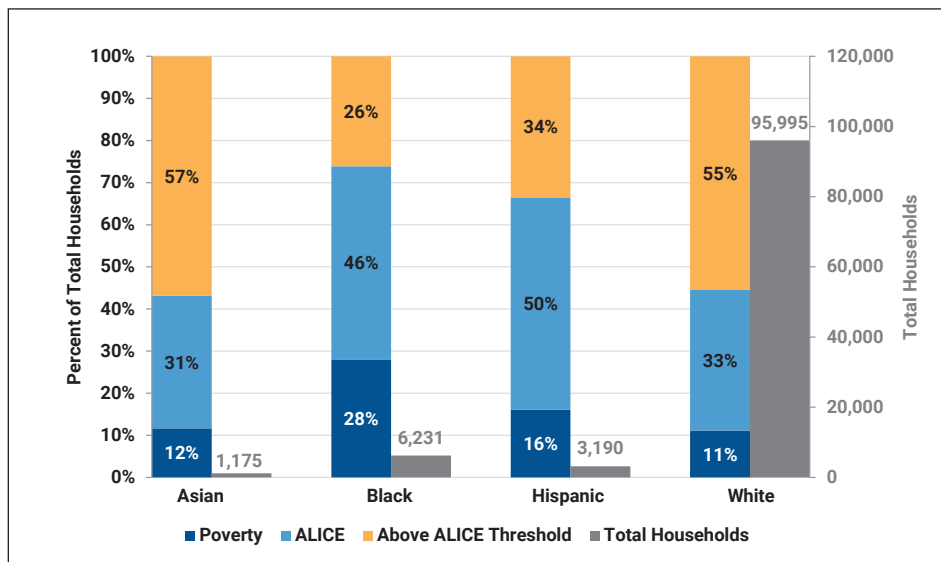

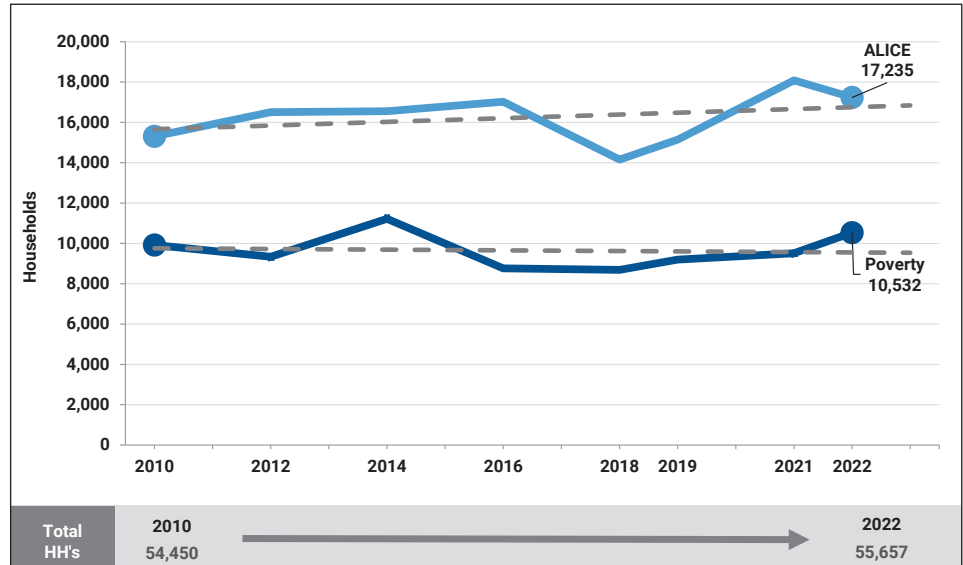

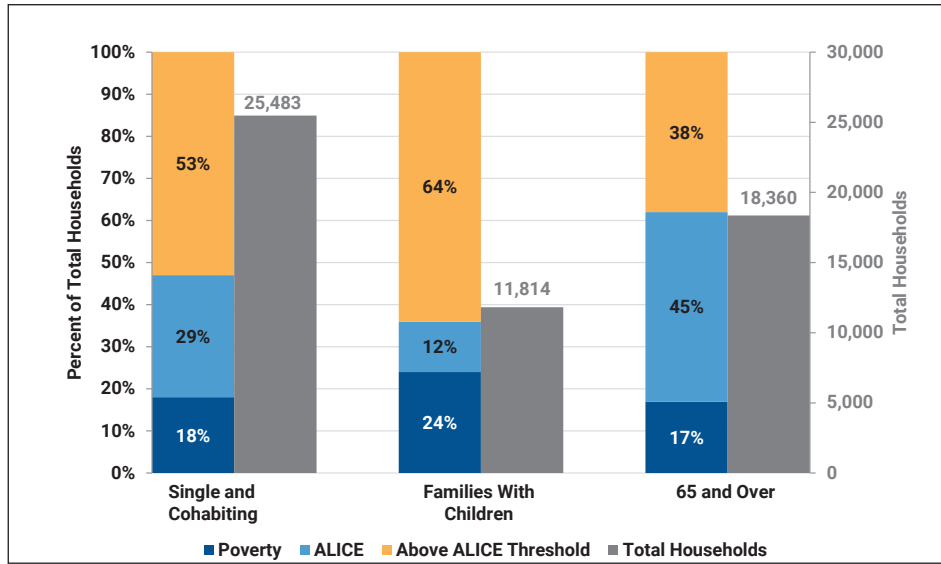

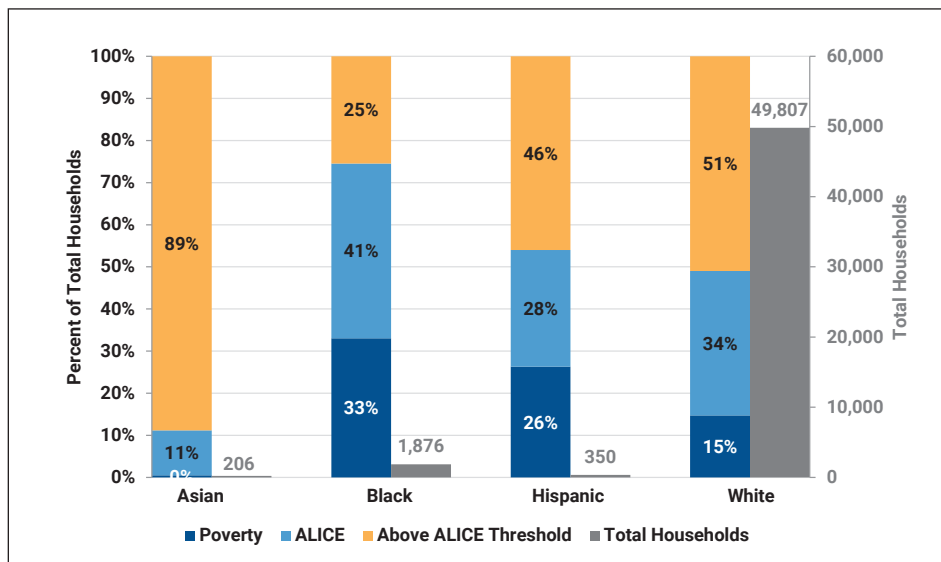

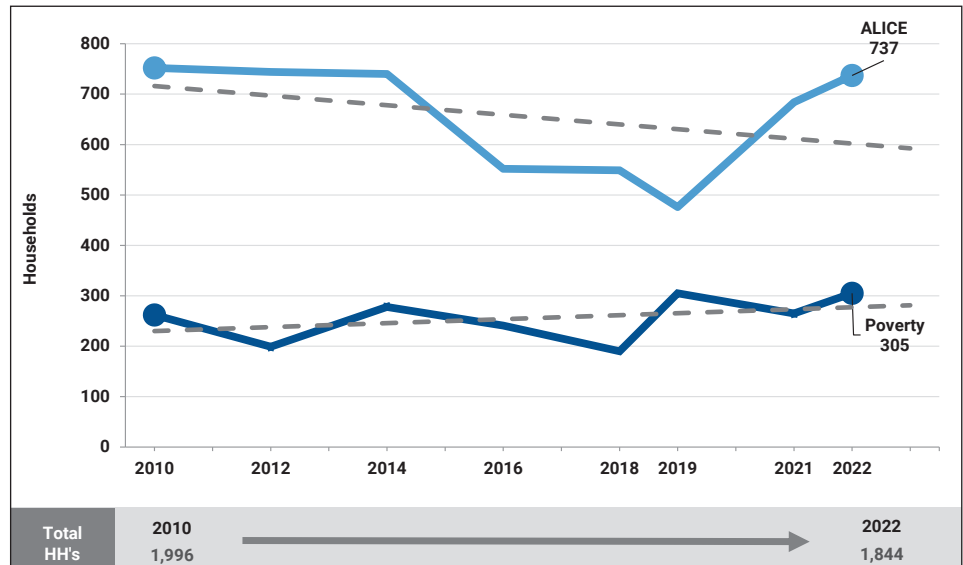

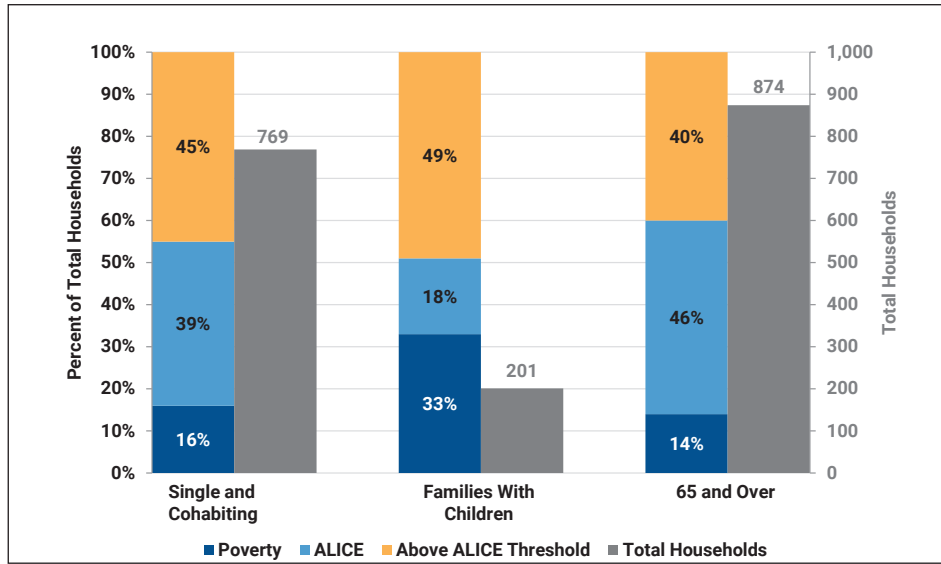

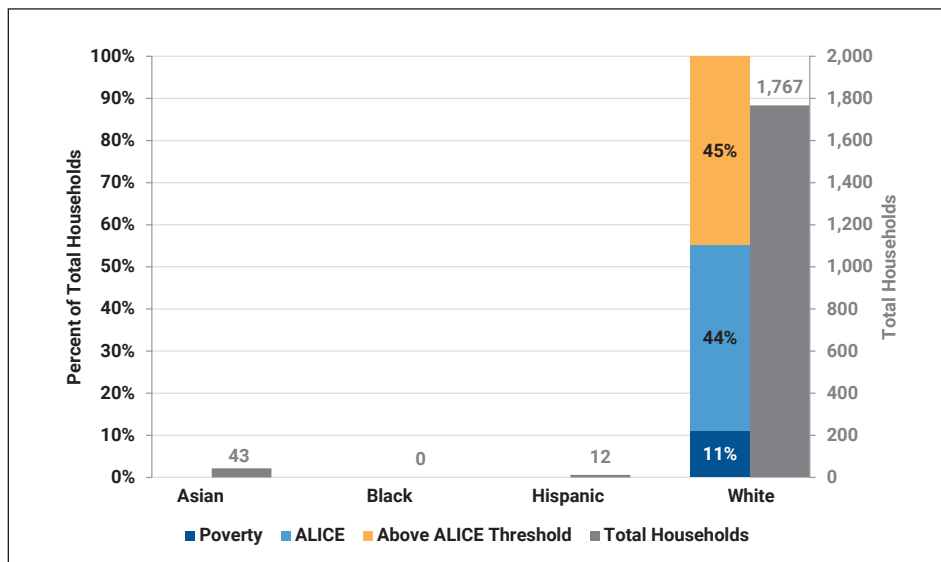

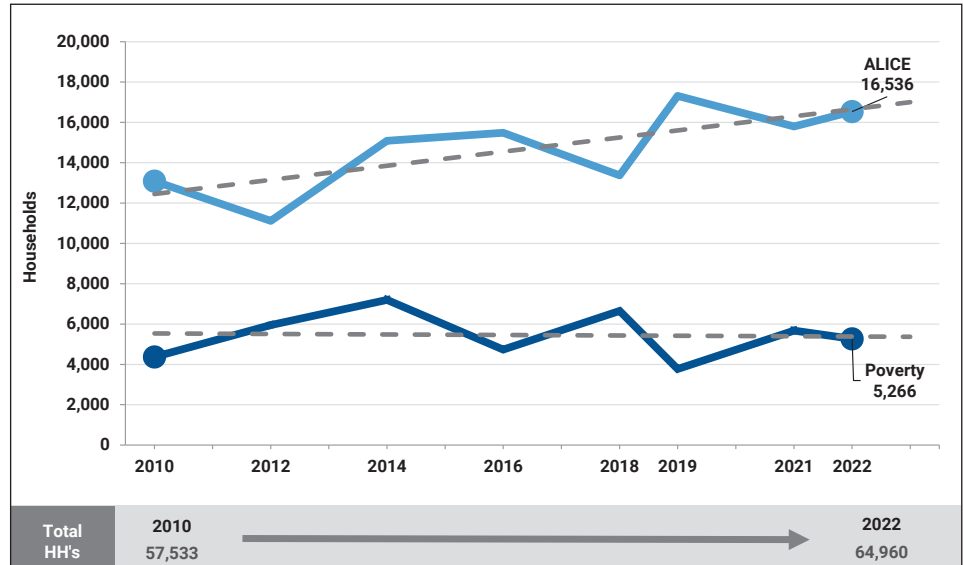

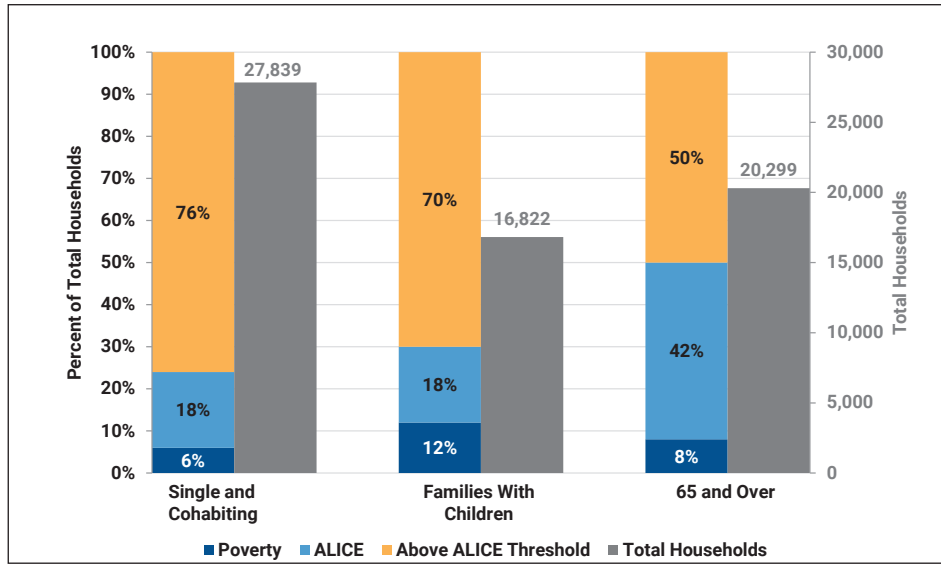

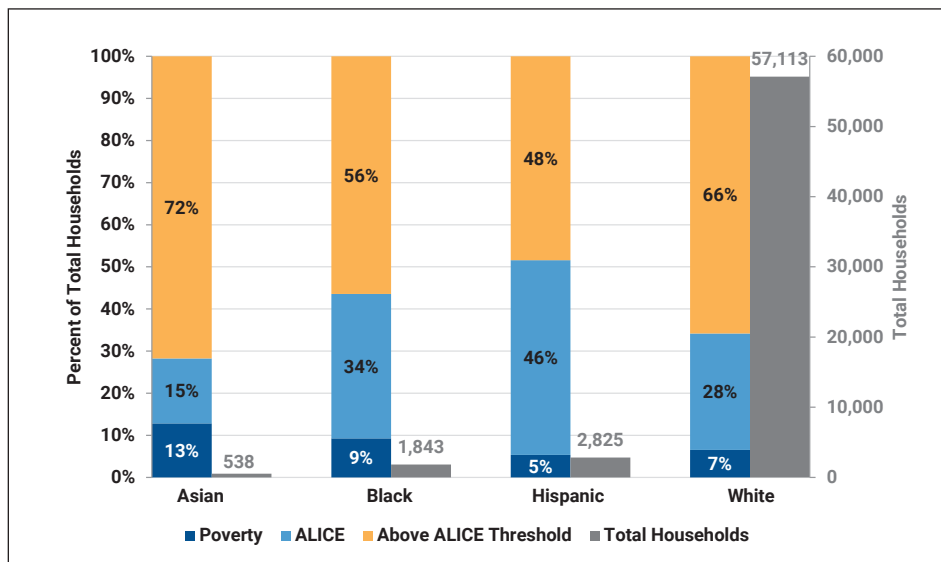

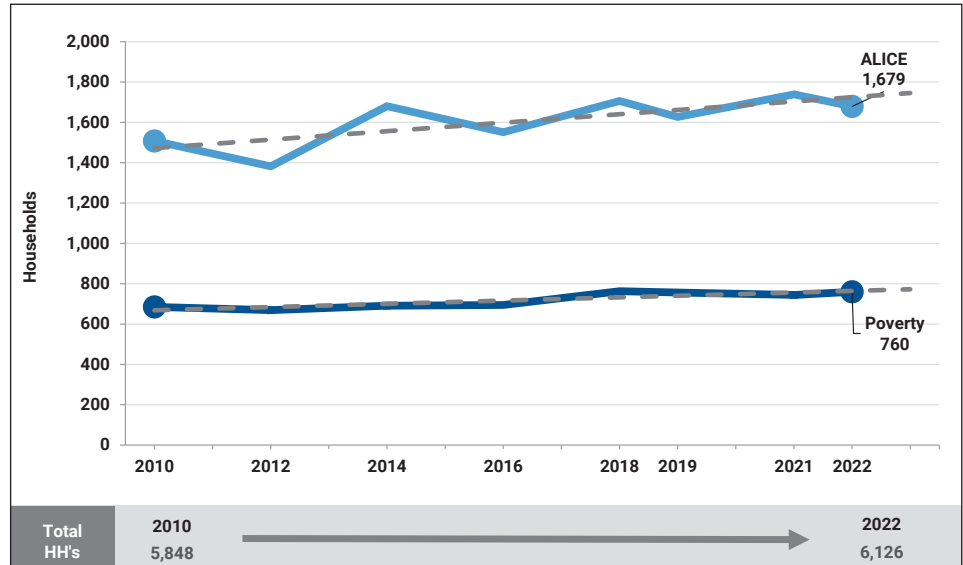

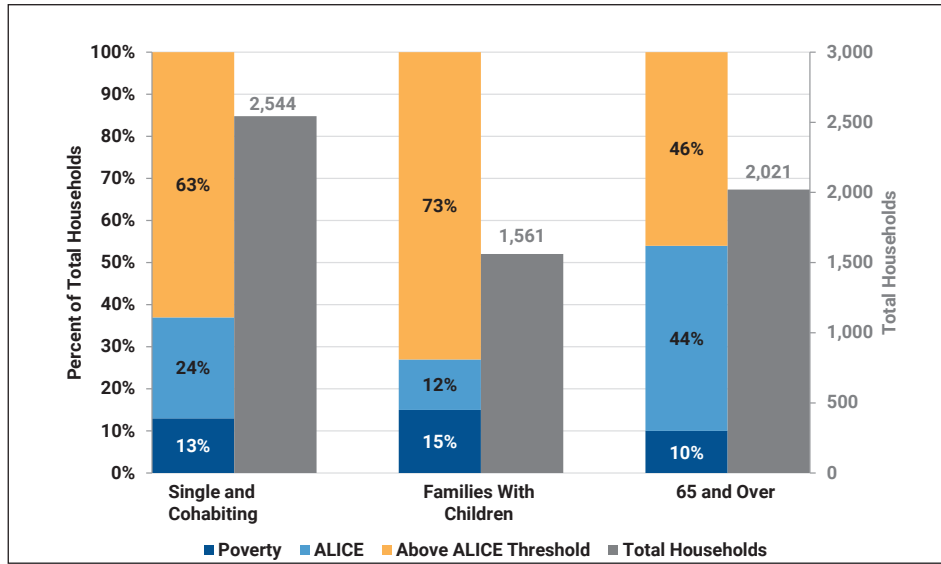

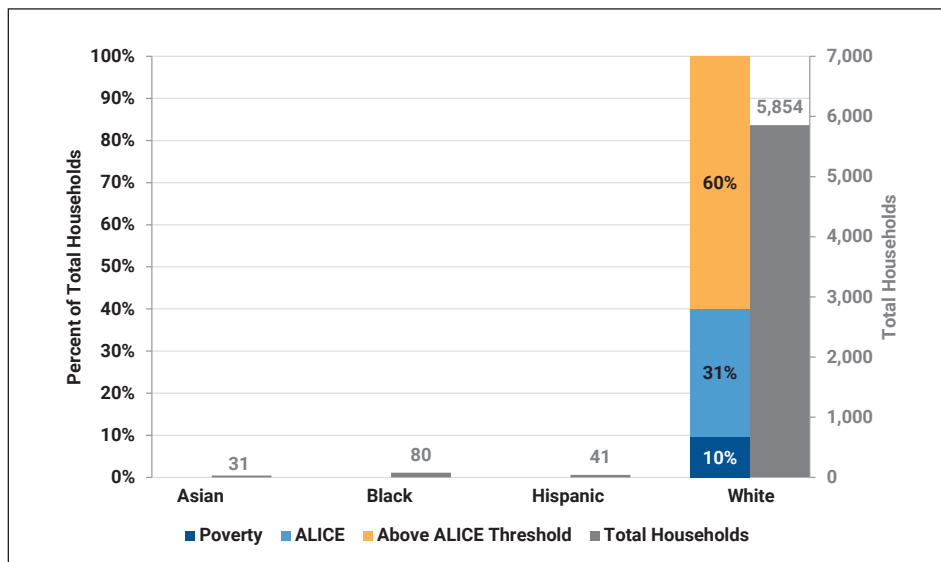

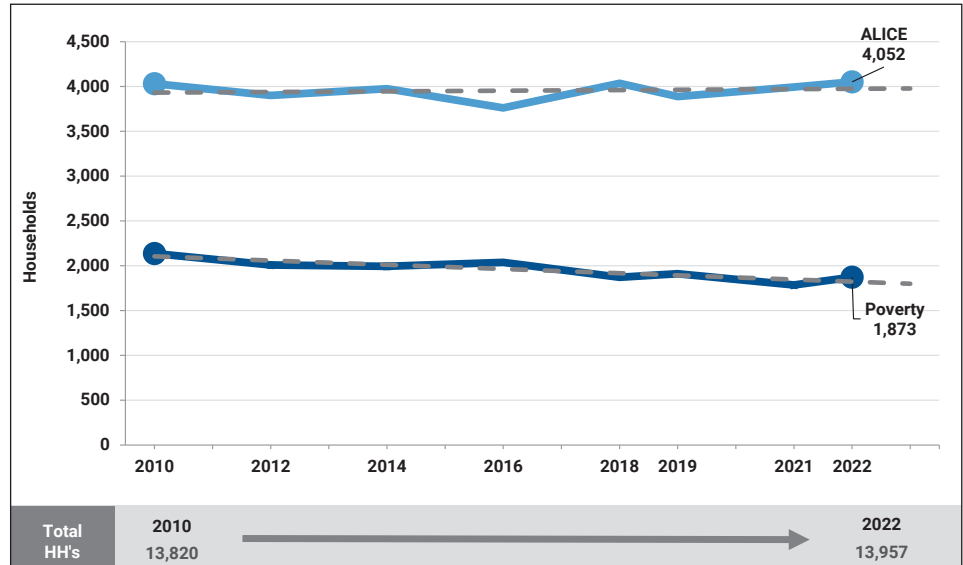

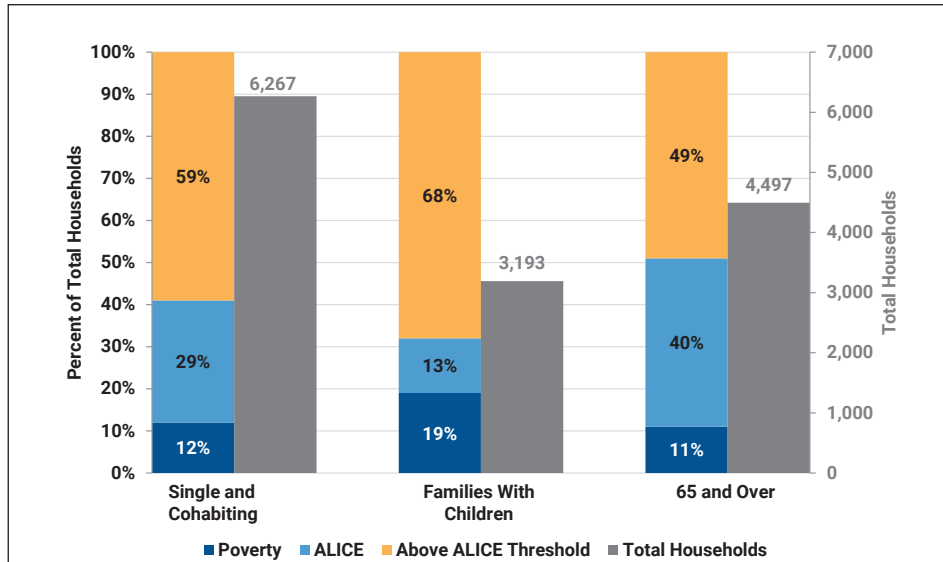

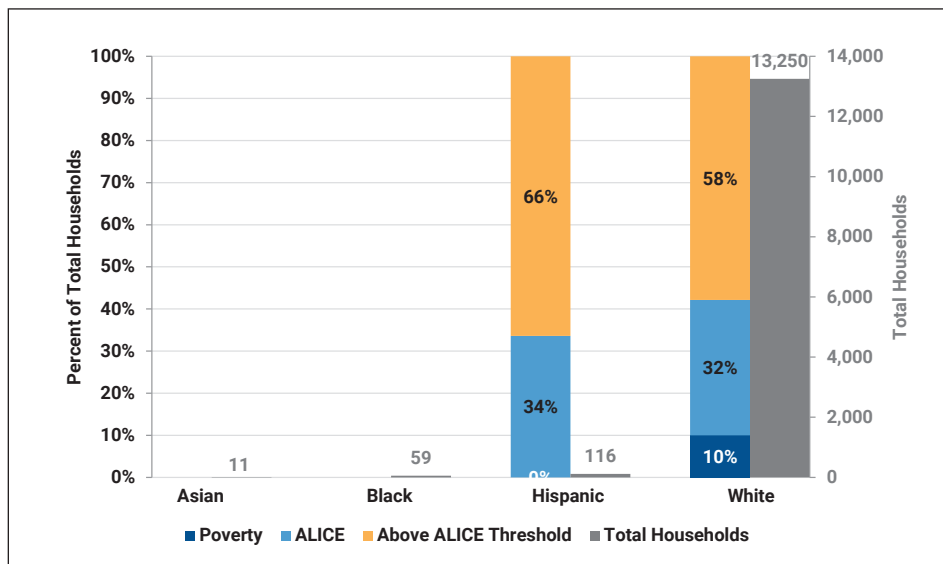

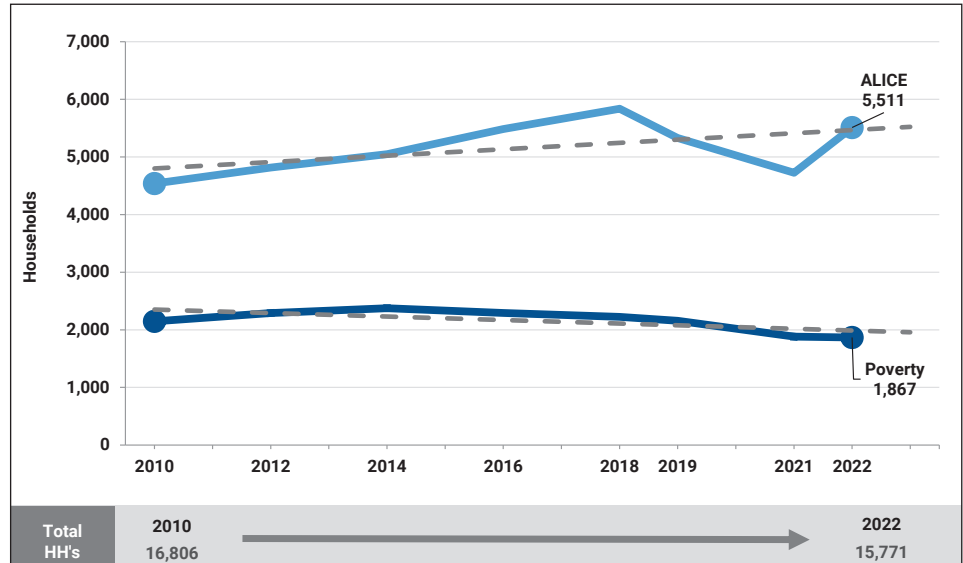

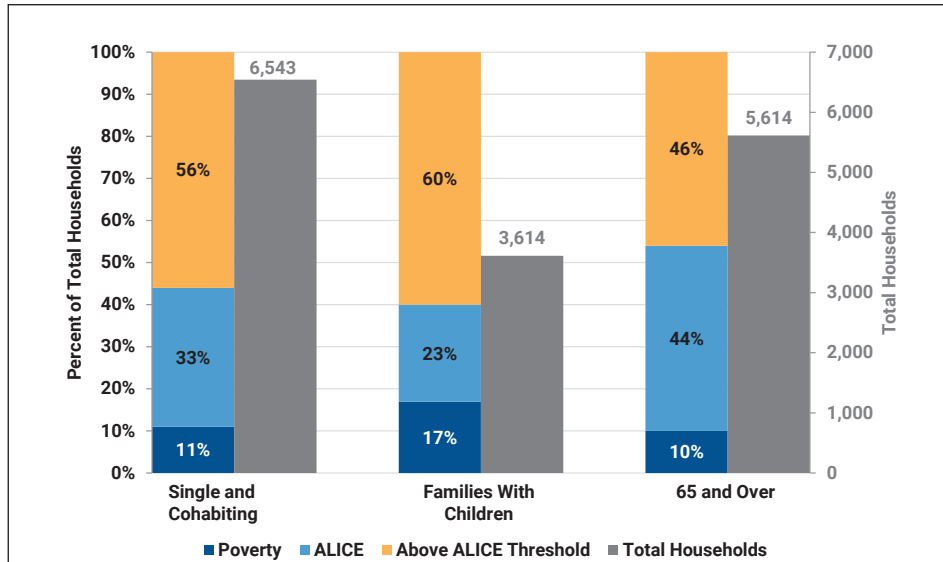

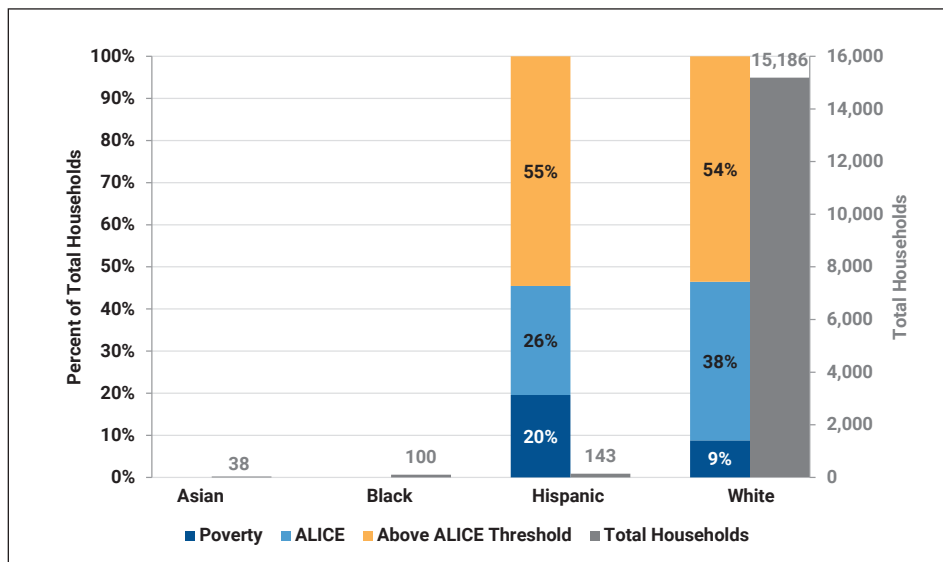

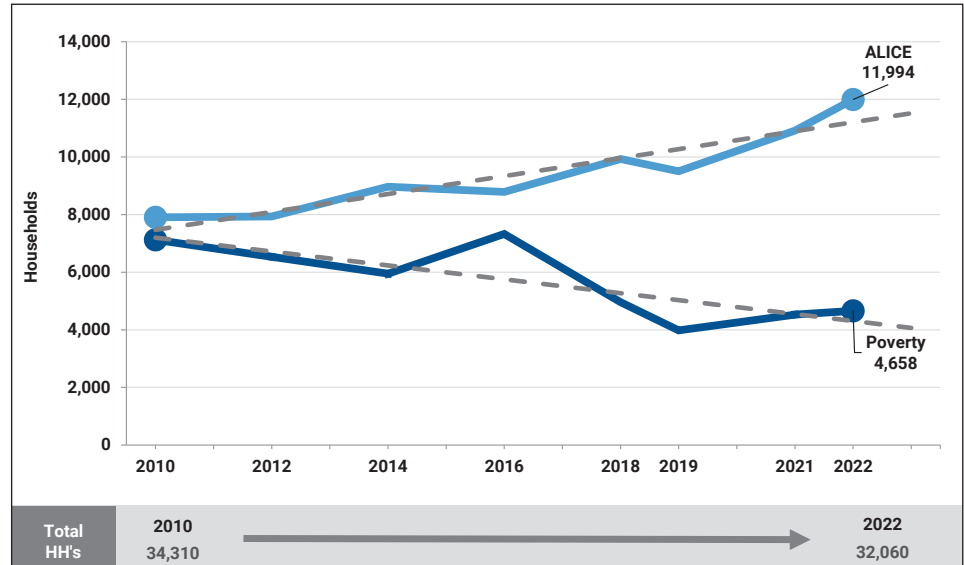

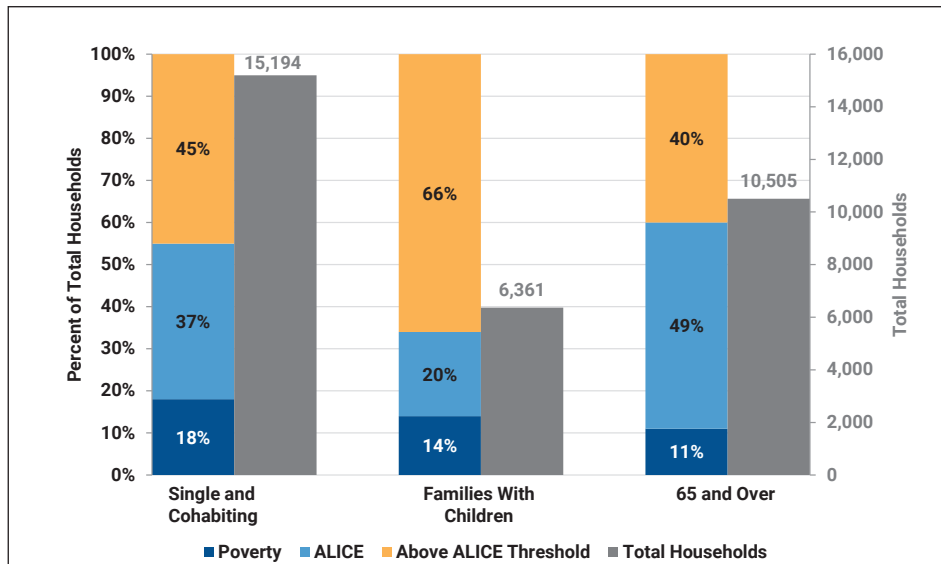

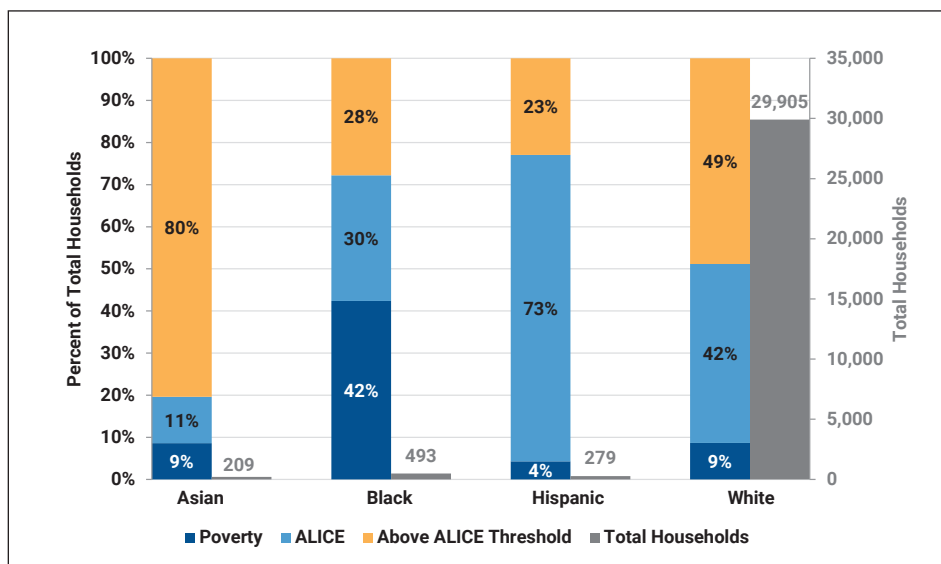

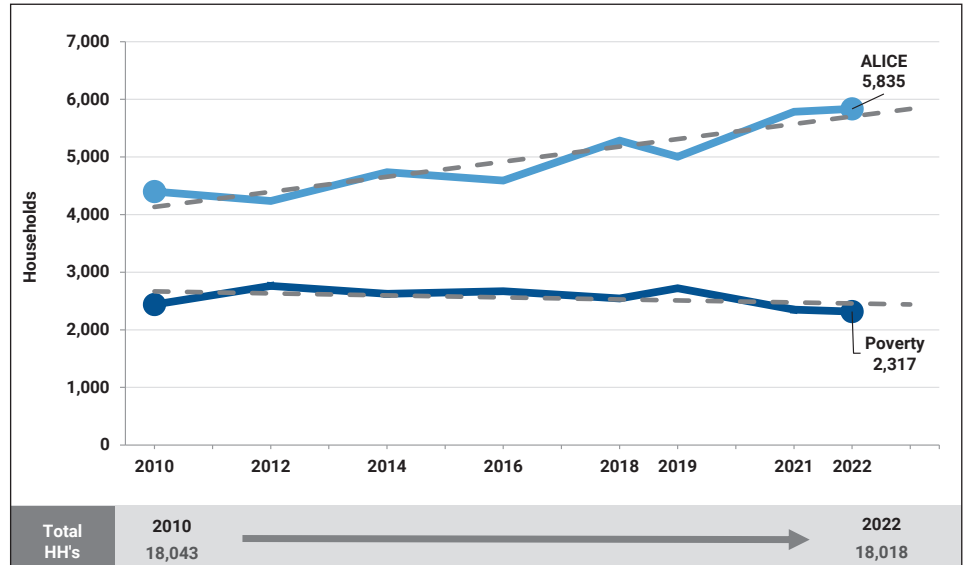

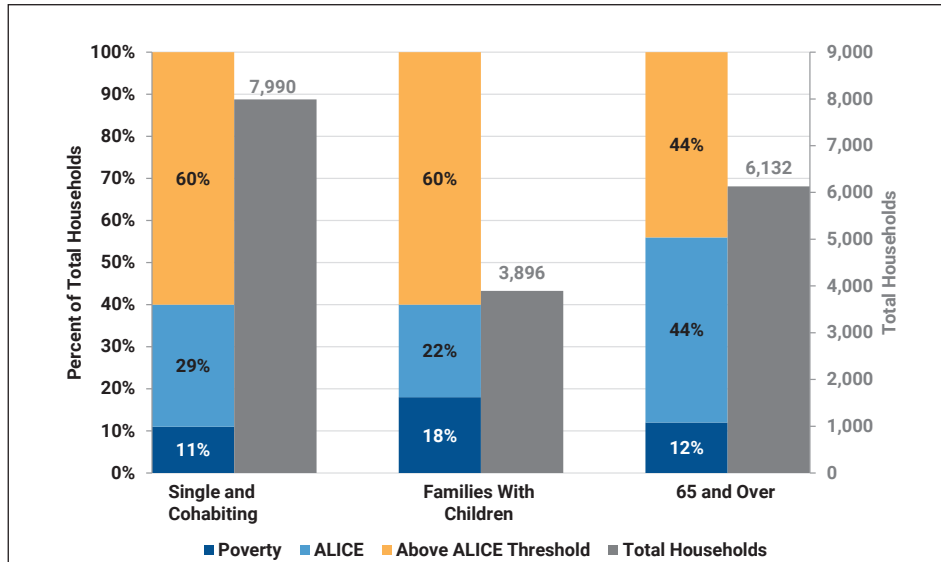

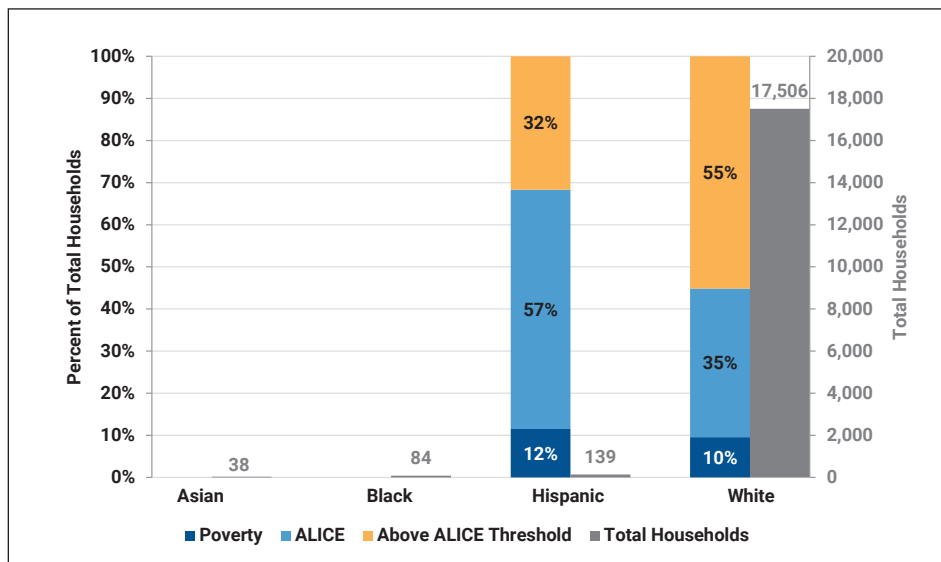

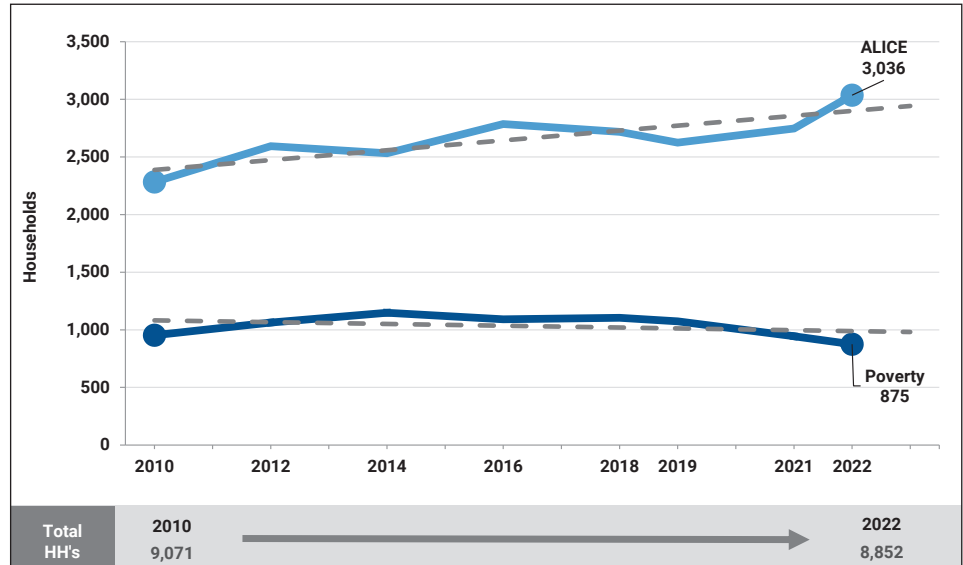

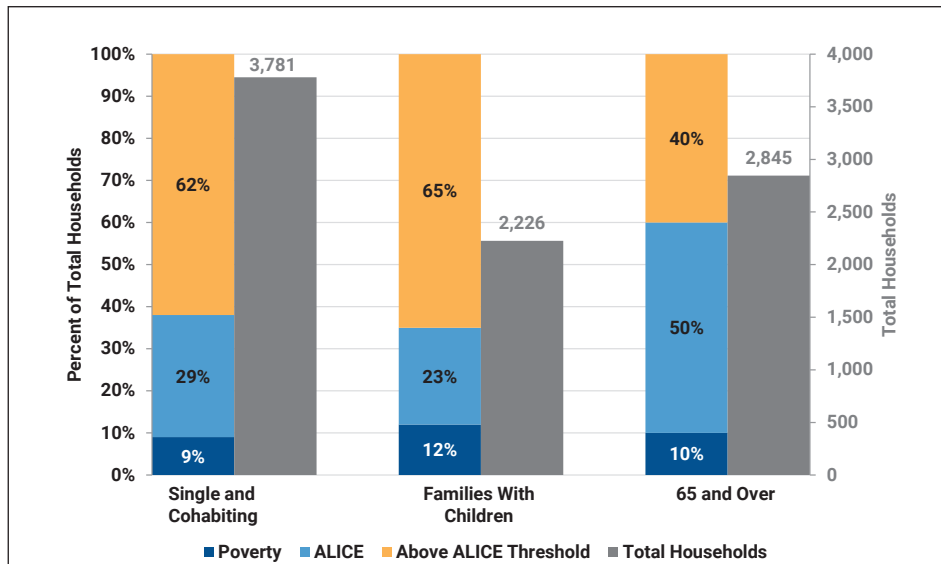

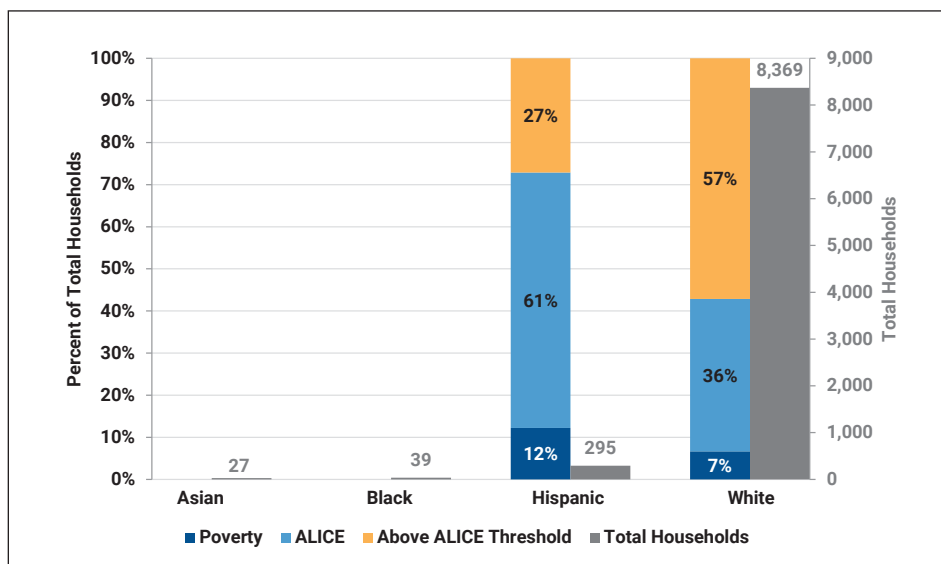

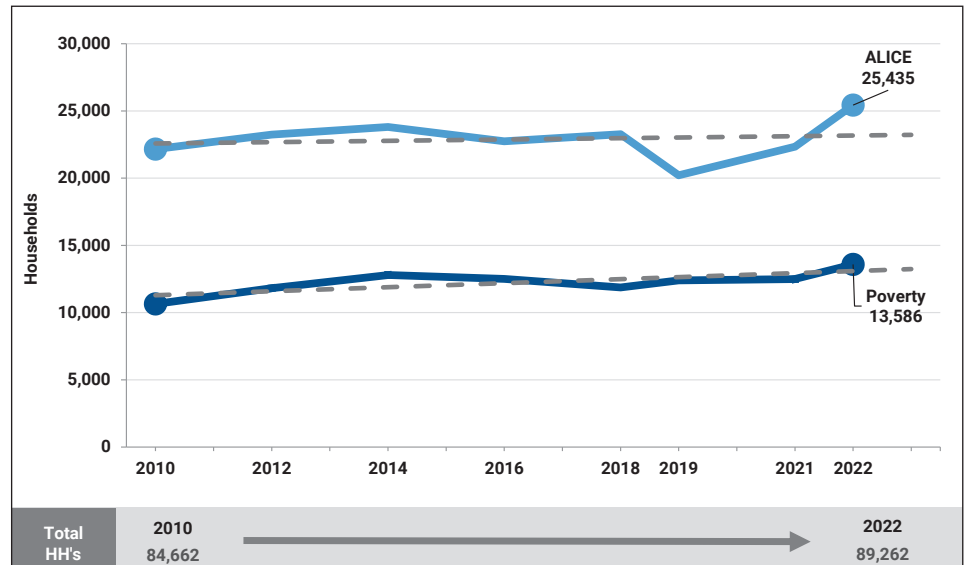

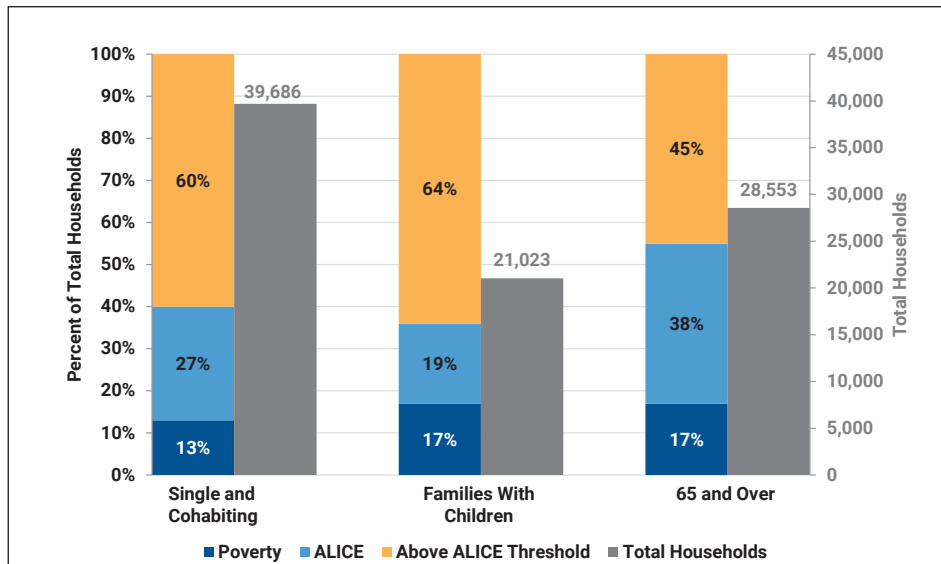

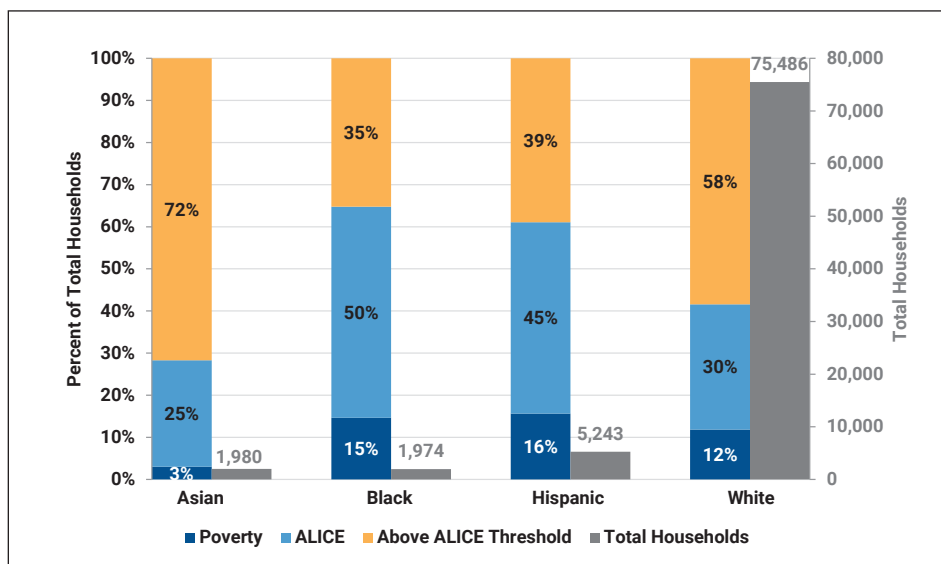

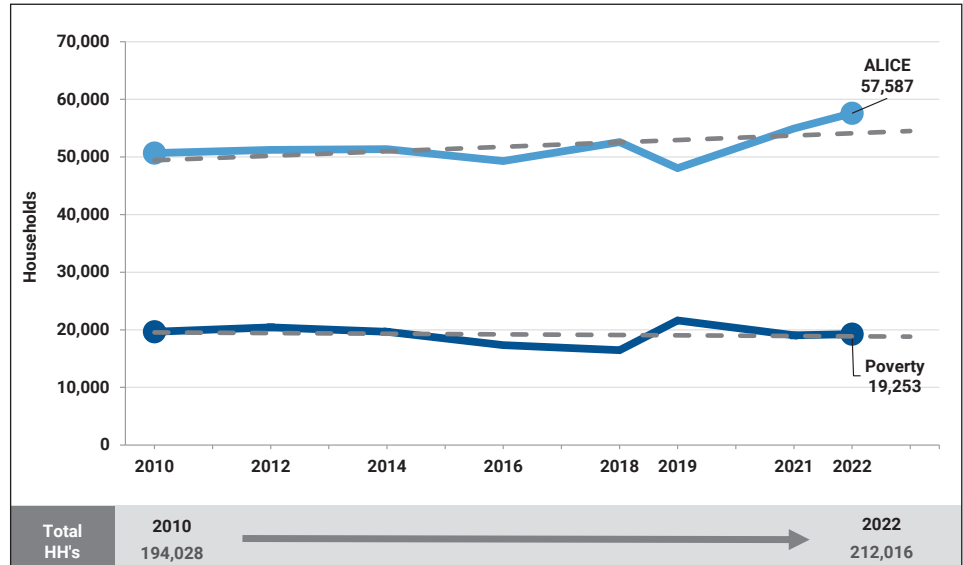

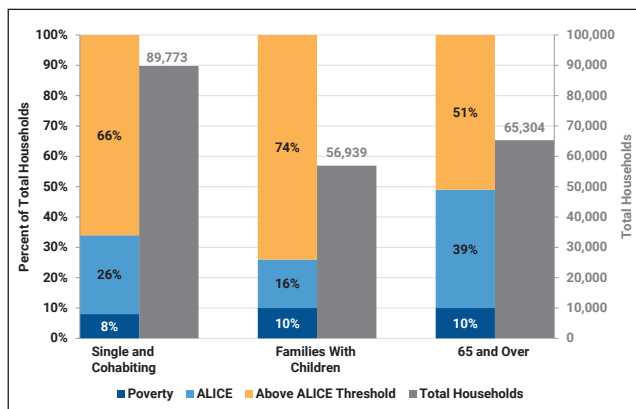

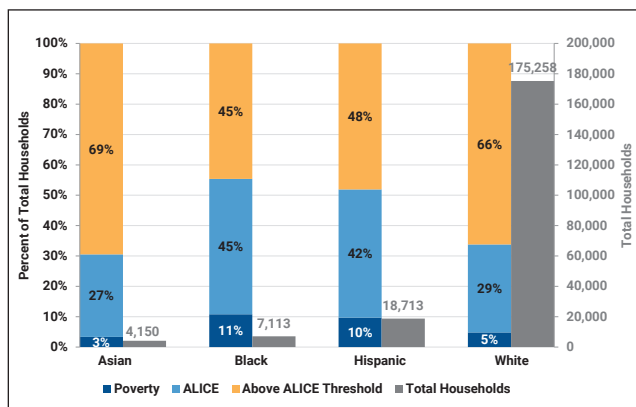

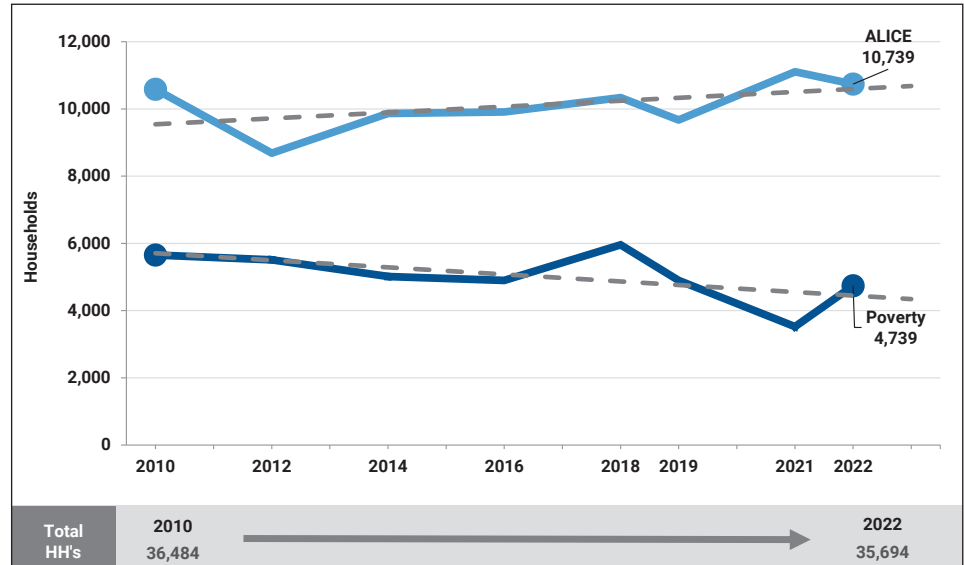

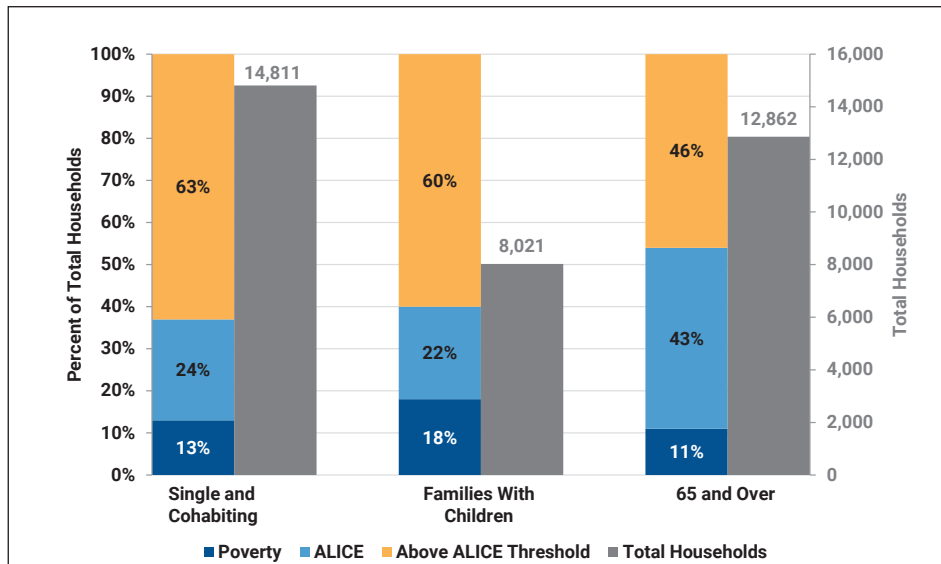

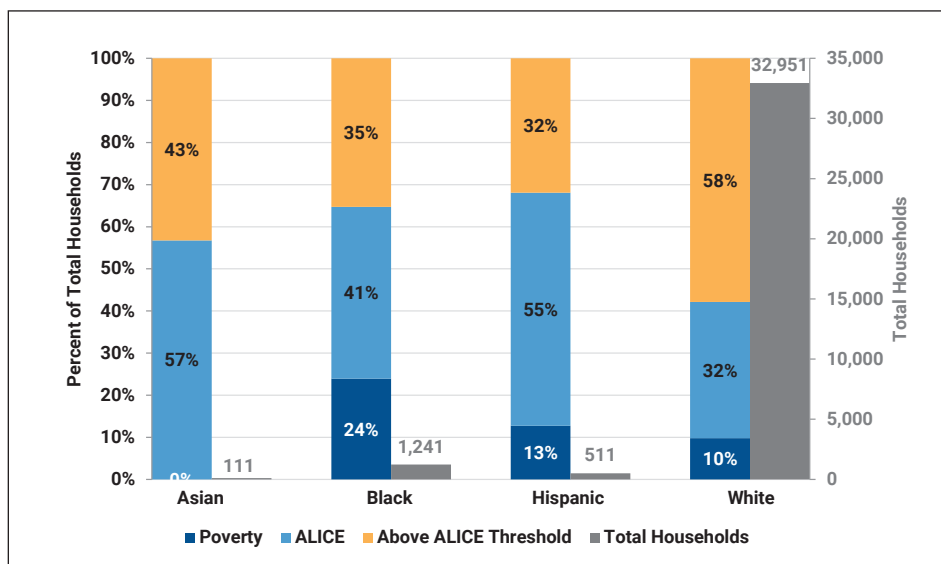

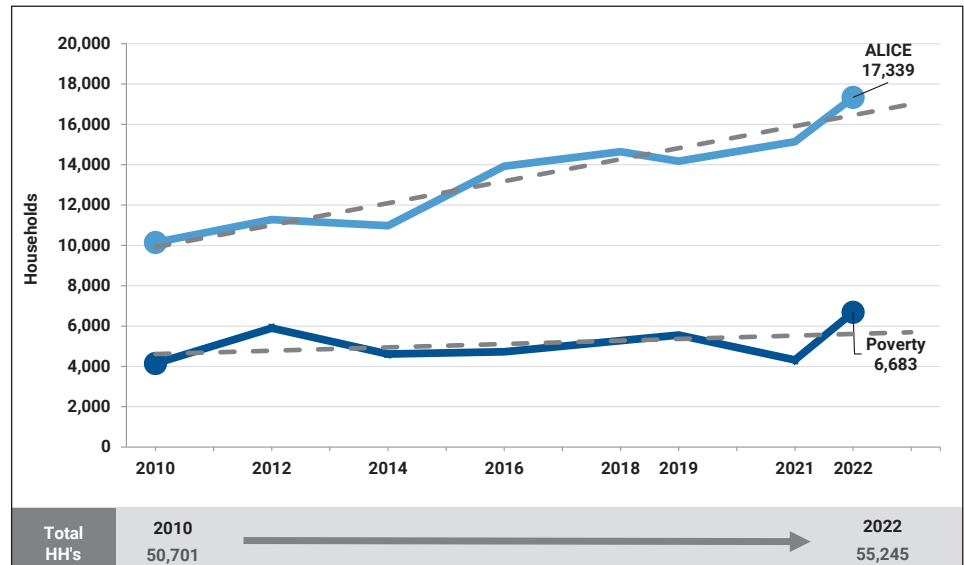

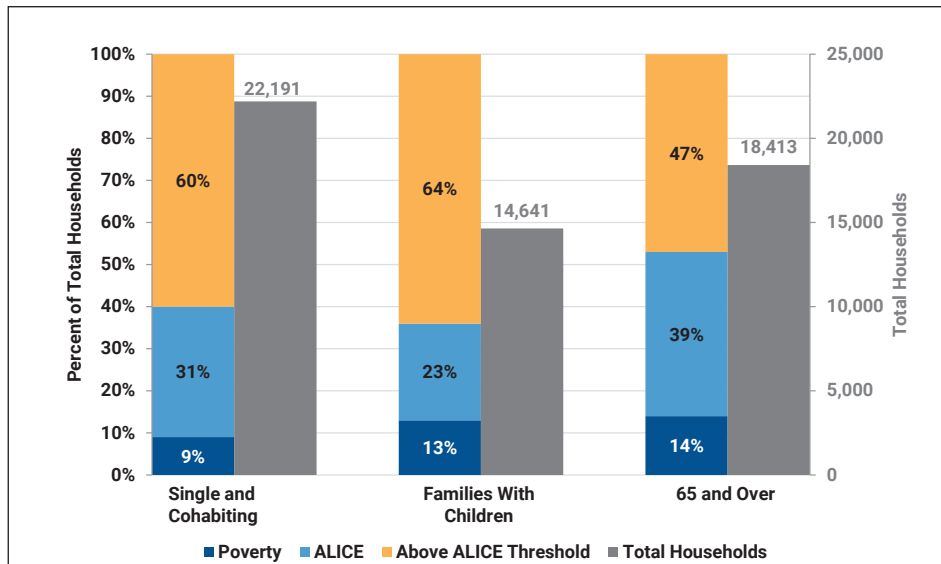

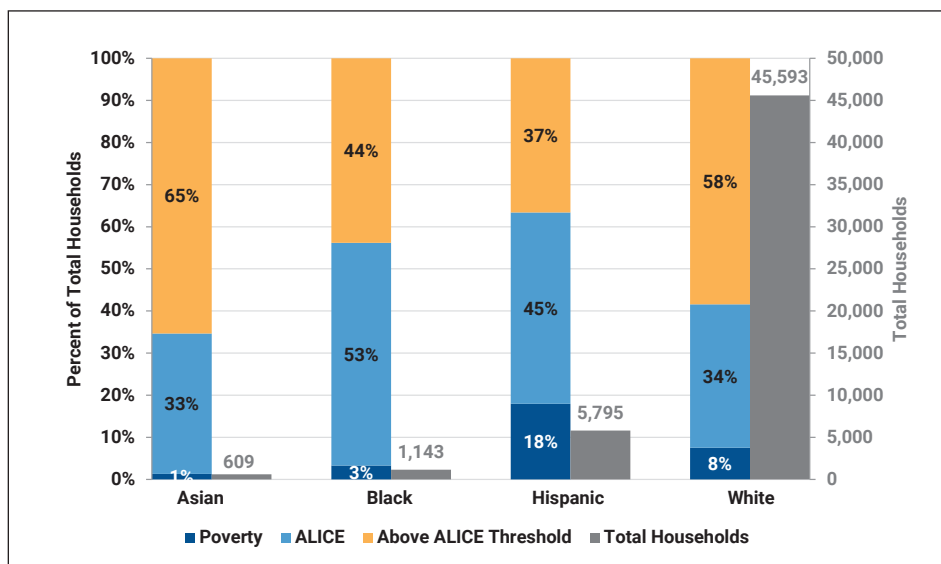

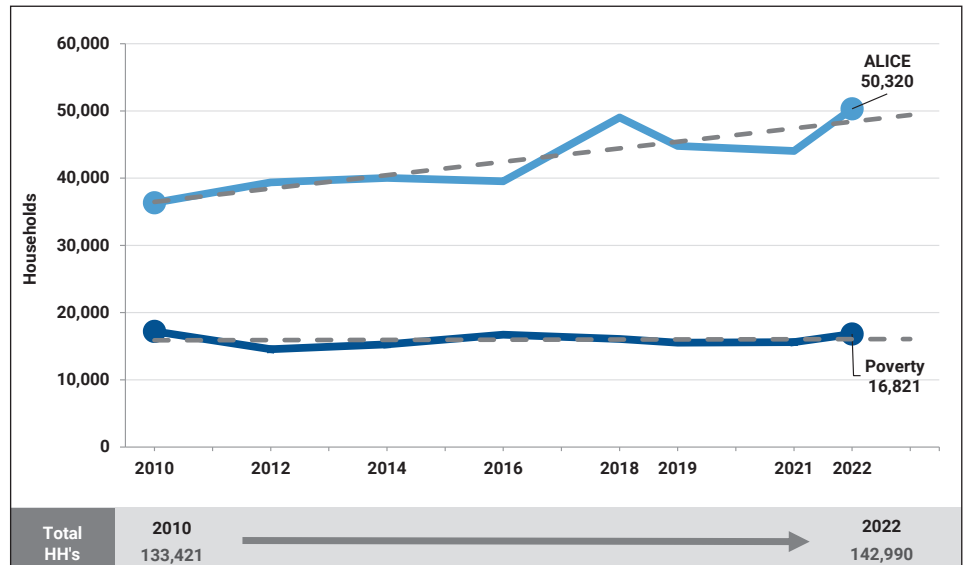

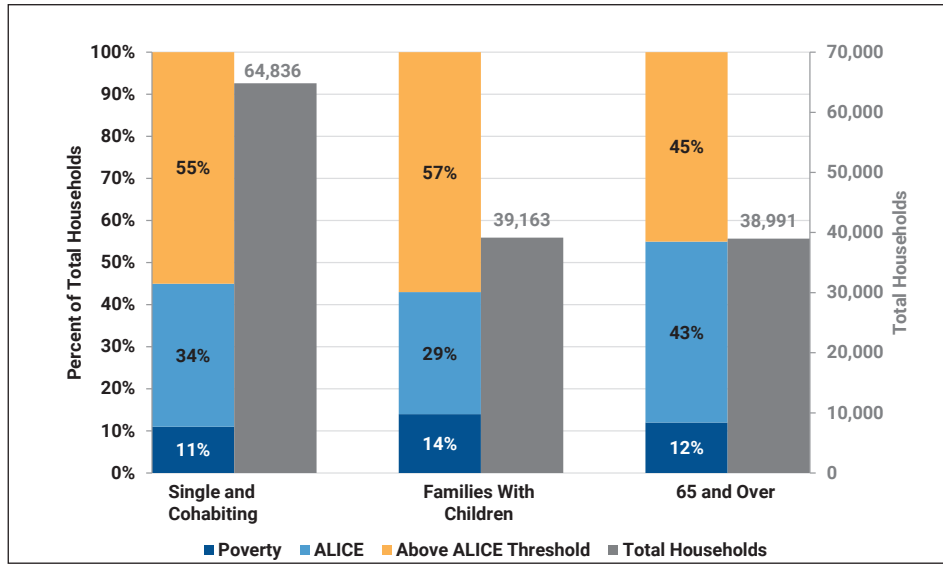

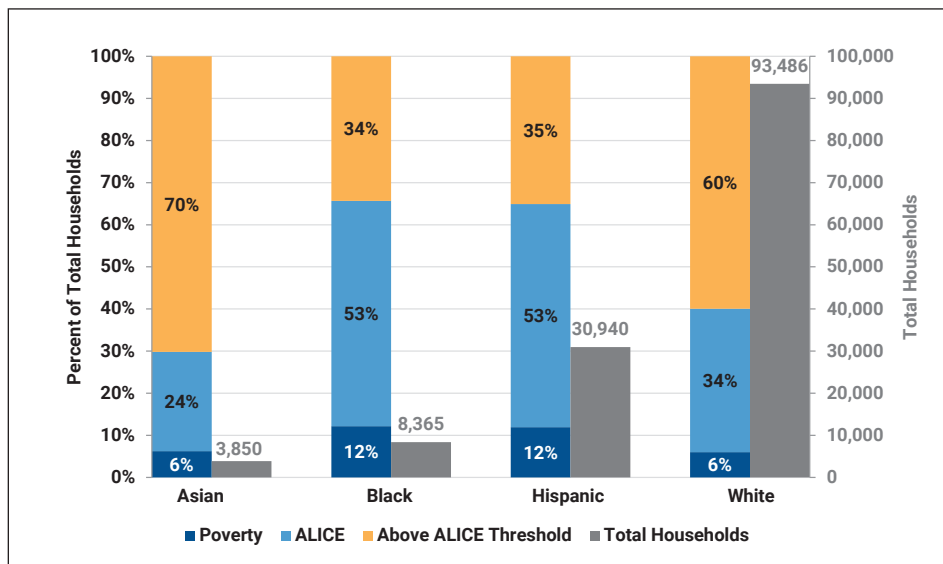

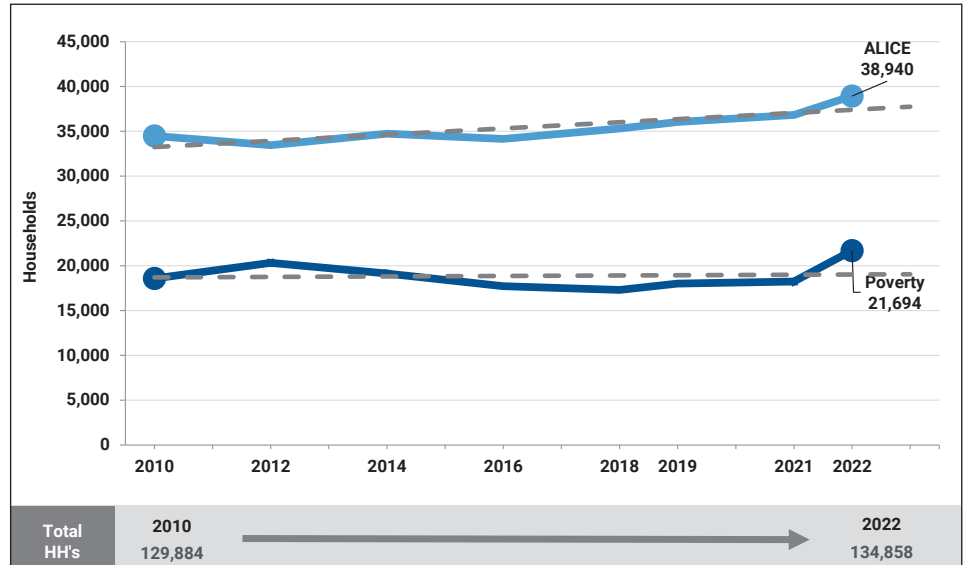

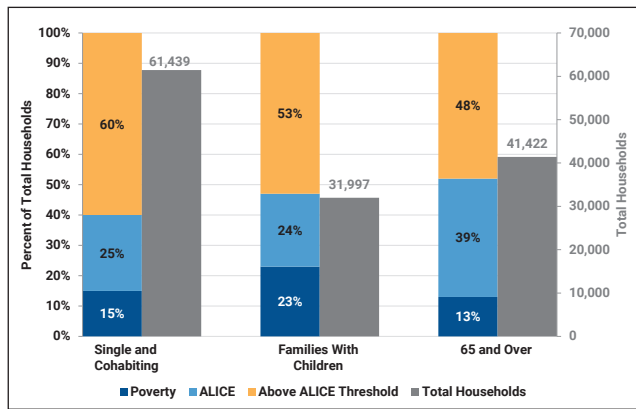

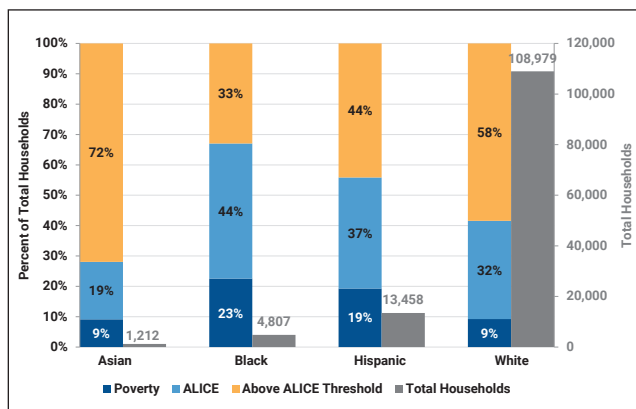

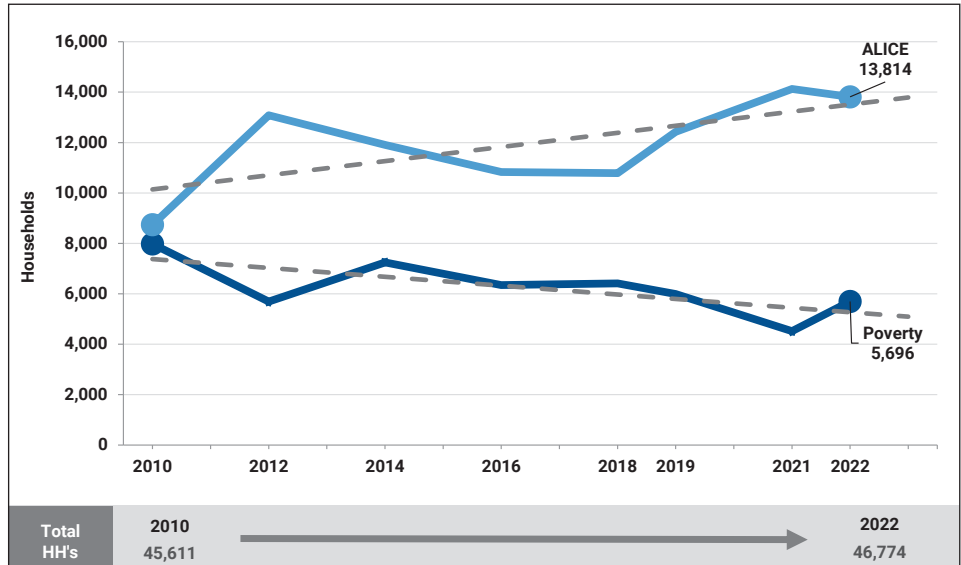

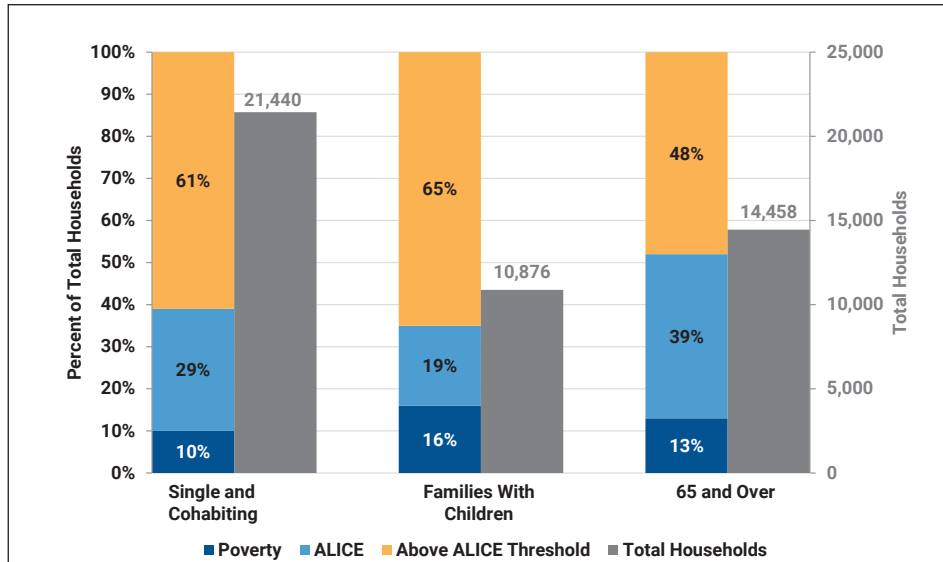

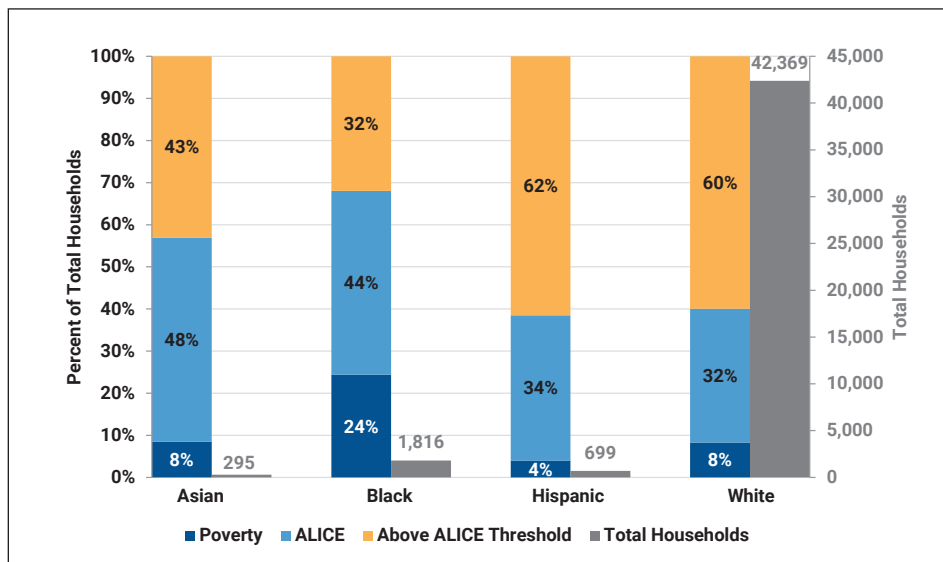

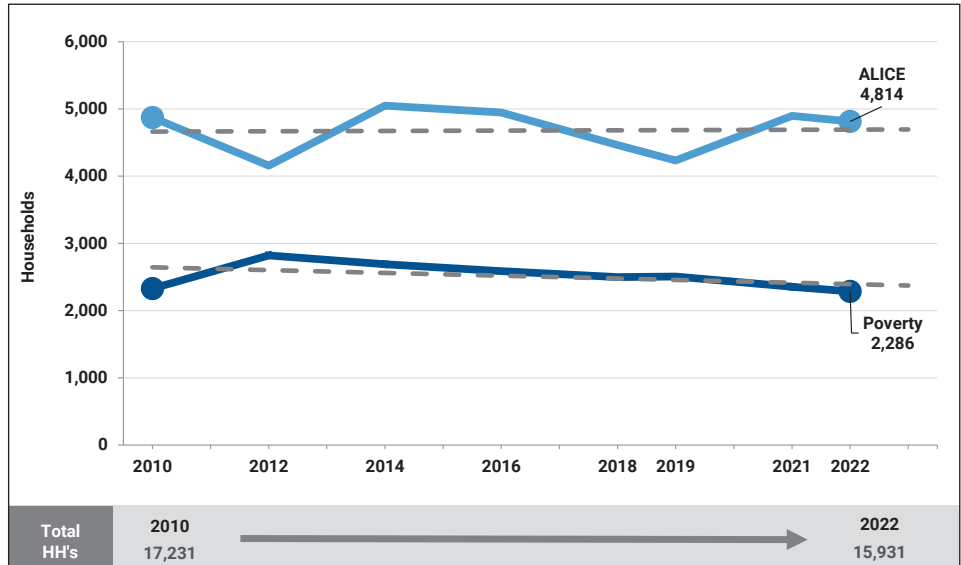

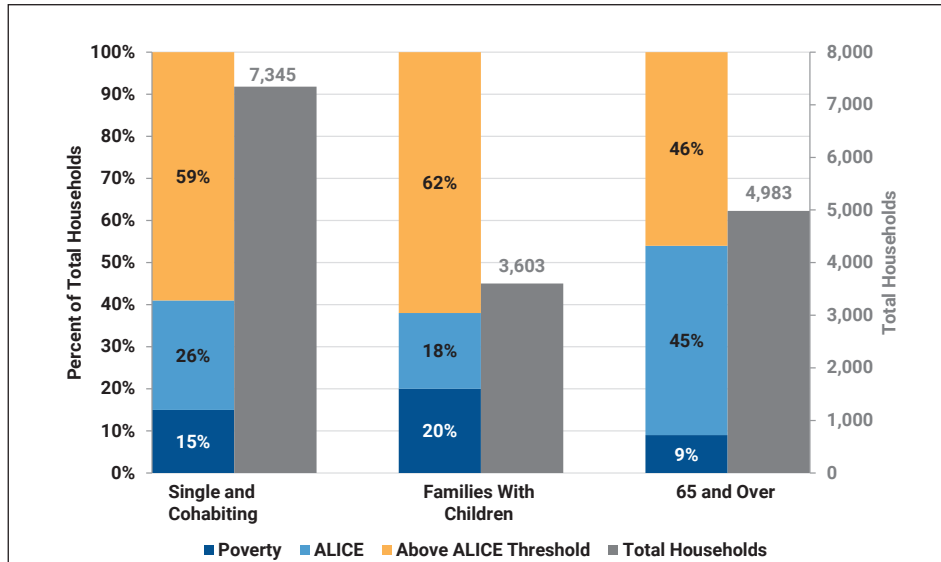

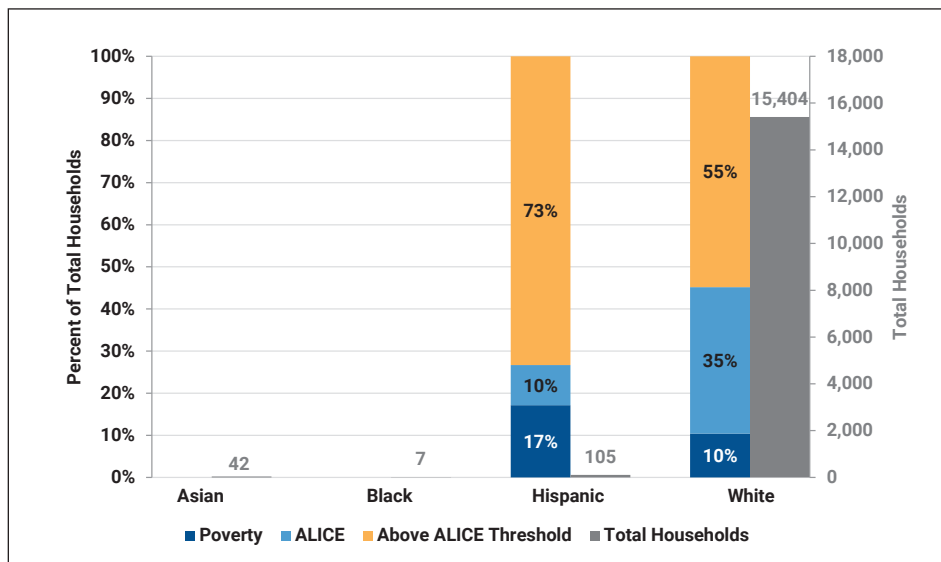

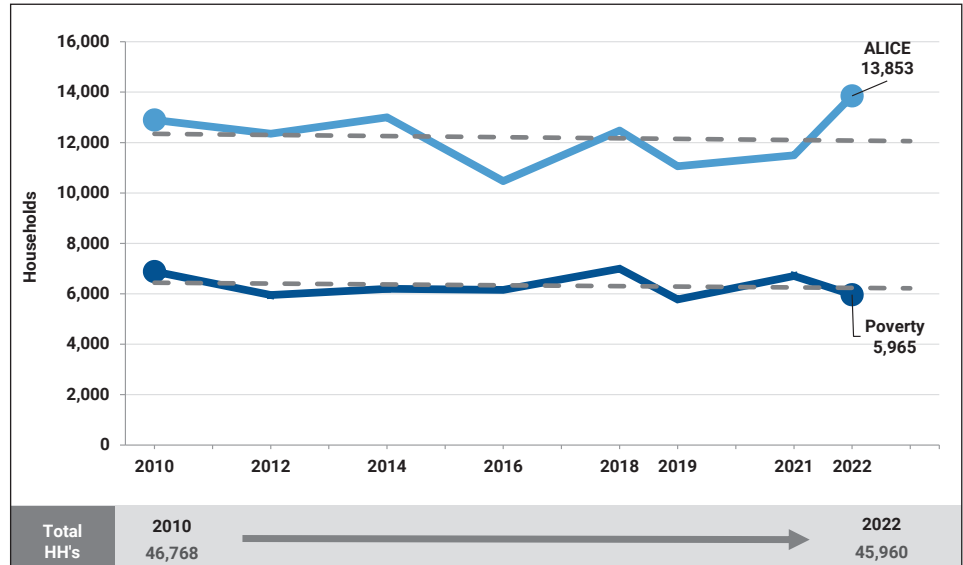

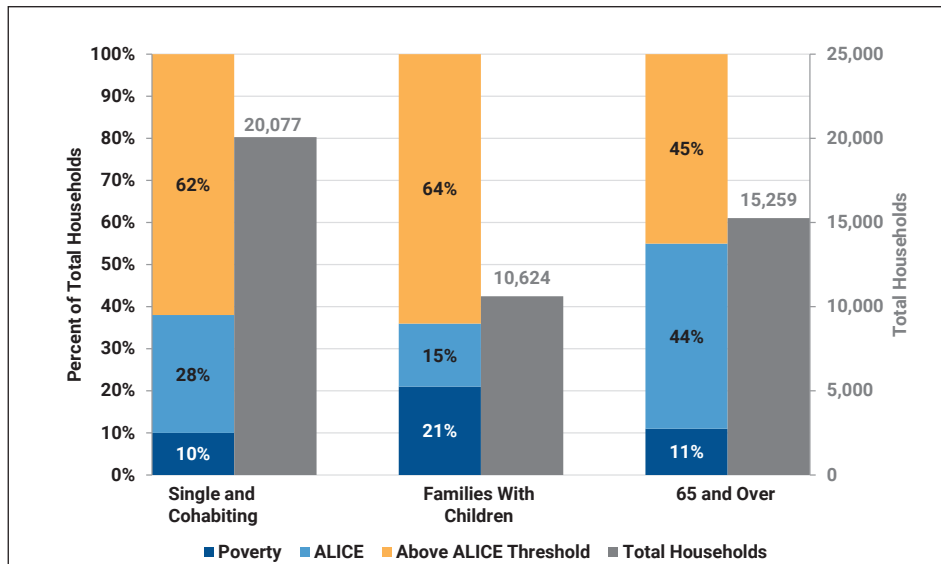

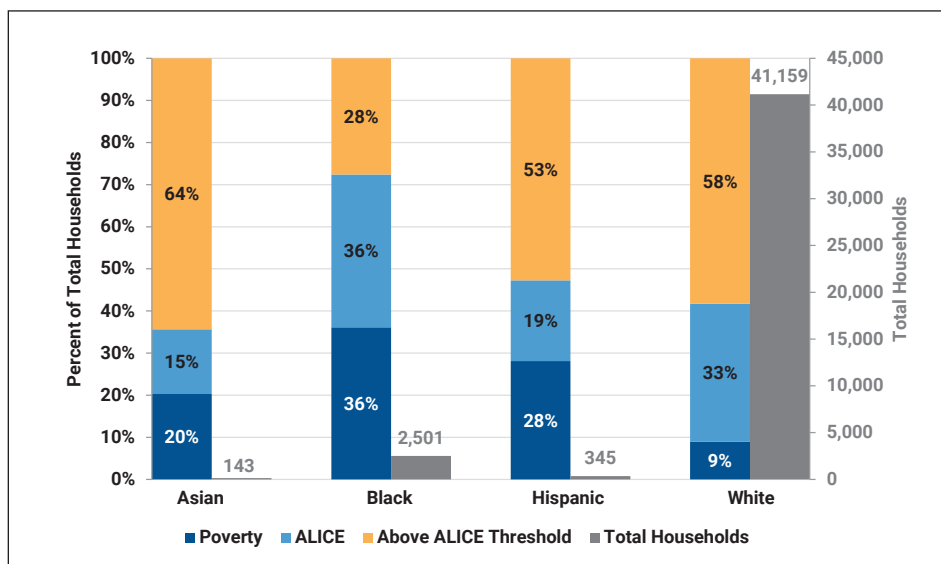

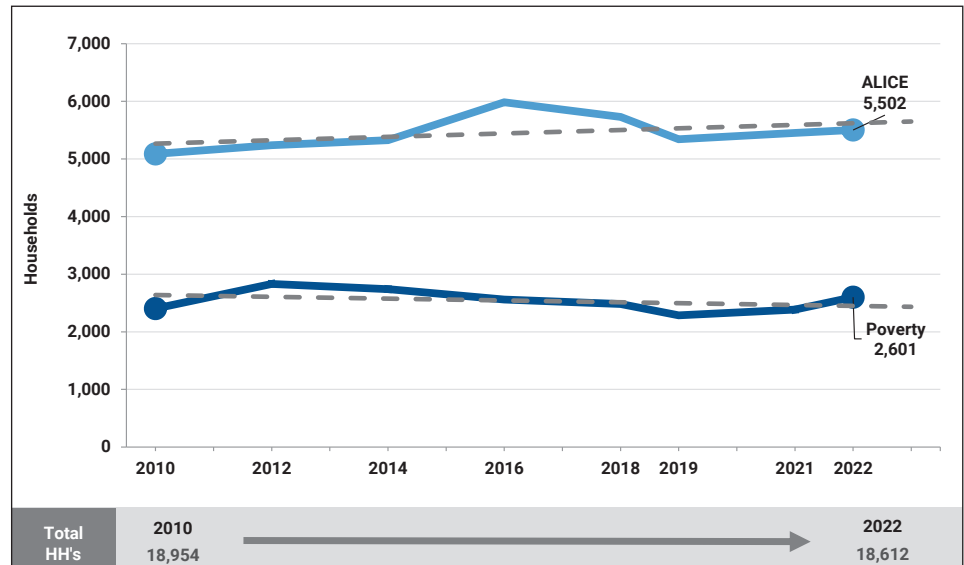

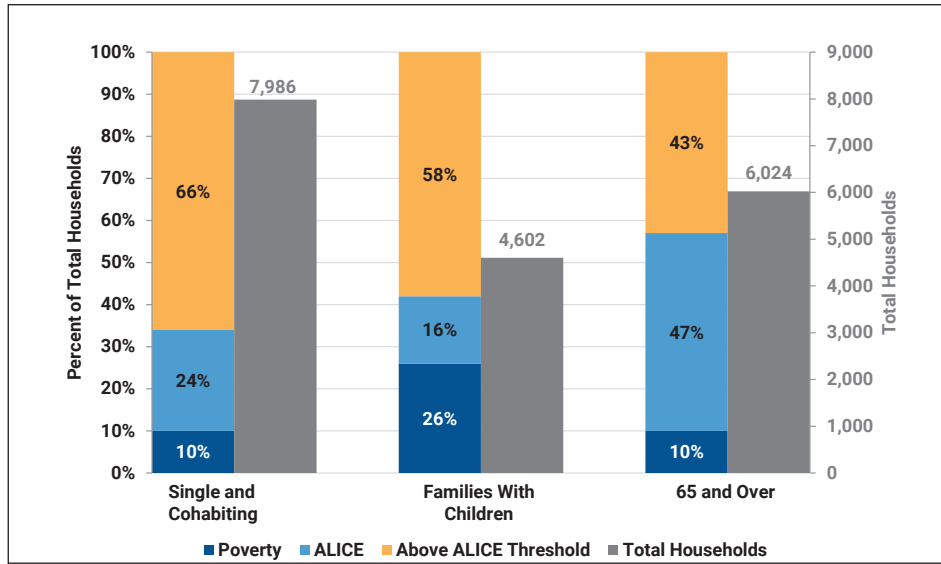

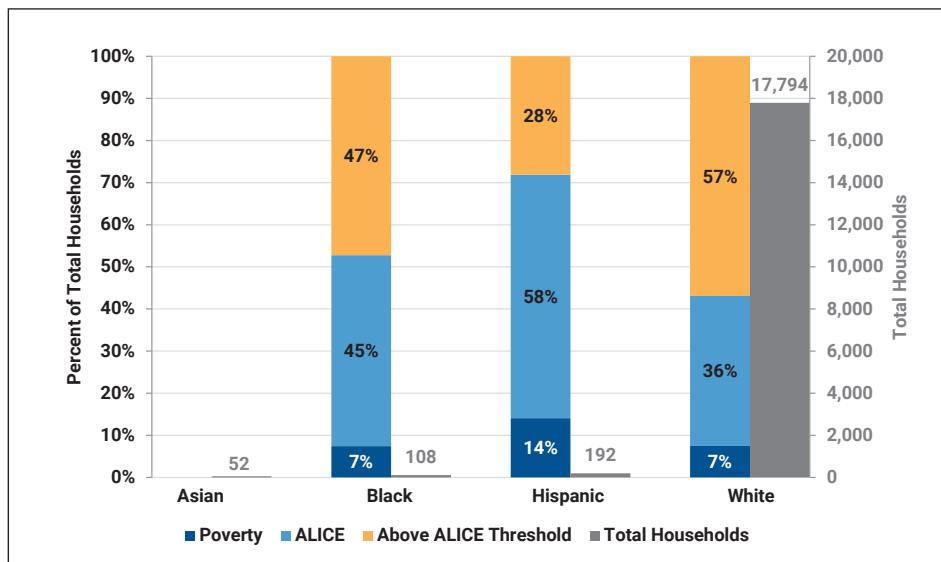

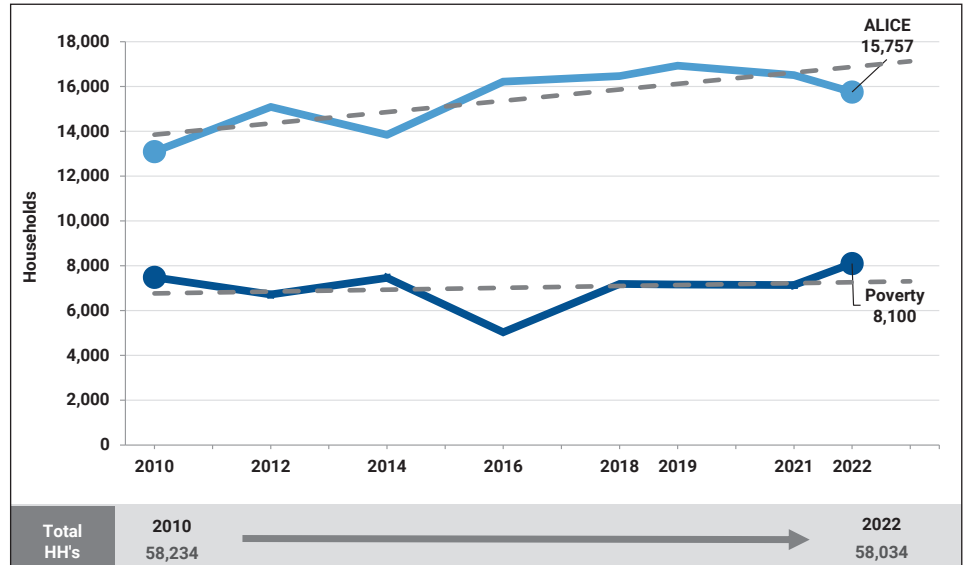

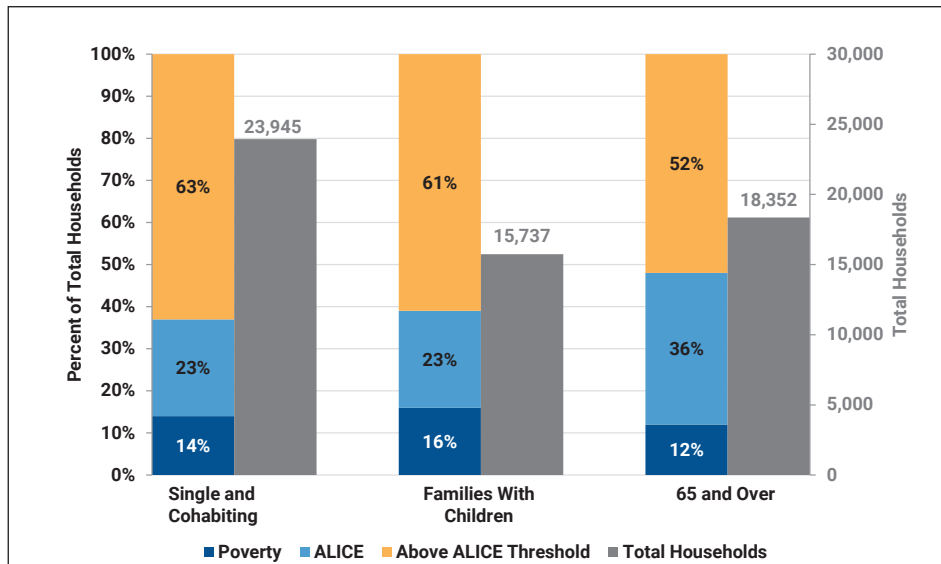

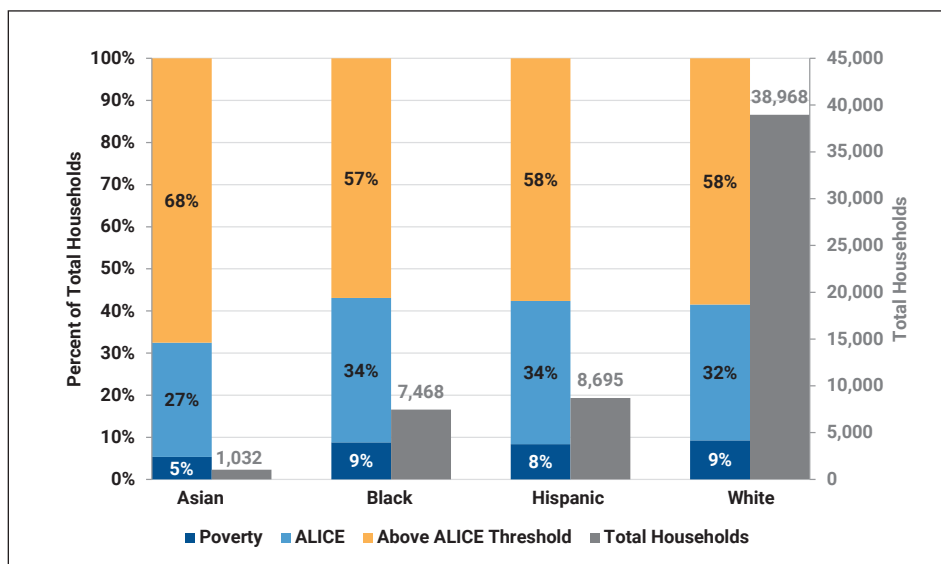

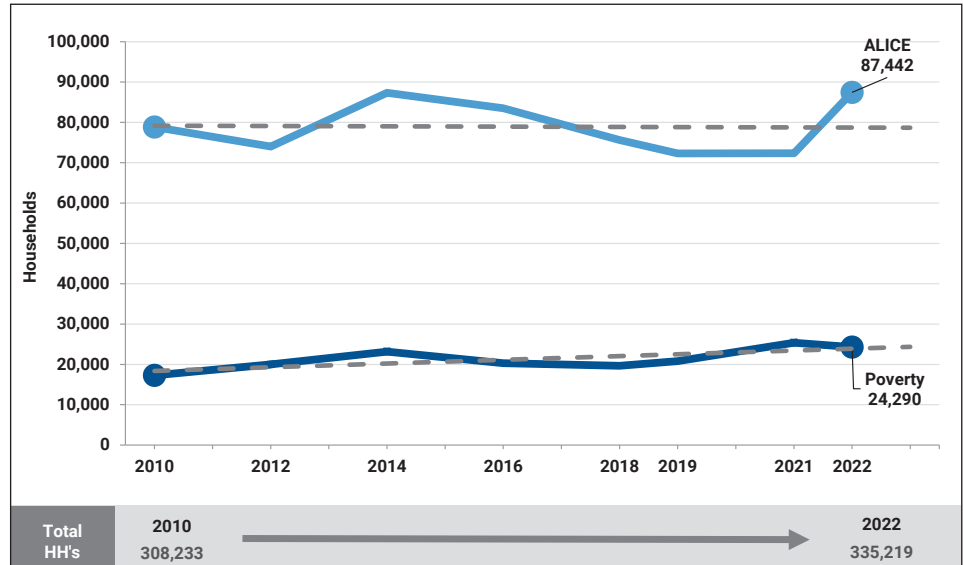

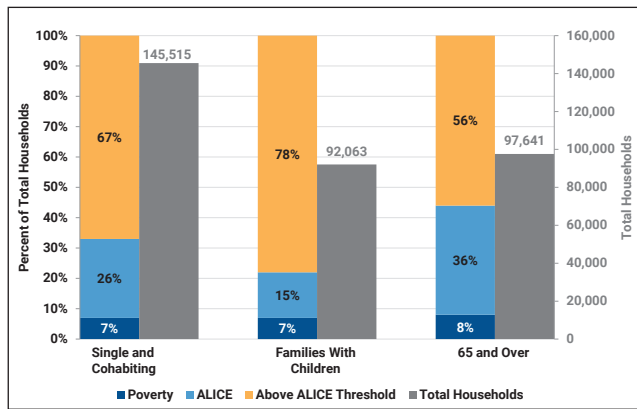

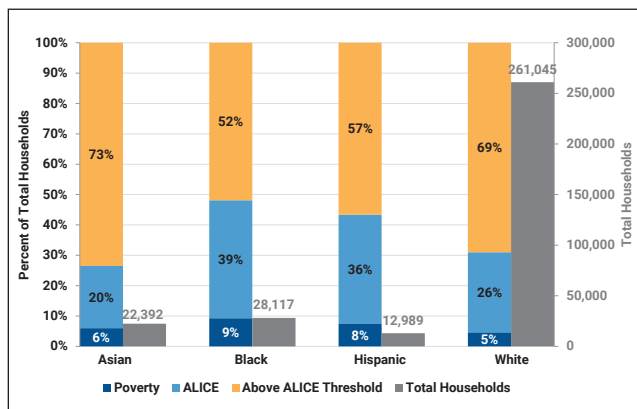

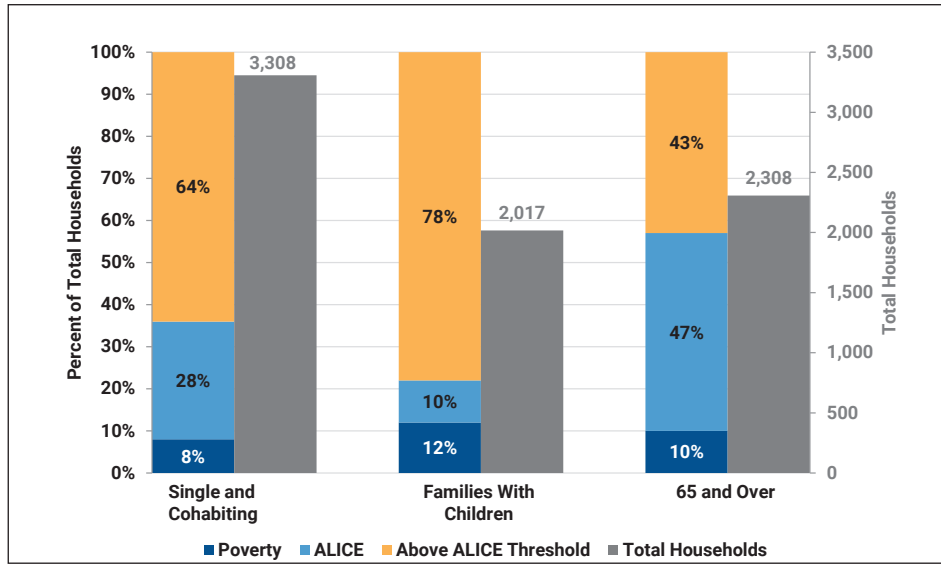

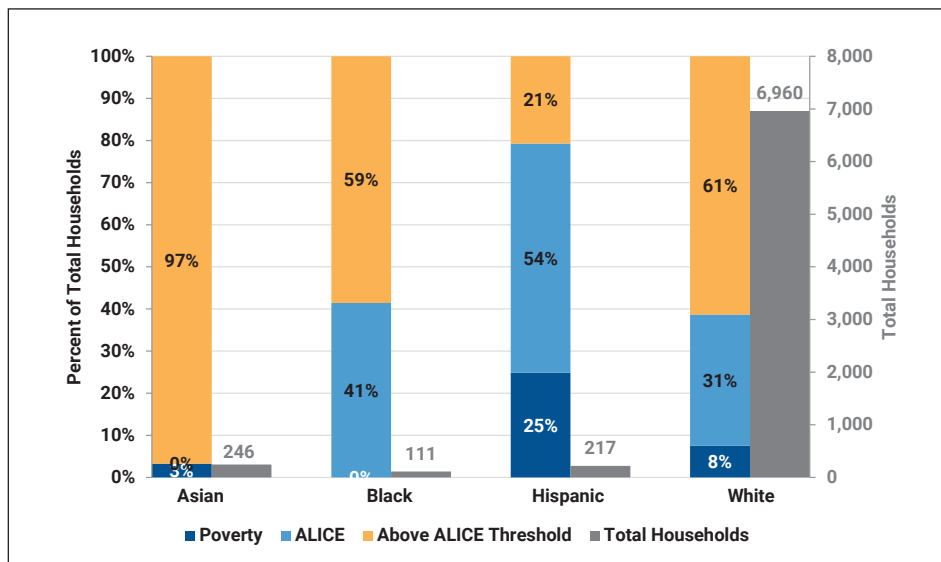

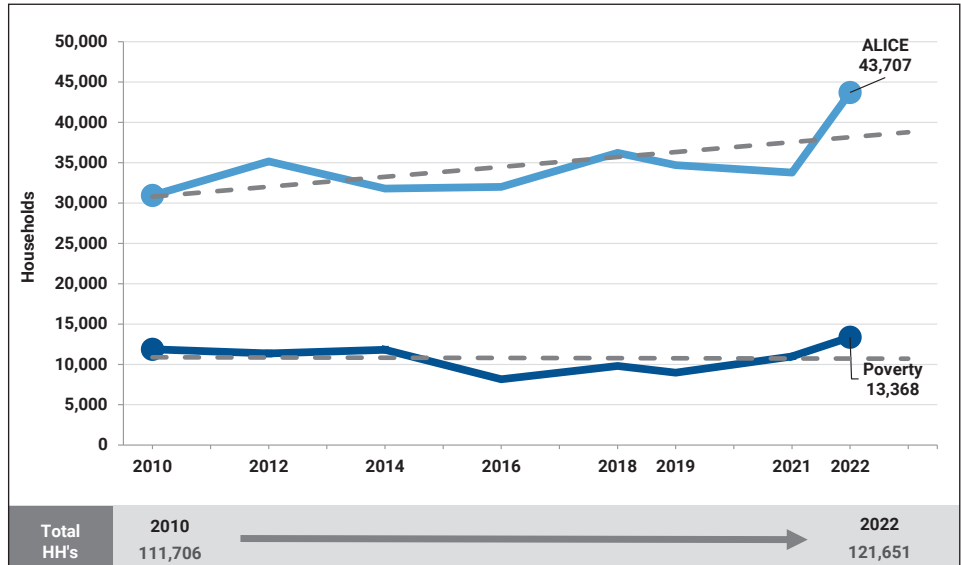

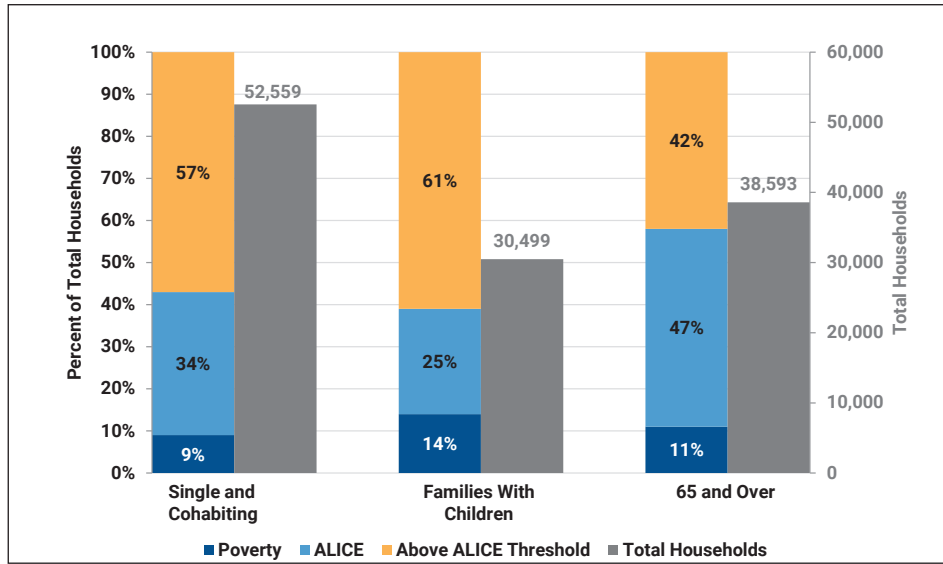

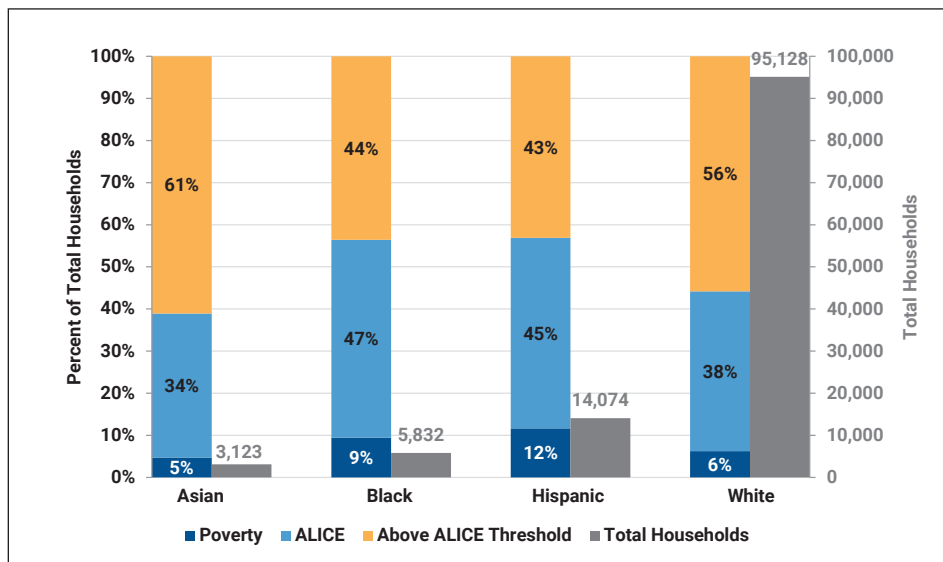

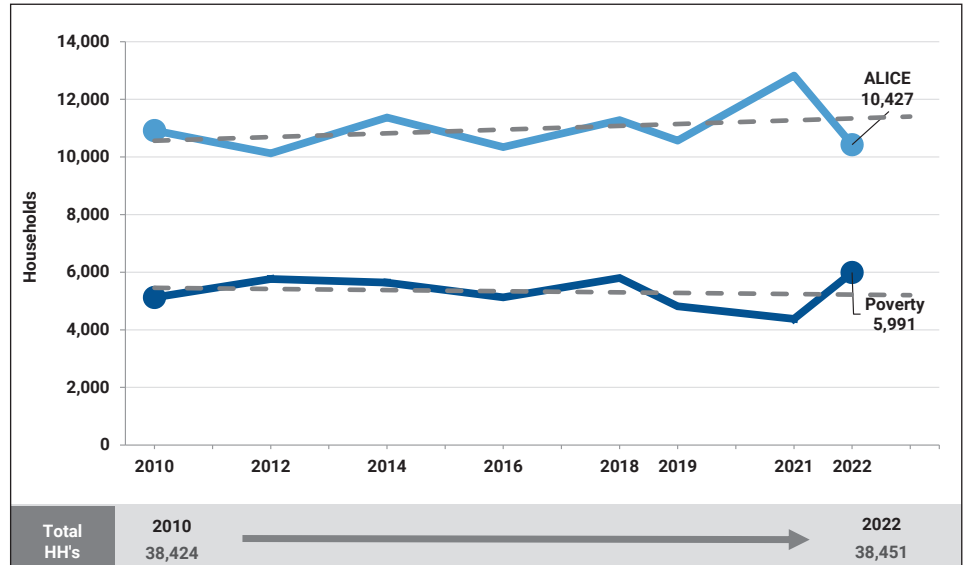

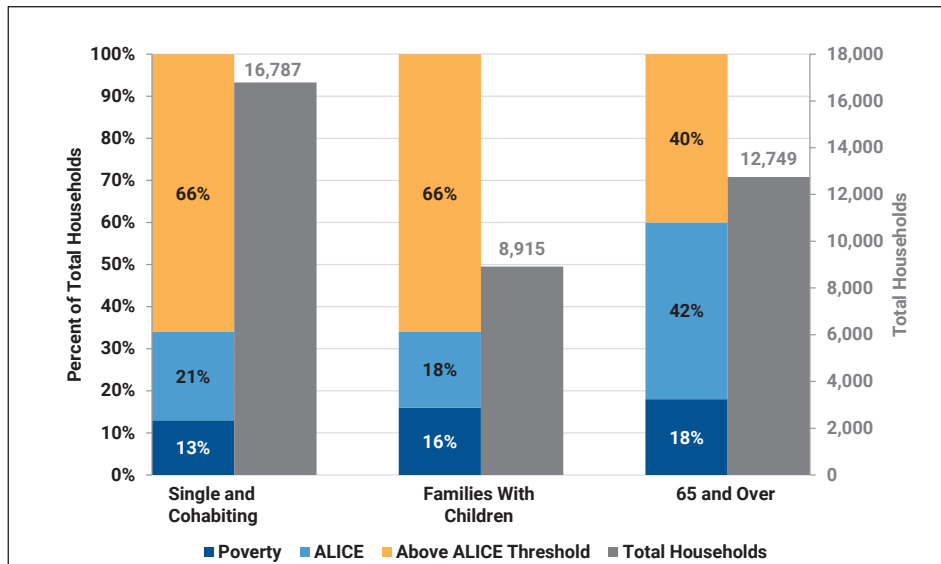

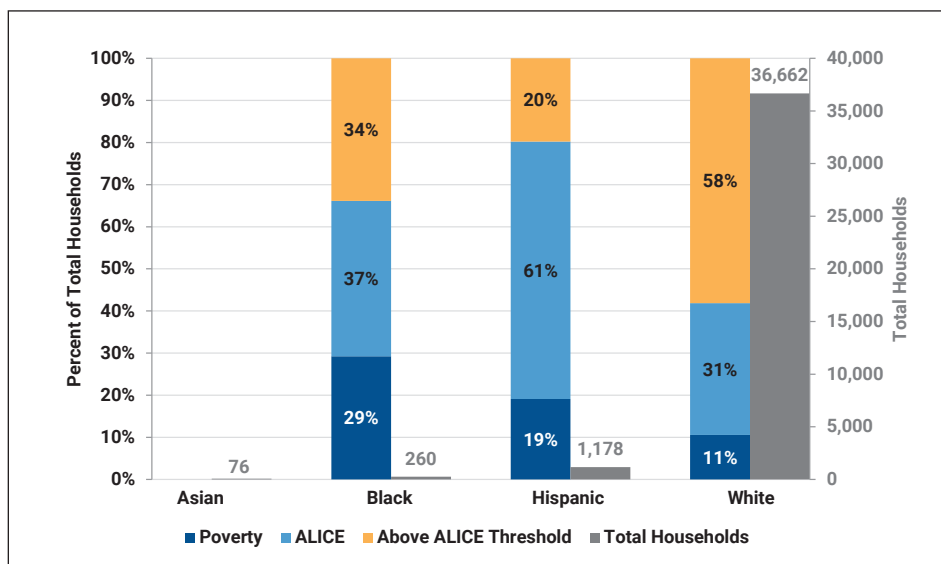

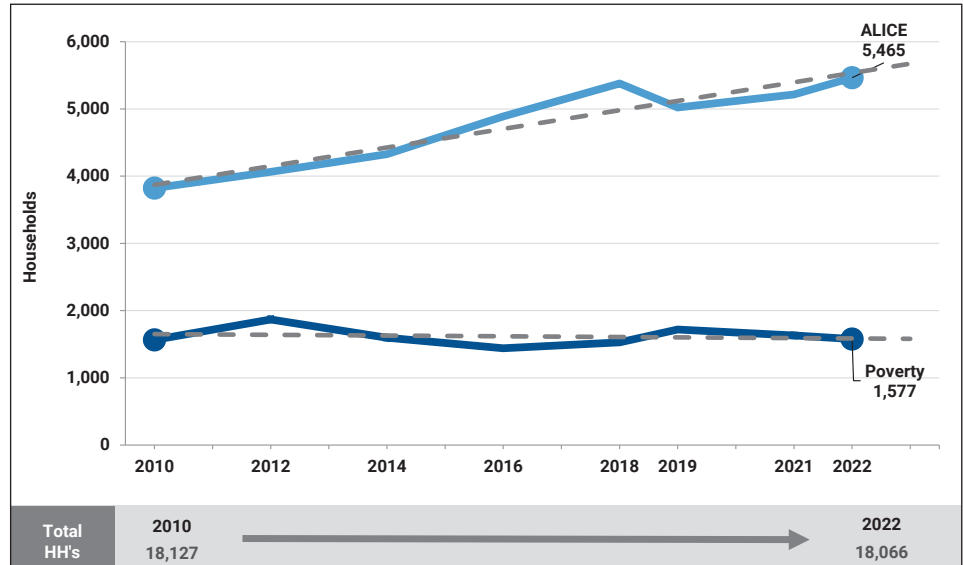

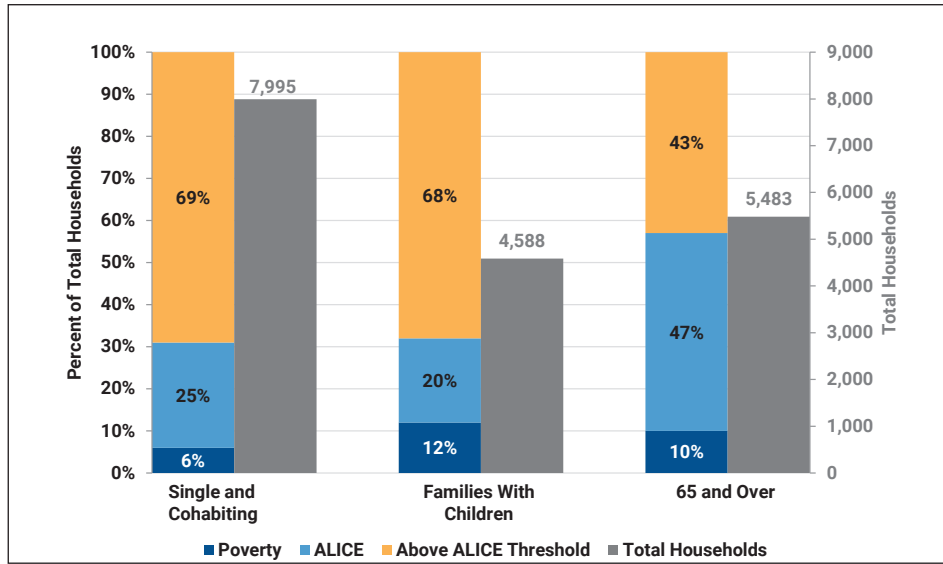

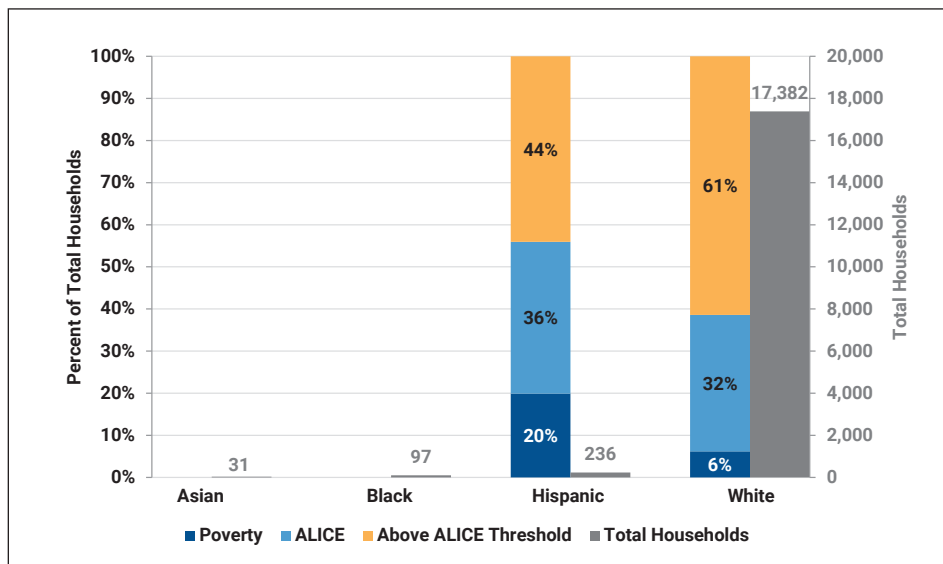

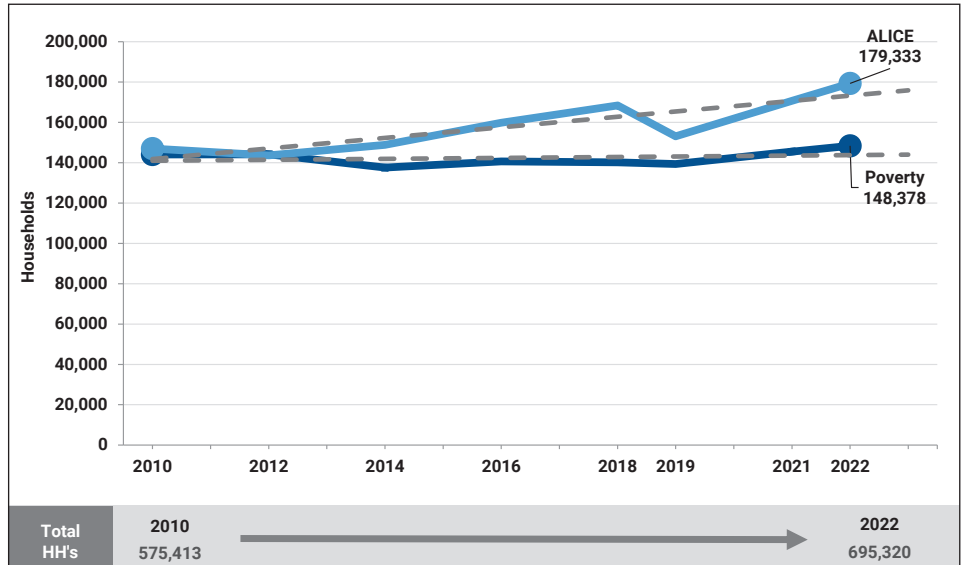

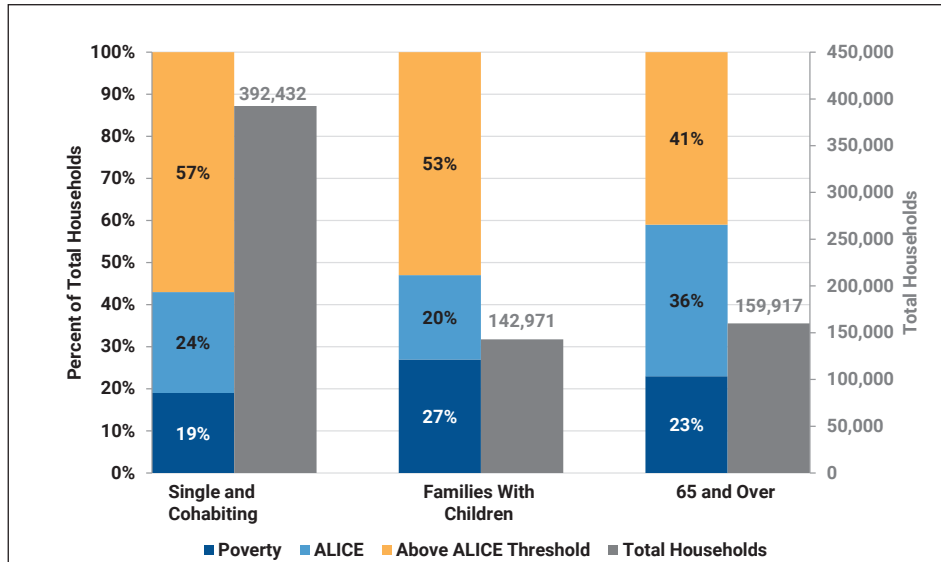

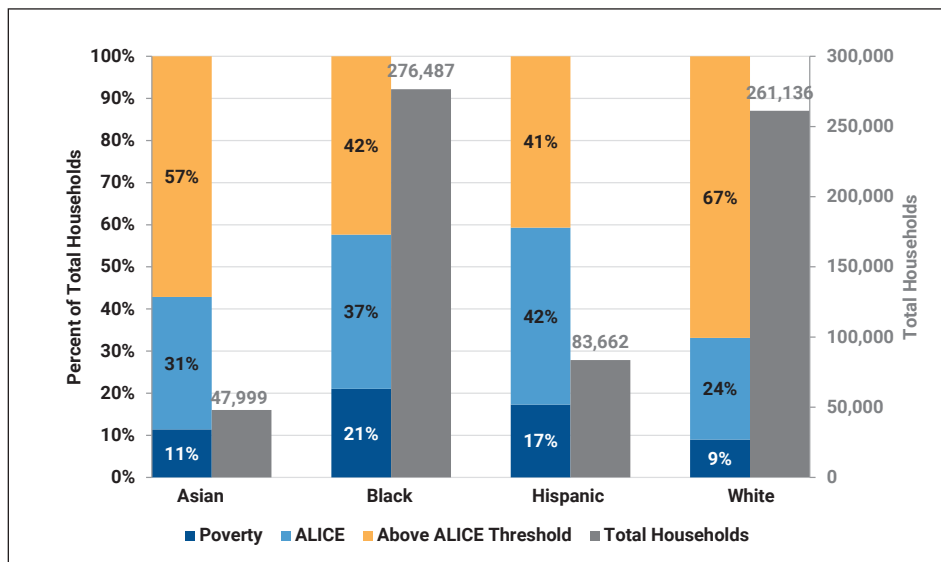

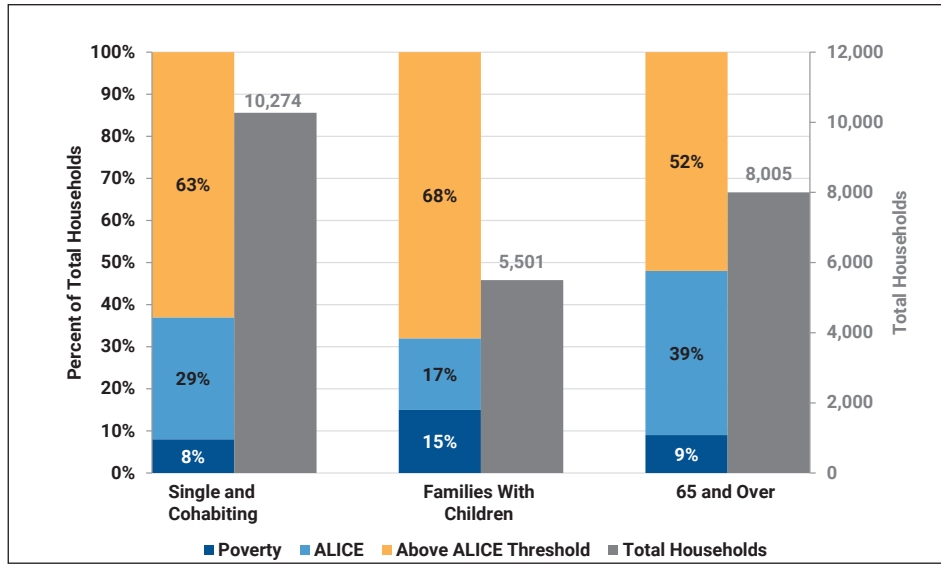

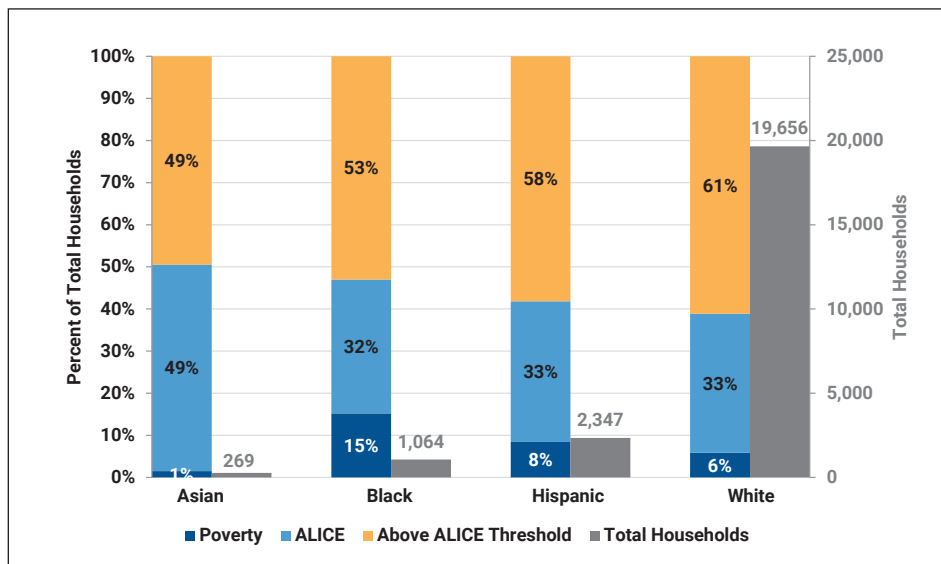

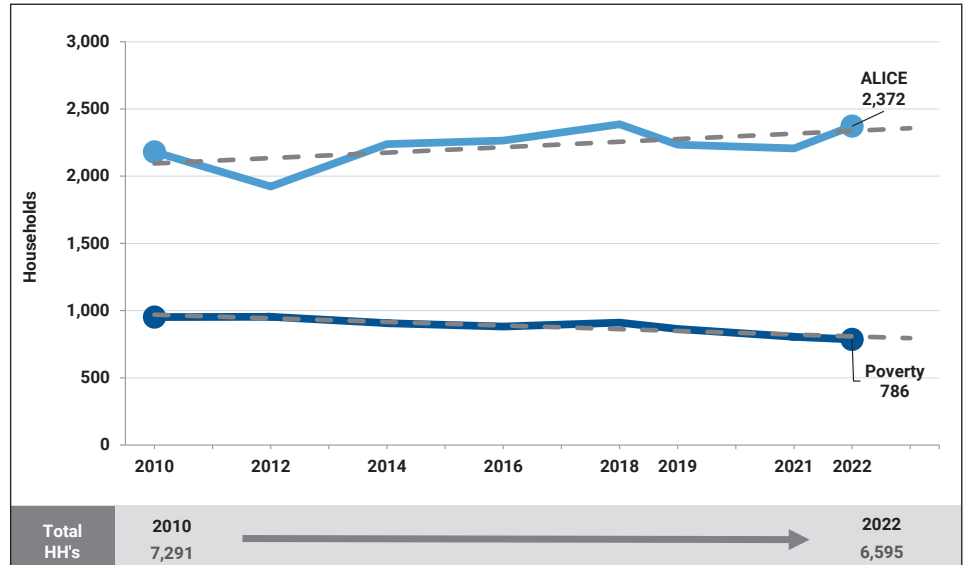

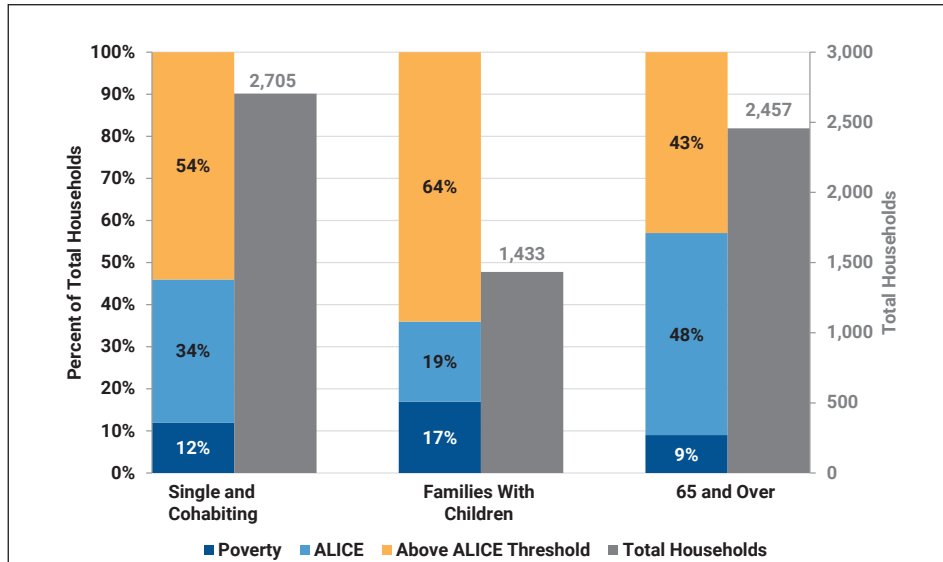

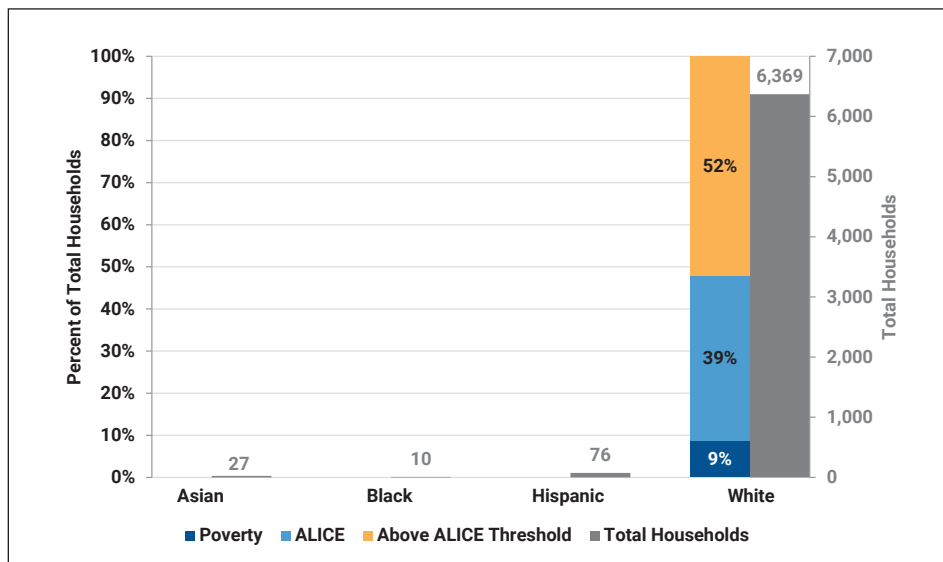

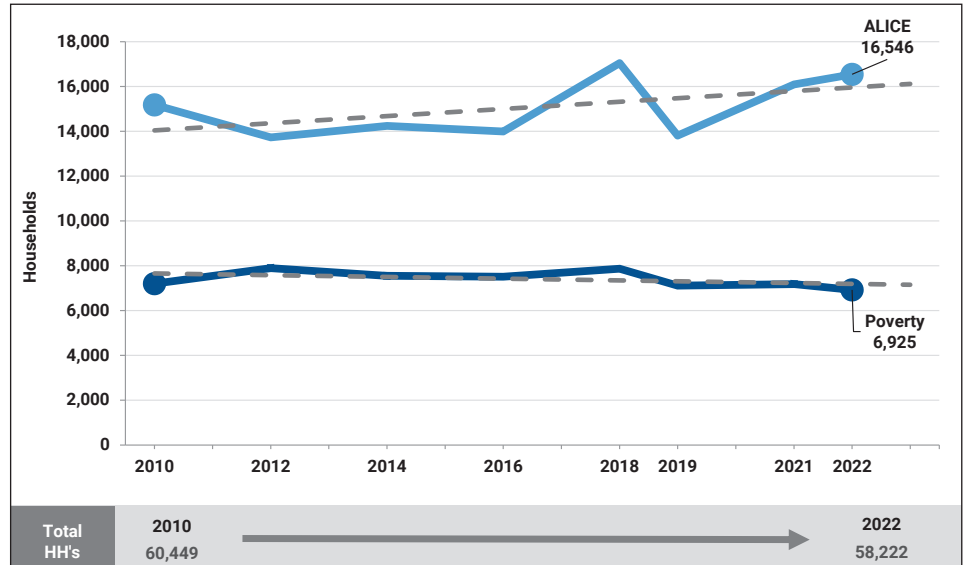

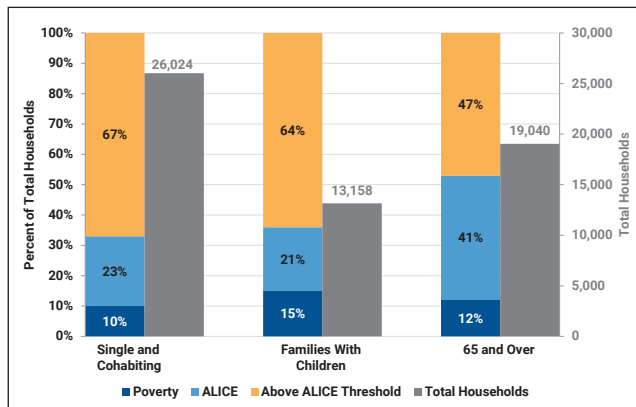

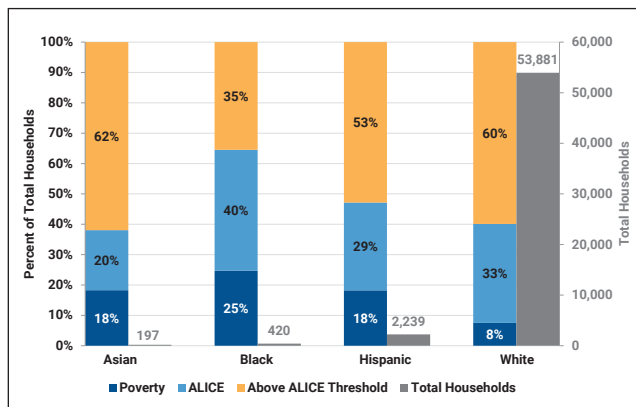

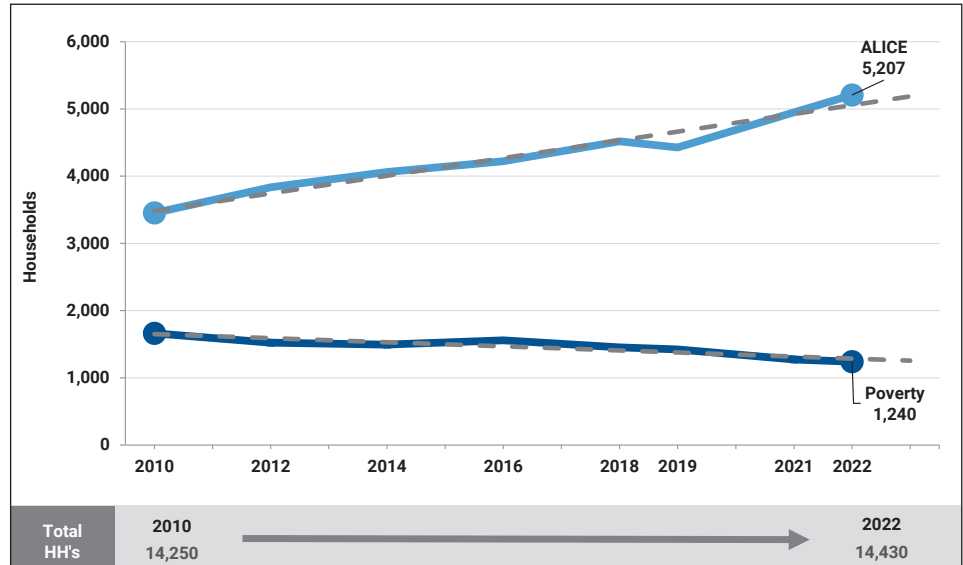

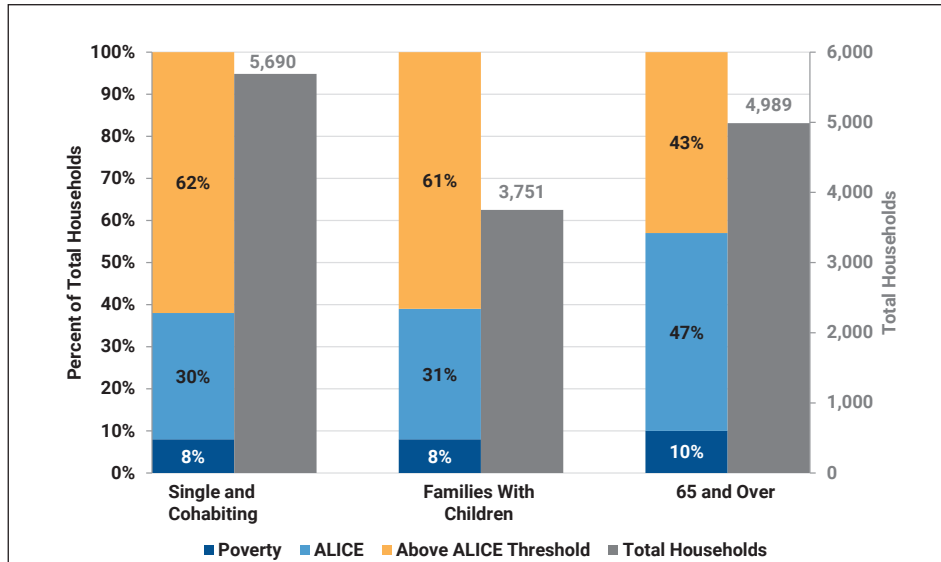

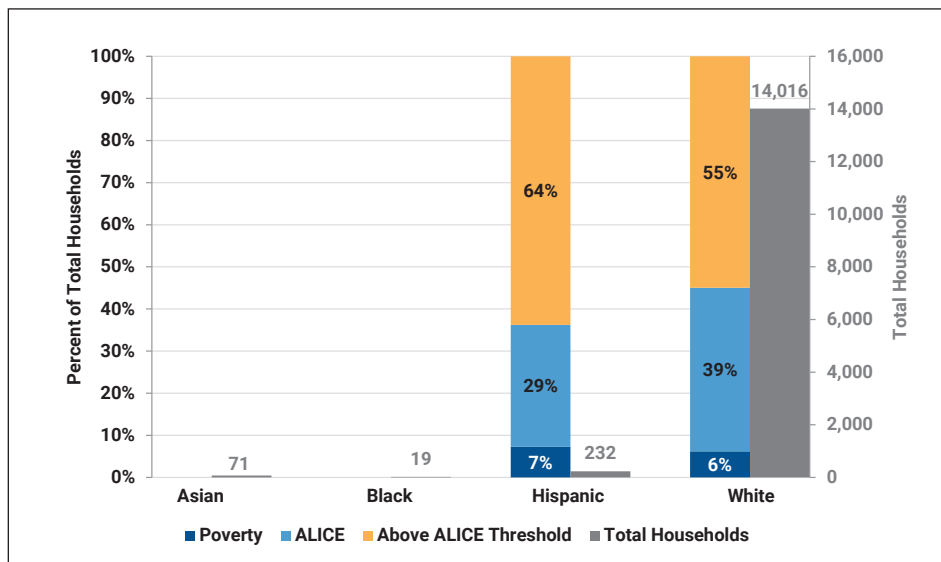

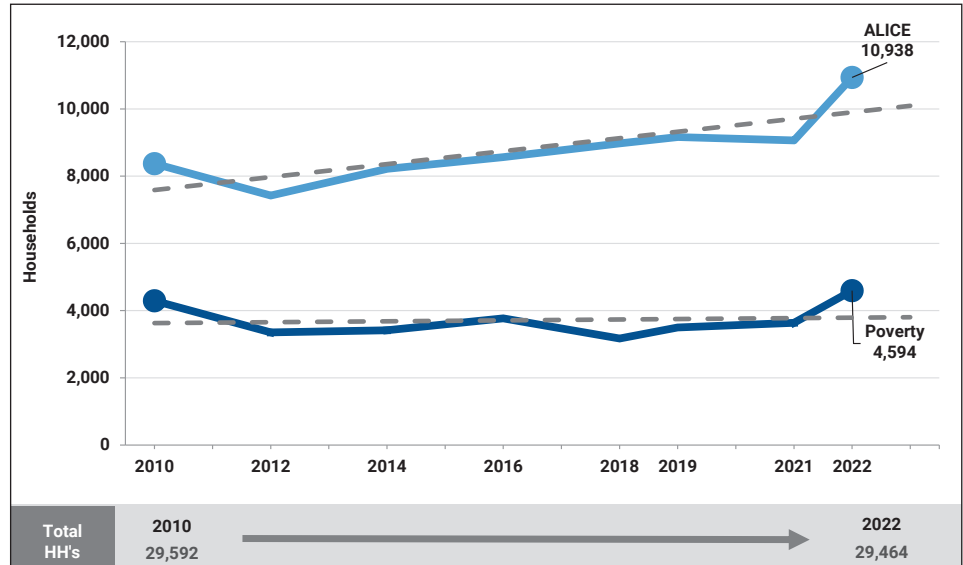

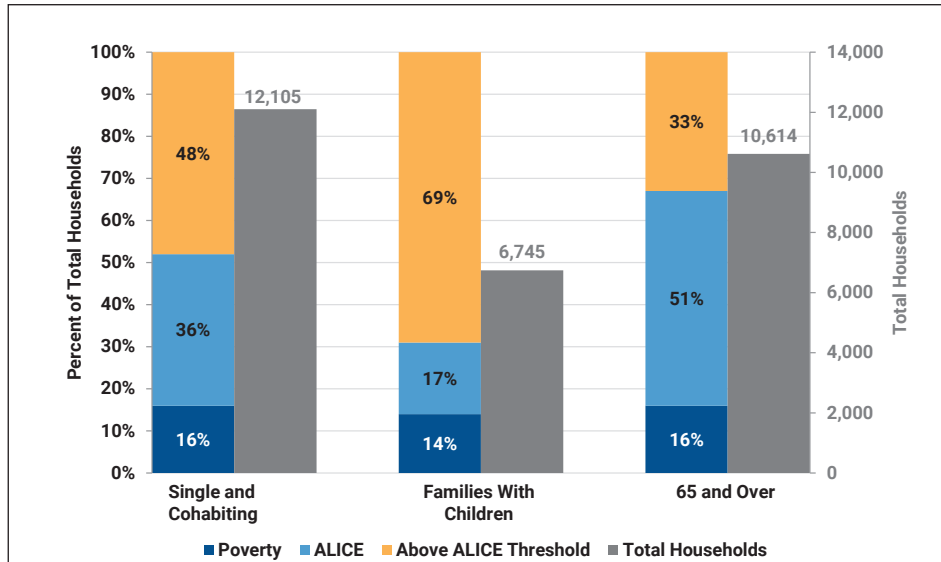

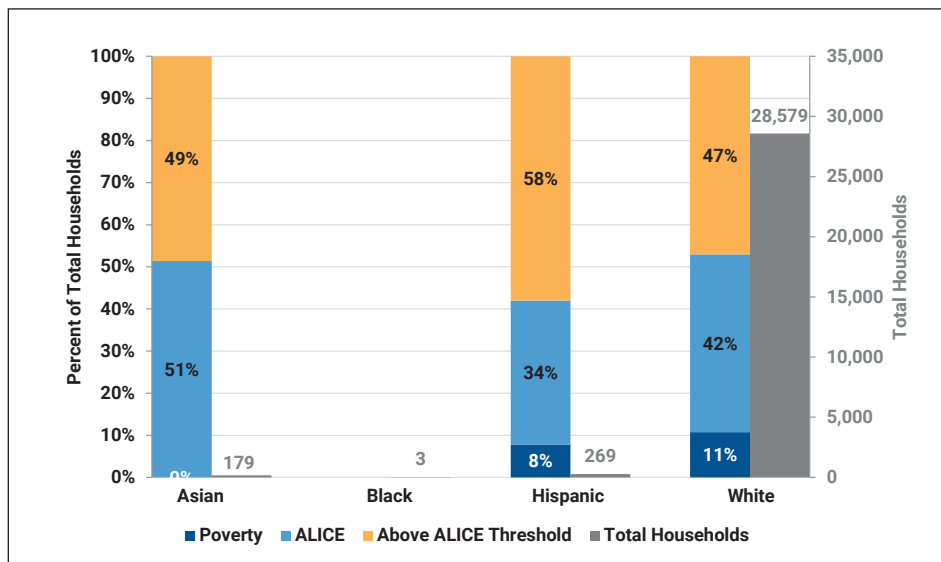

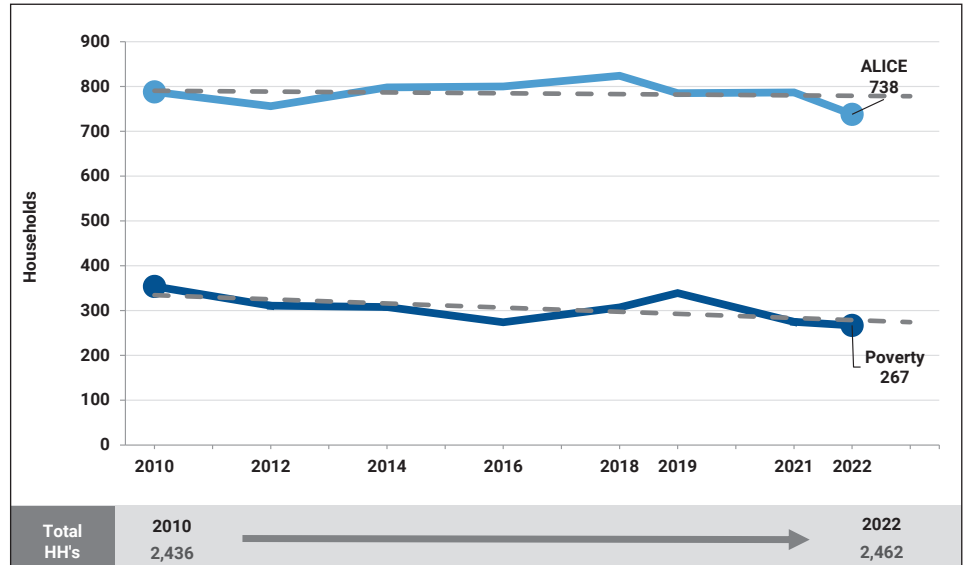

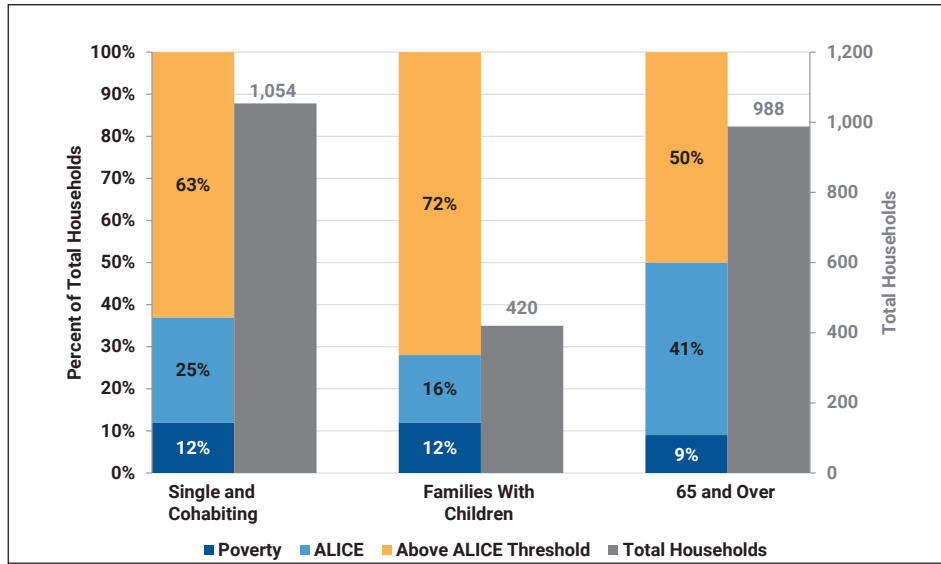

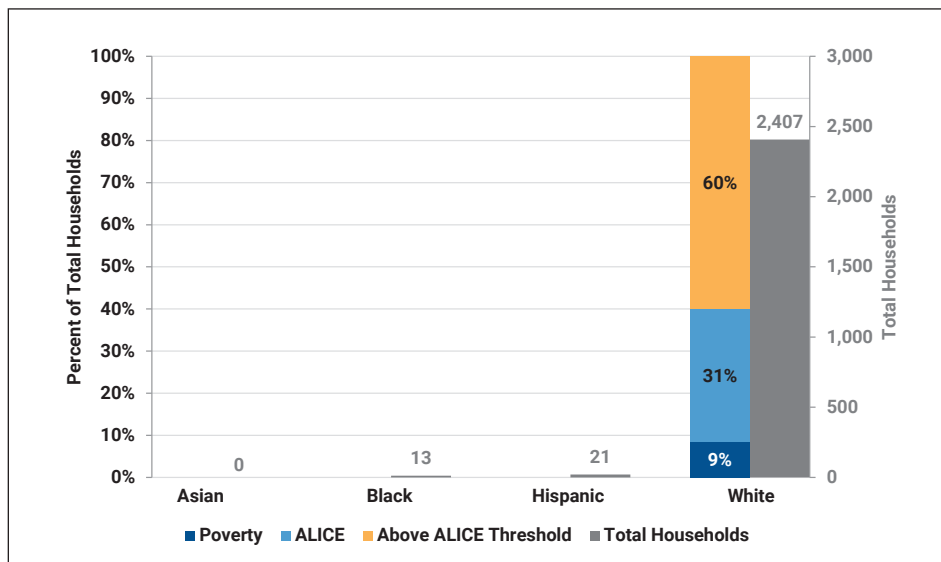

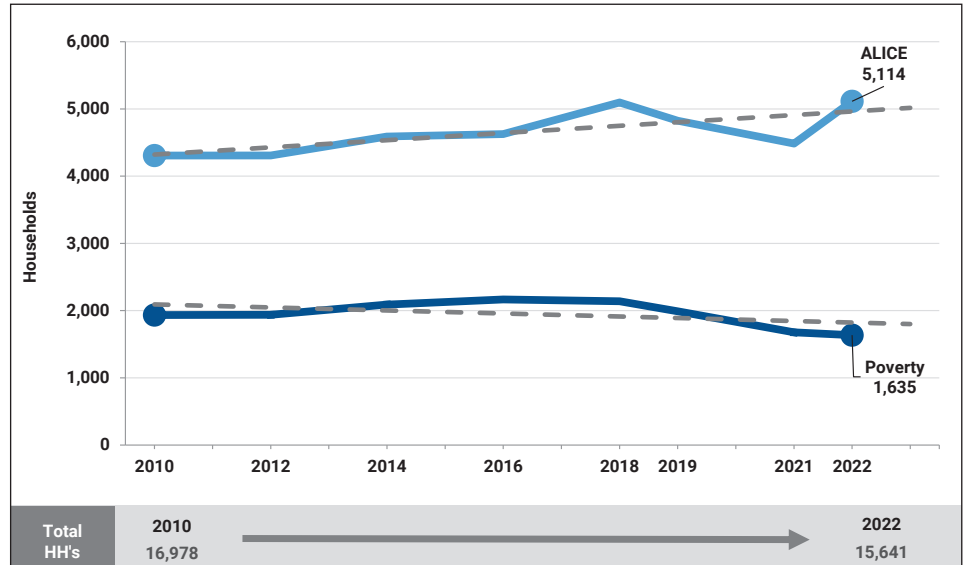

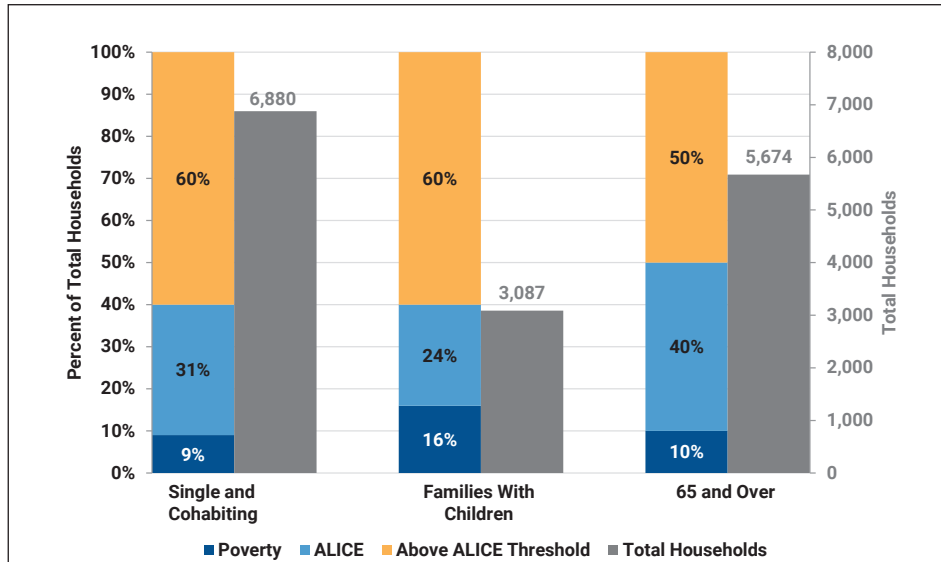

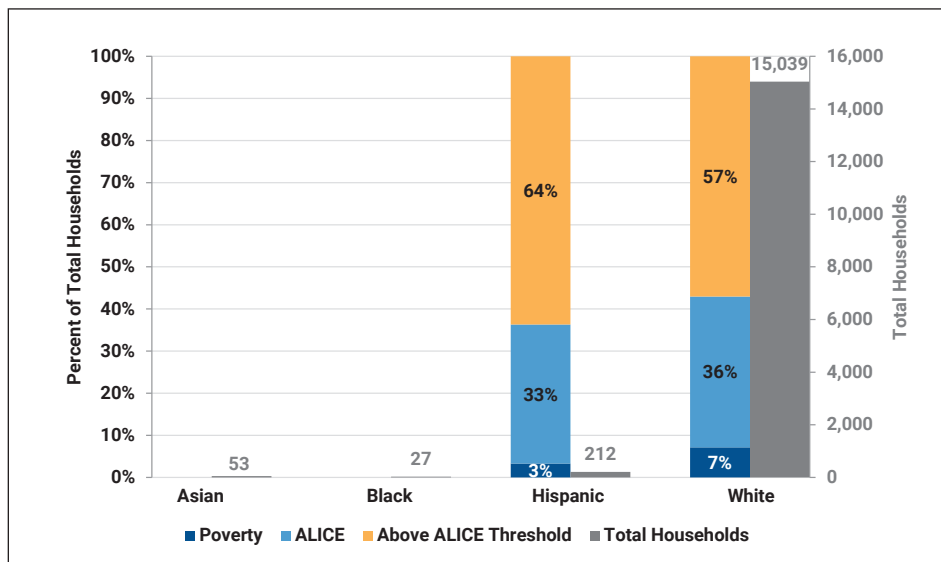

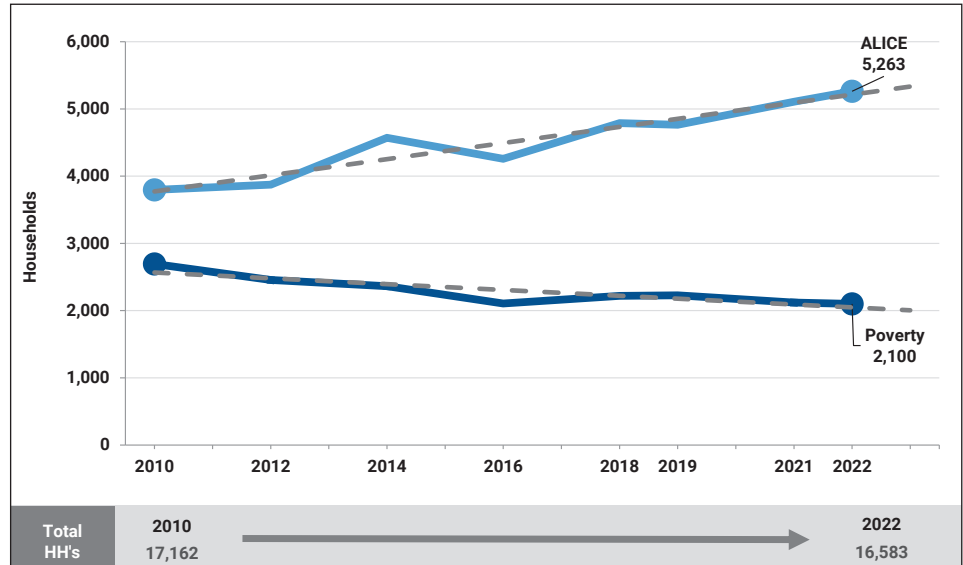

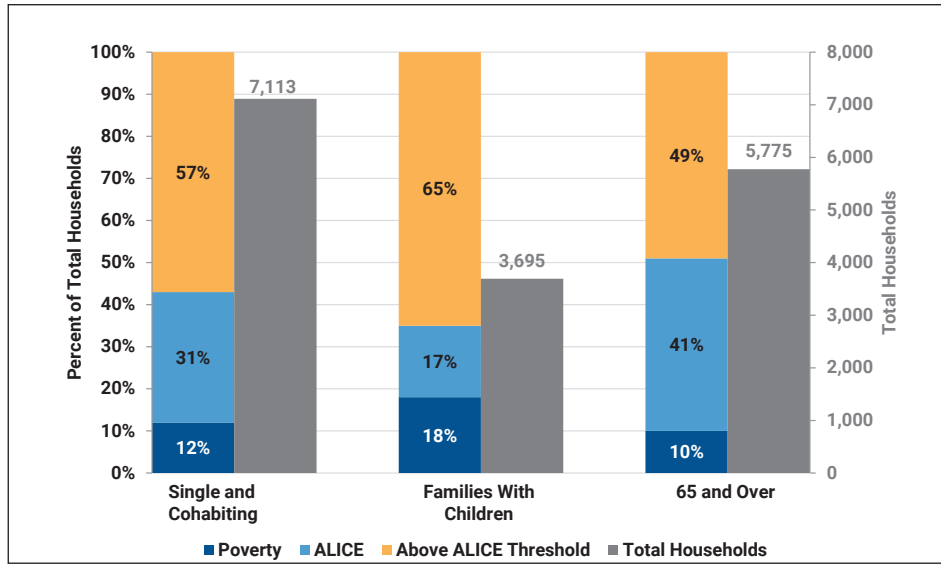

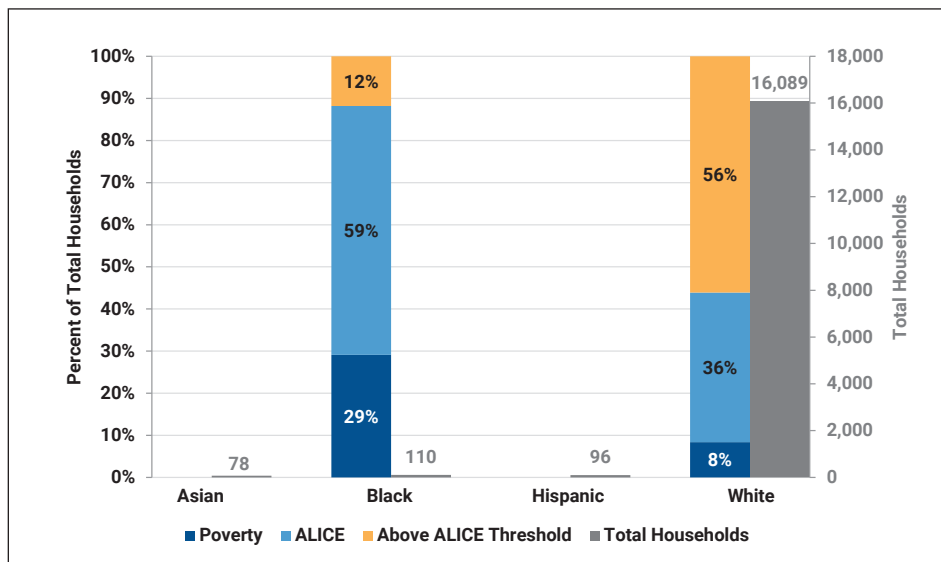

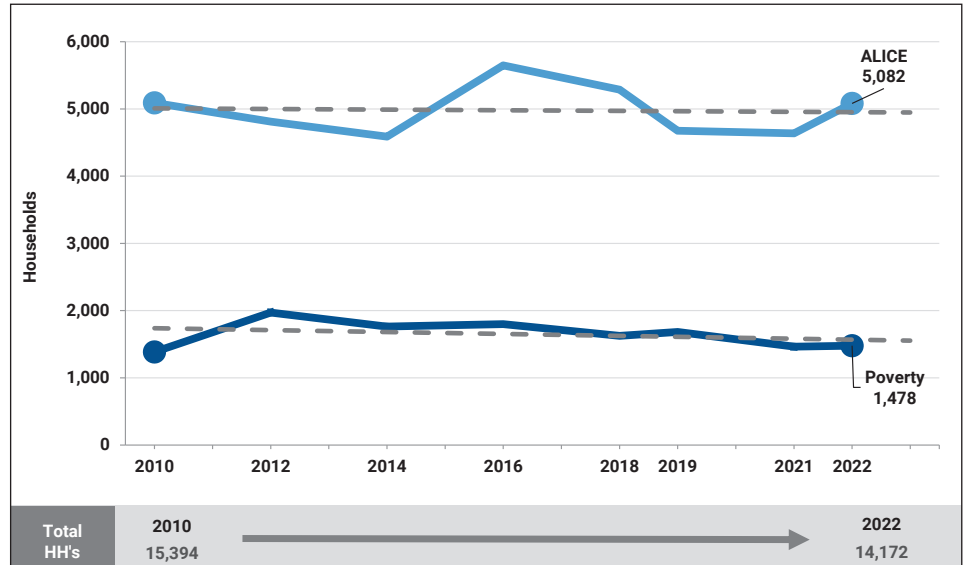

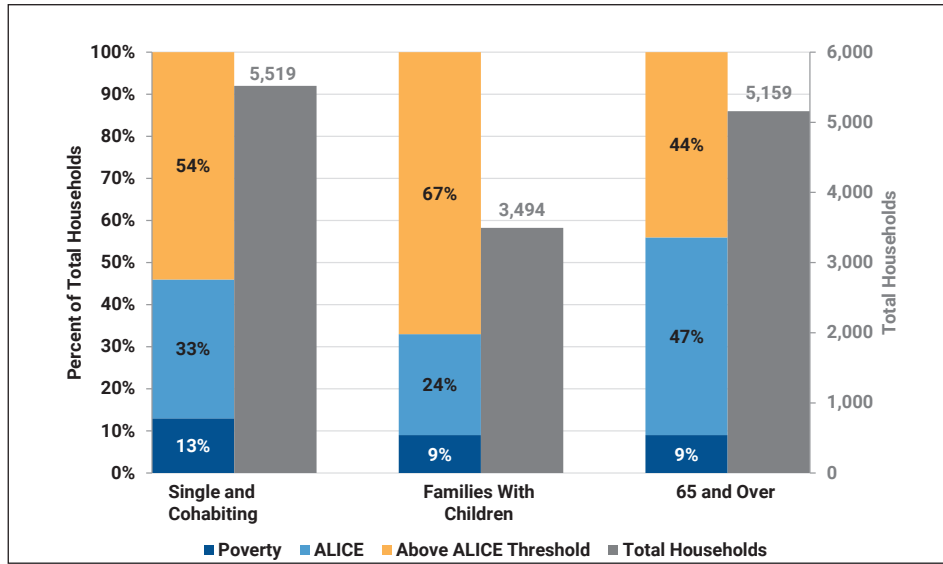

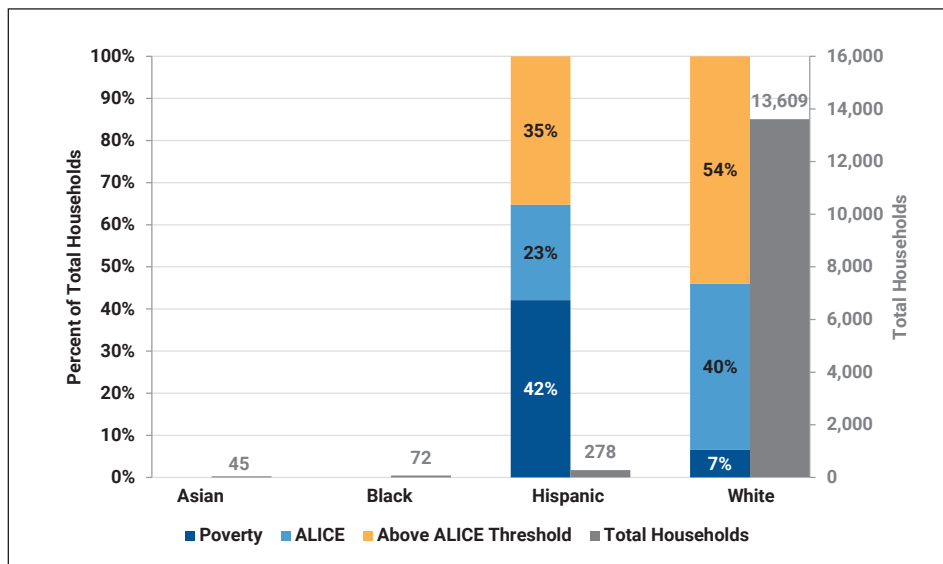

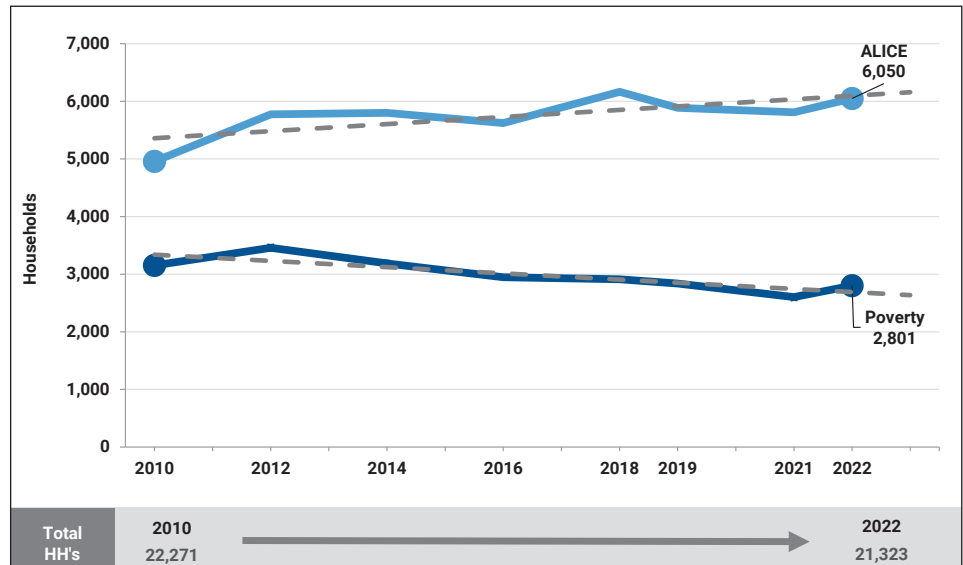

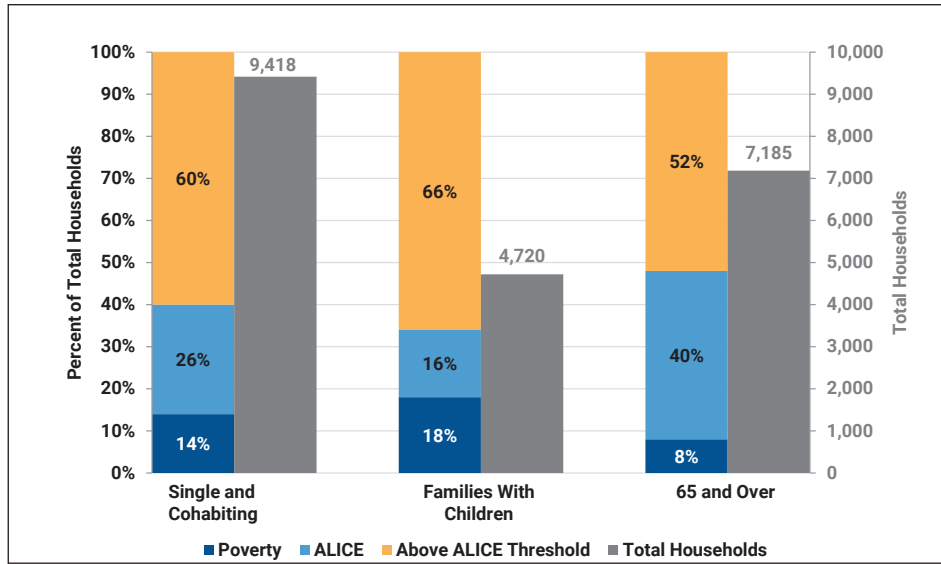

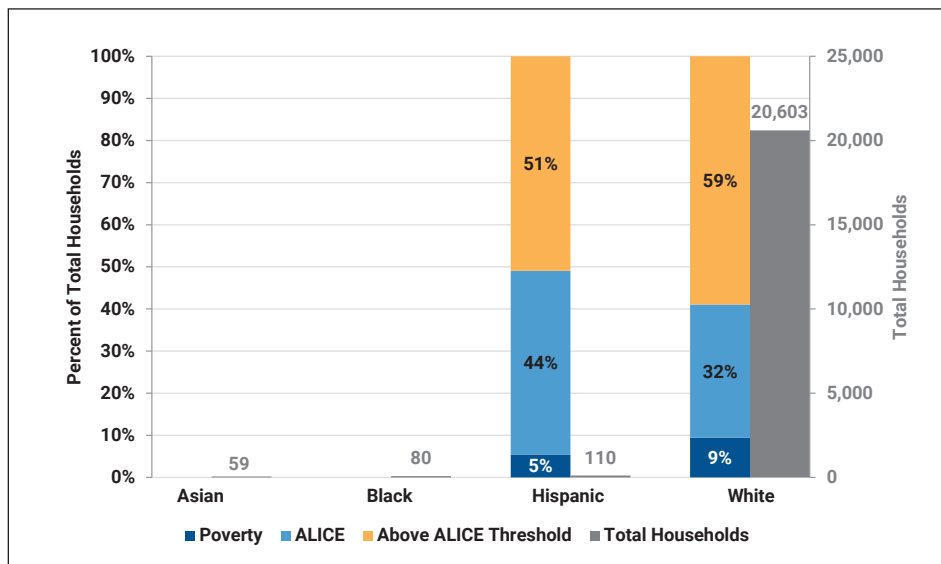

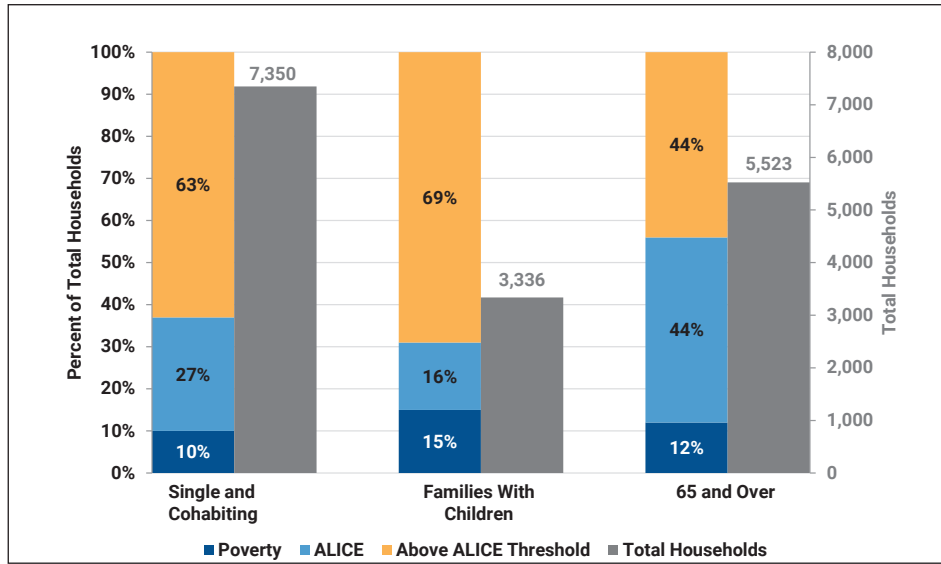

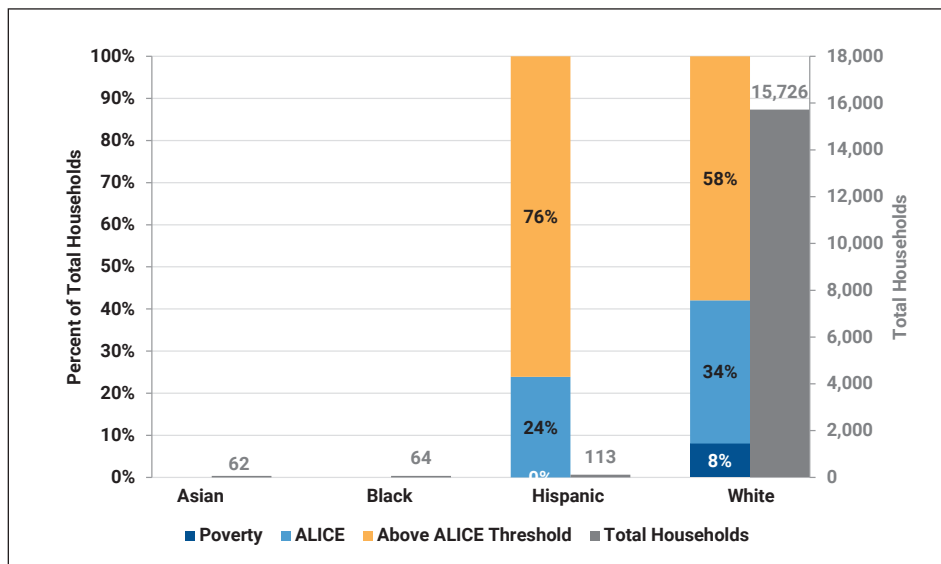

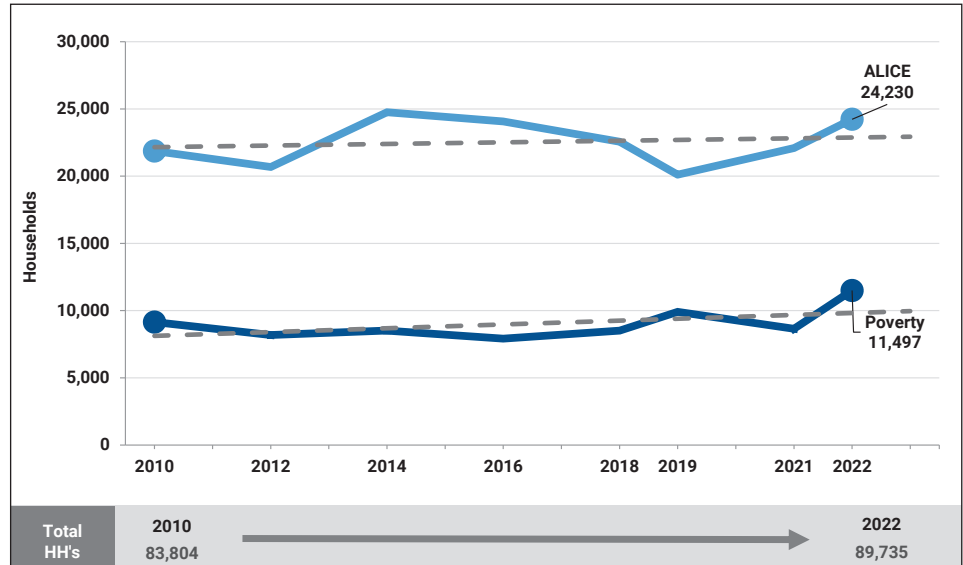

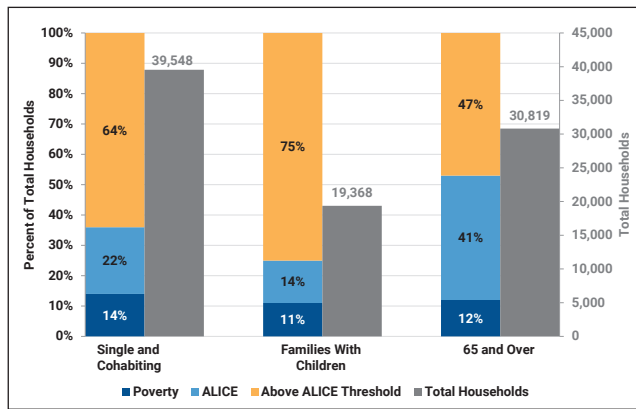

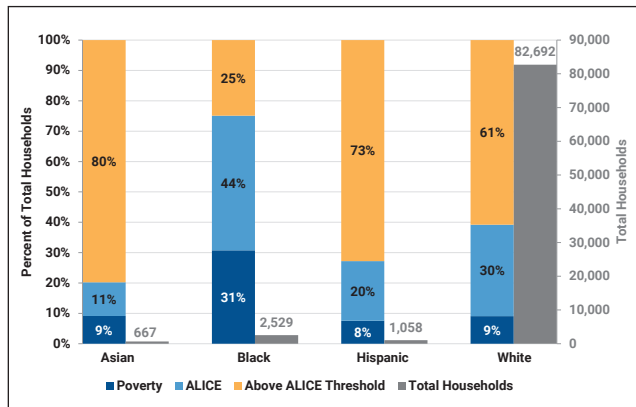

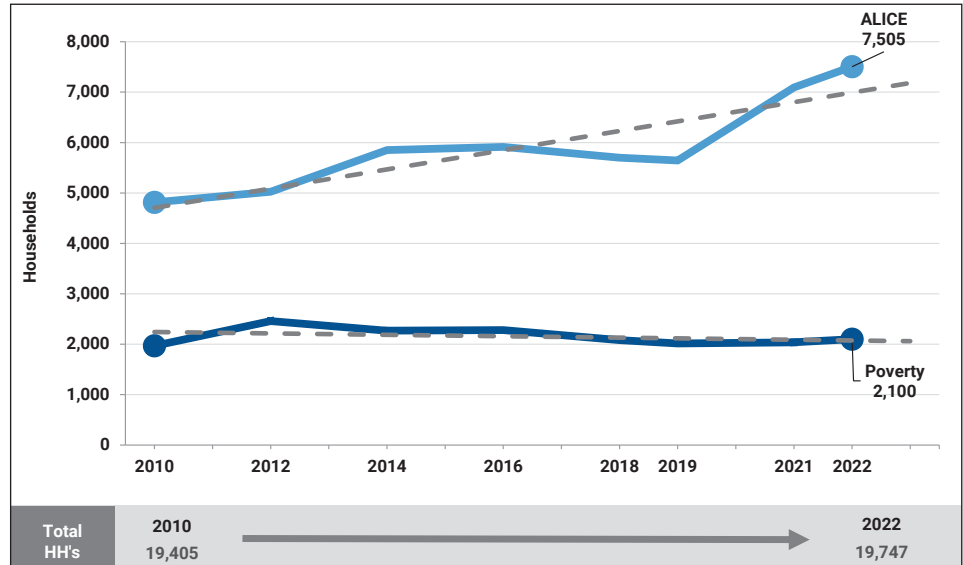

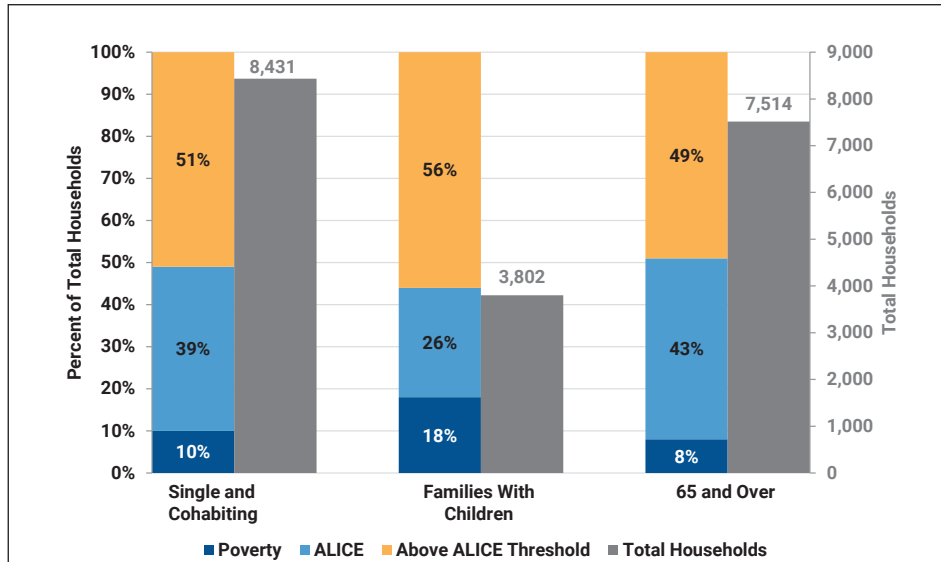

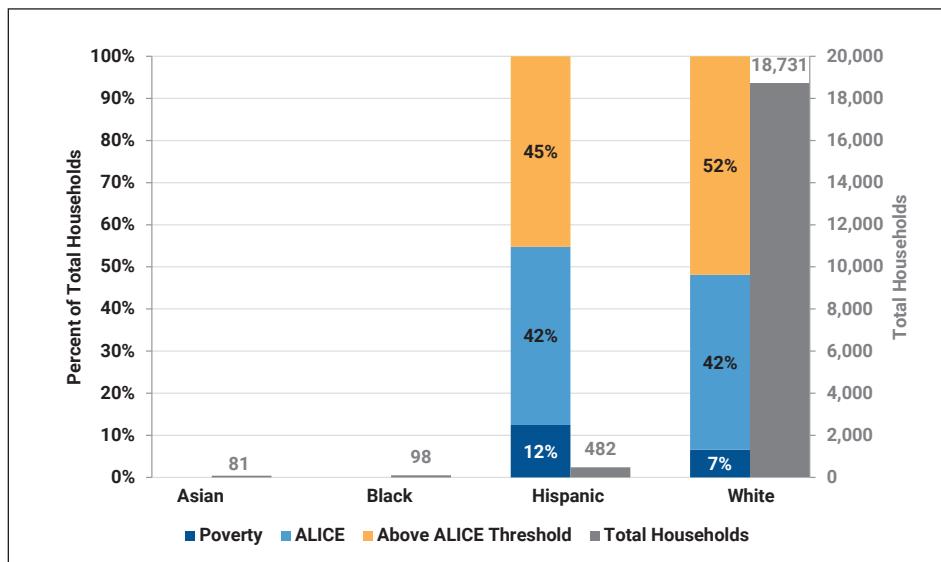

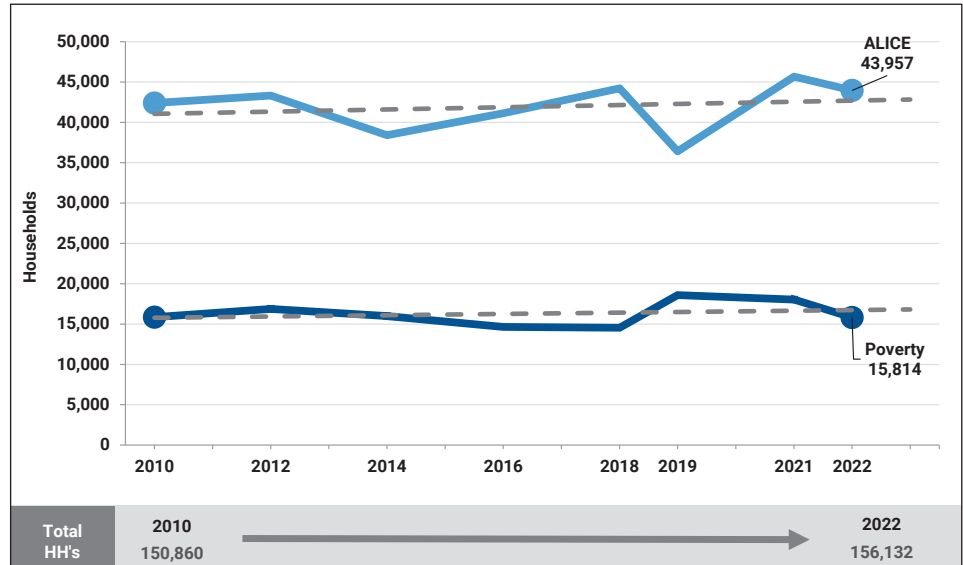

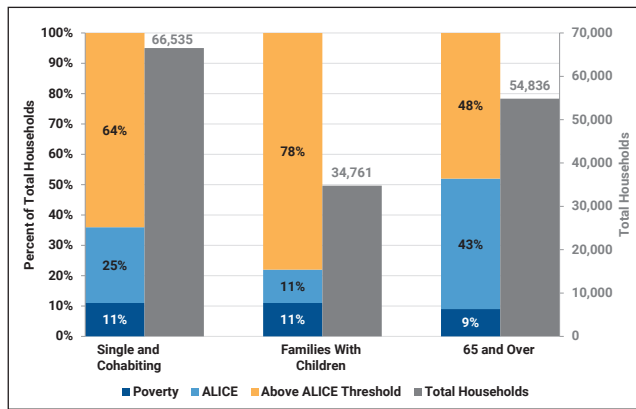

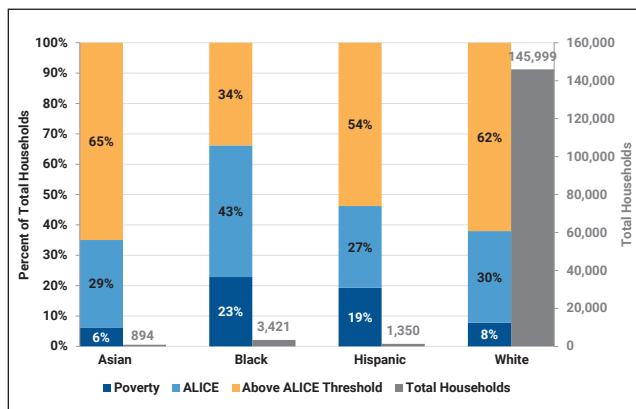

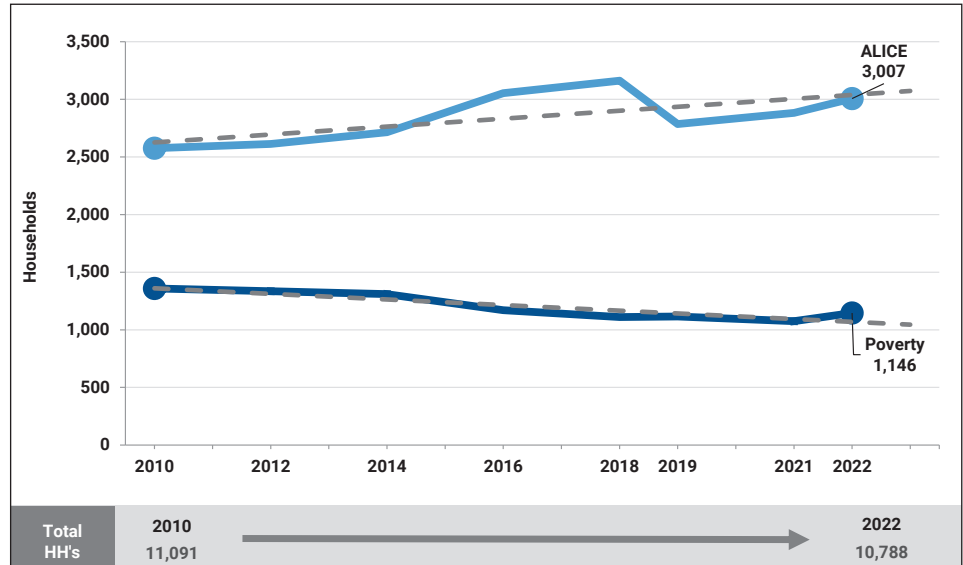

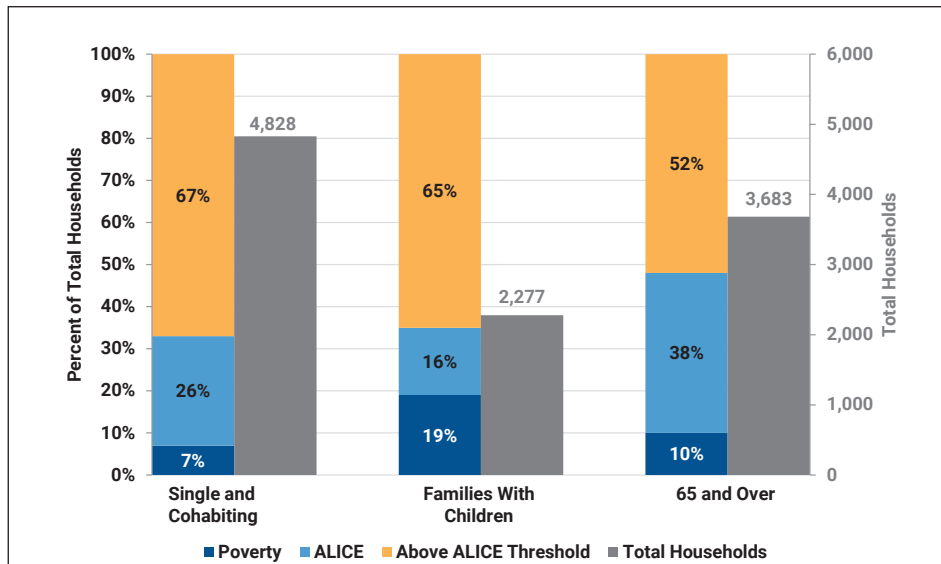
# Financial Hardship is Not Evenly Distributed

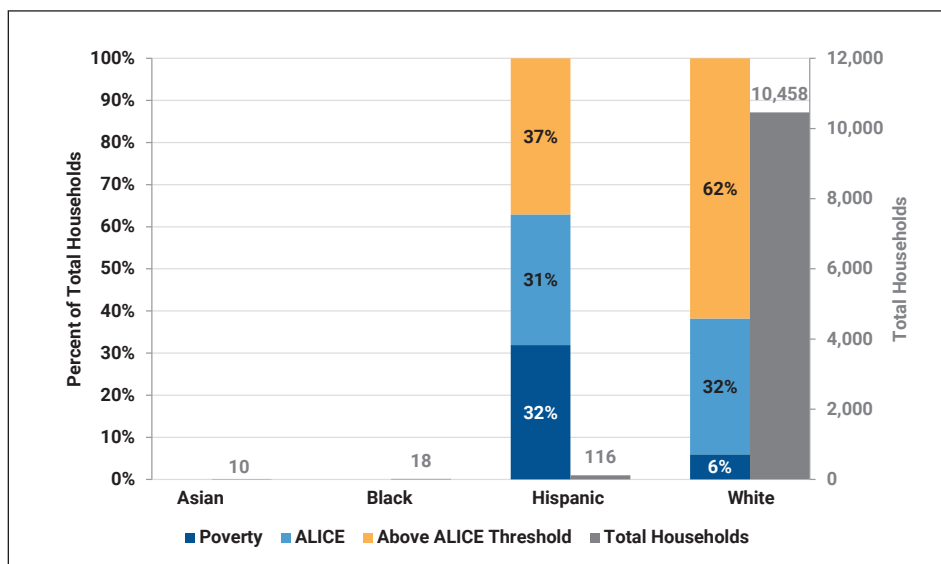

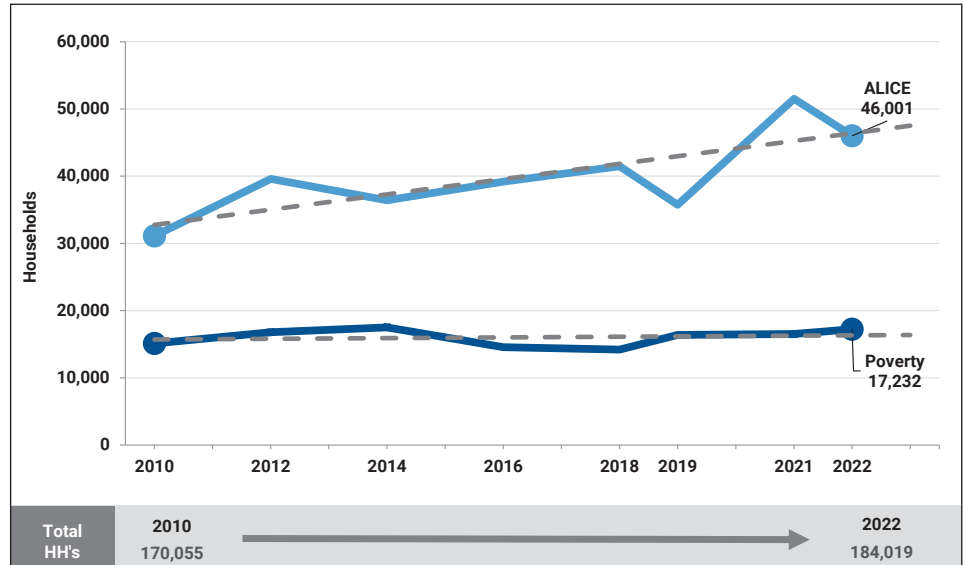

## Financial Hardship Over Time

**ALICE** is an acronym for **A**sset **L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mloyed – households that earn more than the Federal Poverty Level, but less than the basic cost of living for the county (the ALICE Threshold). Households below the ALICE Threshold – ALICE households plus those in poverty – can't afford the essentials.

Households move below or above the ALICE Threshold as economic factors and circumstances change. This was especially true amid the economic crosscurrents of the COVID-19 pandemic, with higher wages, inflation, and additional pandemic assistance. By 2022, 63,233 households (34%) were below the ALICE Threshold in York County.

## The Cost of Basics Outpaces Wages

The Household Survival Budget reflects the minimum cost to live and work in the current economy and includes housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, technology, and taxes. It does not include savings for emergencies or future goals like college or retirement. The Household Survival Budget is calculated at the county level and by household composition, as costs can vary greatly depending on location and household needs.

In 2022, household costs in York County were well above the Federal Poverty Level of \$13,590 for a single adult and \$27,750 for a family of four.

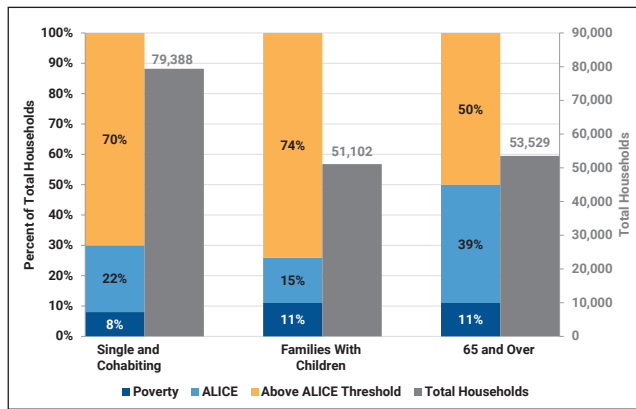

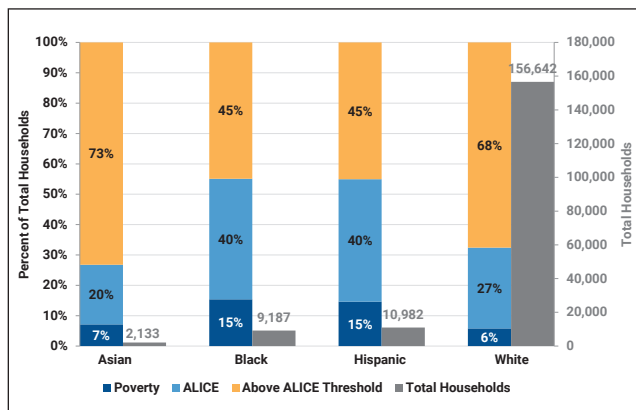
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## Household Financial Status by Household Type, York County, 2022
